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ABRAHAM, Omar

WWII

Omar was born in Lebanon in 1926. He joined the Canadian Light Infantry and served in Canada. He passed away in 2005 and had been a member of Branch #90 Fort Garry of The Royal Canadian Legion for fifty-five years.

ADAMS, Leslie

WWII

Leslie was born to Joseph and Harriet Adams in Selkirk, Manitoba on December 21, 1905. He joined the Saskatoon Light Infantry, Winnipeg Rifles, and lost his arm in Ortona, Italy when his machine gun nest was hit by mortar on December 9, 1943. It was hard getting used to his arm prosthesis but there were no obstacles he couldn't overcome and he always set out to do anything other individuals could do. He and his wife, Olive Blanche Adams, had four children, Carol, Leslie, Larry and Dennis. Leslie passed away on April 28, 1974 and had been a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Selkirk Branch #42 for twenty-nine years.



AGERBAK, Tage G.

wwii

Tage was born in Denmark in 1915 and immigrated to Canada with his family in December 1927. He married and had a son. He joined the Winnipeg Grenadiers, Royal Canadian Infantry Corps, with his two brothers, Buster and Ken. After serving guard duty in Jamaica and Bermuda, the Grenadiers were shipped to Hong Kong in the fall of 1941 and were involved in heavy fighting when the Japanese invaded on December 7, 1941. He was severely injured on December 20, 1941 in an explosion in his pill box and he, along with several other badly injured men, was left behind during the retreat. They were never seen again. Agerbak Lake in Northern Manitoba is named after him.

AGNEW, Bruce W.

WWII

Bruce was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1924 and joined The Royal Canadian Air Force as an airframe mechanic. He served in Canada, Alaska, Britain and Northwest Europe. Before D-Day, Bruce went to Ayr, Scotland to qualify on Hawker Typhoons and after D-Day, he went to France where he was injured. He was later released from the RCAF Burn Ward and came home in 1945. In 1946, Bruce served on P51 Mustangs in Montreal and in Rivers, Manitoba. He had been a forty-year member of the Fort Garry Branch #90 of The Royal Canadian Legion when he passed away in 2006.





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AGNEW, Wes G.

WWII

Wes was born in Hartney, Manitoba in 1921 and joined the Air Force as a flight instructor, serving in Canada. He passed away in 2000 and was a Life Member of the Hartney Branch #26 of The Royal Canadian Legion. No additional information is available.

AHERNE, Edward P.

WWII

Edward was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1918 and joined the 48 Highlanders, Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps # 5 General, serving in Canada, the United Kingdom, Italy and Northwest Europe. He passed away in 1993 and had been a member of the Fort Garry Branch #90 of The Royal Canadian Legion for thirty-one years.



ALCOCK, Arthur F.

WWII

Arthur was born in Souris, Manitoba on October 2, 1919 and enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force on May 9, 1941 as a wireless air gunner. He received his training at MacDonald and Winnipeg and was sent to Vancouver where he was engaged in guard duty before going overseas. Mr. and Mrs. Frank Alcock were notified that their son had been killed in active service on June 17, 1942. Arthur is buried at the Evesham Cemetery, Worcestershire England.

ALLAN, Ronald H.

KOREA & PEACETIME

Allan was born in Barrie, Ontario in 1931 and joined the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps, serving in Canada and Korea. He passed away in 1957 and had been a member of the Fort Garry Branch #90 of The Royal Canadian Legion for fifteen years.



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ALLEN, Wilbert G.

WWII & KOREA & PEACETIME

Wilbert was born in Fraserville, Nova Scotia in 1921 and enlisted in the Army with the Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers in 1943. He served overseas until 1945, in Korea in 1950 and did UN peacekeeping in Egypt from 1963-64. He received many medals in his career before retiring in Winnipeg in 1970 as a Master Warrant Officer. He taught mechanics until he retired in 1985 and moved with his wife to Calgary, Alberta in 1986. Wilbert passed away in 2007.

ANDERSON, Alexander C.

WWII

Alexander was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1923. He joined the Navy and served as a leading seaman torpedo man on the HMCS Courtenay, HMCS Pound Maker, and HMCS Miramichi. He was part of the G8 group convoy sailing from St. John's to Londonderry, Ireland. During his time in the war, he served on the High Seas, England and Canada. Alexander was a legion member for thirty years and a Life Member of The RCL Winnipeg Beach # 61 for fifteen years, serving on the Executive as Treasurer and President till his death on June 2, 2010.



ANGERS, Eldon

WWII

Eldon was born in Miami, Manitoba in 1924 and in 1943, joined the Royal Signal Corps in Vancouver, BC. He served in England and Continental Europe and was at Juno Beach on D-Day. As a Signalman, he rode high powered motorcycles over difficult terrain and fought in the battle of Caen. Wounded in action on July 18, 1944, he was medically discharged and received his Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp in Winnipeg on August 24, 1945. He married Velma Martindale and they lived in Morden, Miami, Winnipeg, Flin Flon, Lynn Lake, the Pas and Brandon where Eldon was a member of the RCL Brandon Branch #3 for fourteen years until he died in 1974.

ANGUS, James I.

WWII

Angus was born in Silver Creek, Manitoba in 1913 and enlisted in Winnipeg in April 1940 with the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders. He was discharged there in September 1945 after having served in Canada, England and Northwest Europe. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the 1939-1945 War Medal. Angus passed away in 1991.



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ARDAGH (nee HUNT), Alice

WWII

Alice was born in Dropmore, Manitoba in 1923. She joined the Canadian Women's Army Corps, # 110 Depot Company and served in Canada. No additional information is available.

ARDAGH, William J.

WWII

William was born in Wawanesa, Manitoba in 1914. He joined the 3rd Division Royal Canadian Artillery Light Anti-Aircraft Division as a gunner and served in England, France, Belgium, Germany and Holland. He passed away in 2001 and was a Life Member of the Hartney Branch #26 of The Royal Canadian Legion.



ARSENAULT, Albert

wwii

Albert was born in Bloomfield, Prince Edward Island on January 8, 1893. After the turn of the century, he migrated west to Manitoba where he lived most of his life in the Lac du Bonnet area. During the War of 1914-18, he enlisted as a Private into the Royal Winnipeg Rifles and the Canadian Army Medical Corps. After basic training, he was posted to England where he met Mary Olive Ford, whom he later married at the Magdalene Church, Sea Road in the County of Sussex, England. Their two sons and daughter joined the Canadian Forces in WWII. Albert died on January 21, 1974 and had been a member of RCL Lac du Bonnet Branch #164.

ARSENAULT, Arthur J.

WWII

Arthur was born in Lac du Bonnet, Manitoba on July 3, 1921 to Albert and Olive Arsenault. He enlisted in the Canadian Army at District Depot # 10 in Winnipeg on January 22, 1943 and was transferred to the 100th Canadian Army Basic Training Centre at Portage la Prairie, then to Camp Borden. Due to the dire need for help at home, he was granted compassionate leave from August 23 to October 3, 1943 and additional leaves took him to full discharge on September 13, 1945. Art received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the 1939-1945 War Medal and was a member of RCL Lac du Bonnet Branch 164 for fourteen years when he passed away in 2005.

ARSENAULT, Hubert J.

WWII

Hubert was born on July 4, 1920 in Lac du Bonnet, Manitoba. After mining in Northern Manitoba, he enlisted as a Private with the Royal Canadian Engineers in Winnipeg in 1942 and trained in Chilliwack, BC. His unit was later stationed in Blaenavon, Wales to look for new sources of coal for the war effort. On January 6, 1943, Hubert transferred to the Royal Canadian Regiment and went to the Adriatic Front and within a year was a prisoner of war. Released in 1945, he recuperated in England, was discharged in Canada in October of that year and was awarded three medals, two stars and a bar for service. Hubert was with RCL Nutana Branch #362 and passed away on September 2, 1995.

ARSENAULT (nee FOUNTAIN), Marie

WWII

Marie was born in Lac du Bonnet, Manitoba on September 16, 1922. She enlisted in the Women's Army Corps in September 1942 and was posted to Vermillion, Alberta for basic training, later transferring to Red Deer, Alberta for driver training. From Vancouver, BC, she went on to Camp Borden in June of 1943 where she trained on a variety of vehicles, from two-ton trucks to staff cars. There, Marie was in charge of delivery of rations, hospital provisions, Sergeants' Mess supplies and doing duty on Provo Patrol into neighbouring towns to reclaim errant personnel. She received two medals and was discharged at Long Branch, Ontario on February 14, 1946.



ASHLEY, Jack R.



Jack was born in Durham, Ontario in 1921. He joined the Canadian Infantry and transferred to the 1st Canadian Parachute Battalion, qualifying as a Paratrooper in Canada. He then took paratrooper training in England, qualifying to wear the British Paratrooper Wings before transferring to the joint US/Canada Special Service Force for paratrooper training, again qualifying to wear the US Paratrooper Wings. Jack was severely injured in Montana and was declared unfit for overseas service. He spent the rest of the war training paratroopers at Camp Shilo, MB where he met and married Blossom Nichol from the Canadian Women's Army Corps. Jack had been a member of RCL The Pas Branch #19 for fifty years when he died in 2006.

ASPLUND, Melford

WWII

Melford was born in Fort Frances in 1927 and trained in Canada until his discharge at the end of the war. He passed away in 2002. No additional information is available.





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BAIRD, James W.

WWII

James was born in Boissevain, Manitoba in 1922. He joined the Royal Canadian Artillery, 8th Light Anti-Aircraft, Gun # 4 of B Troop. During the war, the LAA was disbanded and Jim was assigned to Colonel Cormack's Commandos. He survived Falaise Gap and served four and half years in Belgium, France, Holland and Germany. After the war, he remained for a year in Europe with the Occupation Forces. Jim passed away in 2005 and was a Life Member of the Elgin & Souris Branches # 216 & 60 of The Royal Canadian Legion.

BALES, Leonard R.

PEACETIME

Leonard was born in Gladstone, Manitoba in 1953. He joined the Air Force and served in Damascus, Bosnia and twenty-seven other countries. He has been a member of the Beauséjour Branch #132 of The Royal Canadian Legion for four years.



BALES, Ralph L.

wwii

Ralph was born in Westbourne, Manitoba in 1919 and enlisted with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles in June 1940. He trained at Shilo, went to England, landed in Normandy on D-Day, and then fought through Germany. He was discharged in September 1946 and received the 1939-1945 Star, the France and Germany Star, the Defence Medal and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. In 1965, he was hospitalized for emphysema and in June 1974 had a cancer operation on his left eye and face. In 1976, he was admitted to Deer Lodge and remained there until he died on July 14, 1979. Ralph was a member of RCL Gladstone Branch #110 for sixteen years.

BARCLAY, Ronald A.

SPECIAL AREA DUTY

Ronald was born in Souris, Manitoba in 1943. He joined the Navy and served in Canada on HMCS Cornwallis, Gloucester and Naden before being discharged at Esquimalt in July 1962. He has been a member of the Souris Branch #60 of The Royal Canadian Legion for forty-two years.




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BARR, Henry C. (Ray)

WWII

Henry was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1925. He joined the Cameron Highlanders in January 1943 and then transferred to the Royal Canadian Air Force in January 1944, graduating as a Sergeant Air Gunner. In 1945, he was killed in an explosion on his B-24 Liberator while on a practice bombing flight off the coast of British Columbia. Ray is buried in the Veteran's section of the Brookside Cemetery in Winnipeg, Manitoba.

BATY, David I. KOREA

David was born in Selkirk, Manitoba in 1929 and enlisted in the Regular Army in January 1949 at age 19. He served with the 1st Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry and was in Korea from September, 1951 until October 1952. David was wounded in action on May 27, 1952 and was hospitalized in Japan until August, when he returned to his unit. He was discharged from the military in February 1953. David has been a member of Selkirk Branch #42 of The Royal Canadian Legion for fifty-eight years.



BAUCHE, René


WWI

René was born in Redu, Belgium in 1889 and joined the 222nd Battalion, 14 Company MG Corps/1st Motor MG Corps, serving in France and Bexhill. René was a Sergeant Instructor at the Musketry Instructional Course in Bexhill in 1918 and he was wounded that same year. He passed away in 1956.

BEAUSHENE, Russell T.

WWII

Russell was born in Fort Frances, Ontario in 1918 and joined the Royal Canadian Air Force, serving overseas as a mechanic. Russell passed away in 2008. No additional information is available.





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BEDDINGTON, Edward A. (Ted)

WWII

Ted was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba on June 30, 1919 and joined the 18th Reconnaissance Regiment Service Unit of the Royal Canadian Army. Ted passed away on November 5, 1961. No additional information is available.

BELAIR, Edmond

WWII

Edmond was born in Kenora, Ontario in 1923. He joined the Lake Superior Regiment and served in England, Holland and Canada. He had been a member of the Kenora Branch #12 of The Royal Canadian Legion for sixty years when Edmond passed away in 2009.



ALE SON

BENOIT, Armand

WWII

Armand was born in St. Boniface, Manitoba in 1925 and joined the Navy as a Seaman, serving in Canada and on the Atlantic coast. Armand is a member of the Keewatin Branch #13 of The Royal Canadian Legion. No additional information is available.

BERRY, Otto G.

WWII

Otto was born in Myrtle, Manitoba in 1918 and joined the 7th Anti-Tank Regiment at age 22, serving with the Regular Force in Europe. He came home in 1945 but his brother John did not. When in Holland, he met his future wife and brought her to Canada where they got married in 1947. They settled on a farm and raised a family of five children. He loved poker and craps and always carried a book of poetry. Otto passed away in 1989.



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BERTRAND, Albert

WWI

Albert joined the 10th Field Company, 4th Division of the Canadian Engineers, serving in Vimy, Ypres, Courcelette, Passchendaele, Regina Trench, Amiens and Mons. He received the Military Medal with two bars. No additional information is available.

BIRD, Frank G. WWI

Frank was born in Huntington, England in 1894. He joined the Canadian Expeditionary Force in 1914 with the 179th Battalion, Cameron Highlanders of Canada. He served in Belgium and was wounded in Cambrai, France in 1918, returning to Canada in 1919. After the war, he farmed in the Dropmore area for a number of years and he and his wife, Doris, raised twelve children. They moved to Neepawa, then to Newdale and retired in Brandon. He was a member of RCL Wheat City Branch #247 for ten years. Frank died in 1983 at the age of eighty-nine.



BISSETT, Jack M.

wwii


Jack was born in 1920 and joined the No. 78 Air Force Squadron, serving in Germany and England. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal on May 14, 1943 for showing the greatest determination throughout his tour in the course of which he flew in some of the most heavily defended areas in Germany. He was killed in action on March 31, 1944 at age 23 and is buried in the Rheinberg War Cemetery in Germany. Bissett in Manitoba is named after him.

BOHN, Reinhold WWII

Reinhold was born in Greenridge, Manitoba in 1915 and enlisted there with the Royal Canadian Artillery, 44th A/A Battery on December 14, 1942. He was a trained soldier, a gunner on heavy anti-aircraft for 12 months, a member of a predictor crew for 7 months, a driver for 4 months, a combat infantryman for 9 months and was with the regimental police for 3 months. He served with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles and St. John Fusiliers in the UK and in Northwest Europe for six months and was honourably discharged on March 20, 1946 in Winnipeg. He received the France and Germany Star and the War Medal 1939-45. Reinhold died in 1974 and was a member of RCL Roseau Valley Branch #160 for sixteen years.

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BOOTE, Leonard H.

WWI

Leonard was born in La Rivière, Manitoba in 1895. While in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1915, he enlisted as a Private with the 79th Cameron Highlanders of Canada and served in England and France with the 43rd Battalion Canadian Infantry. Leonard was killed in action in France on August 16, 1918 and is buried at the Royal New British Cemetery.

BOYLE, Robert H.

WWII & SPECIAL AREA DUTY

Robert was born in Canada in 1920 and joined the Royal Canadian Air Force, 424 Squadron, Flight Officer and 405 Squadron, Flight Engineer. He served in Canada, England and the European Theatre. Robert passed away in 2007 and was a member of the Fort Garry Branch #90 of The Royal Canadian Legion.





BRETECHER, Charles


WWII

Charles was born in Toutes Aides, Manitoba and joined the Army. When he passed away in 2002, Charles had been a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Branch #87 for thirty-five years. No additional information is available.

BRIGGS, Mervin (Bud)

WWII

Mervin was born in Deloraine, Manitoba in 1923 and joined the Navy. He served in the North Atlantic on HMCS Arvida (Corvette class) and HMCS Rockcliffe (Algerine class) doing convoy duty as an Able Seaman. Mervin has been a member of the Hartney Branch #26 of The Royal Canadian Legion for sixty-two years.



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BRINDLE, Harry E.

WWII

Harry enlisted in 1943 as a machinist in the shops on Burnell Street in Winnipeg during the war. He also manufactured gas tanks and spun metal for spinners on the famous hurricane aircraft in the can-car shops in Montreal. He later came back to Manitoba where he was posted in Shilo, Manitoba and drove the triple drive large wrecker trucks. After the war, Harry returned to his home town of Souris where he ran his own electronics repair shop for many years.

BROOKS (nee PHILIP), Muriel A.

WWII

Muriel was born in Killarney, Manitoba in 1924 and joined the Women's Royal Canadian Naval Service (Signals), serving in Canada. She passed away in 2005 and had been a member of the Fort Garry Branch #90 of The Royal Canadian Legion for eight years. No additional information is available.



BROOKS, Ronald M.

wwii

Ronald was born in 1922 and passed away on February 14, 1945 at age 22 when along with his platoon, the Royal Winnipeg Rifles, he had been ordered to clear some farm buildings. He was wounded in the leg but refused to retire as there were only four men left out of ten. Fifteen minutes later, his trench took a direct mortar hit, killing him instantly. Ron is buried at Groesbeek Canadian War Cemetery in Holland. Brooks Rapids in the Caribou River is named after him.

BROOKS, Vera E.

WWII

Vera was born in Darlington, Yorkshire, England in 1921. She joined the Women's Auxiliary Air Force and served in England. Vera was a member of The RCL Atikokan Branch #145 for more than sixty years.



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BROWN, Orville Norman David

WWII

Orville was born in Bowsman, Manitoba in 1924 and joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1943, serving in England and Germany. After his military service, he worked on the Canadian National Railway in Swan River and Flin Flon, Manitoba. In 1960, Orville moved to Carberry, MB where he was employed with Simplot. He and his wife Jean (Stephen) raised one son and three daughters. Orville died in Carberry in 1978 from heart disease.

BRUCE, Edward Emile

WWII

Edward was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1921 and joined the Army, serving in Canada, England, Belgium, Holland and Germany. Edward is a member of the Elmwood Branch #9 of The Royal Canadian Legion.





BUCHAN, Fred H.

WWII

Fred was born in Waseca, Saskatchewan in 1927 and joined the Royal Canadian Navy as an air mechanic, serving in Canada and the North Atlantic. When he passed away in 2005, Fred had been a member of the Fort Garry Branch #90 of The Royal Canadian Legion for fifty-two years. No additional information is available.

BUDNER, Nick WWII

Nick was born in Birds Hill, Manitoba in 1915 and joined the Lord Strathcona's Horse Regiment, serving in Canada, Britain, Italy and Northwest Europe. He passed away in 1991 and had been a member of the Calgary Branch #264 of The Royal Canadian Legion for forty years.





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
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Finding the grave of Glen Robert Campbell

The town of Coriano was about two and a half hours from the hill top town of Cortona in Tuscany where I was staying. The drive was amazing. We went through the mountains and over a mountain pass with beautiful fall scenery and deep, deep valleys with rivers below us. When we reached the other side of the mountain, the landscape was like Gilbert Plains - a farming area that reached to the sea with rolling hills. It had been raining and the rain stopped when we reached Coriano.

I was so impressed with how beautifully kept the cemetery was. It looked like the grass had been trimmed with scissors. There was a visitor book where I left a message. There was the history of the War in Italy from 1943-1945. I took photos of this wall. The writing from the wall is printed on the right.

The flowers were beautiful - so many roses. The cemetery was lined with maple trees and the leaves were falling. It was a beautiful resting place for these young brave men who gave their lives for us.

Glen Robert Campbell was born in Gilbert Plains in 1915. He was the son of John and Dorothy Campbell and brother to Mary (Lynch) Morris and Fred. His father John and his grandfather Lt. Colonel Glen Campbell had both served in the 1st World War in the 107th, under command of his grandfather. His grandfather was inducted into the Veterans Hall of Valor in 2009. His grandfather died overseas in the 1st World War from a kidney ailment that was not battle related.

At the time that Glen Robert went overseas with the Hastings and Prince Edward Regiment, he was married to Midge and living in Toronto. He was killed on the 15th of September, 1944. He had just walked out the door of a building his platoon was billeting at for the night when a shell exploded beside him and killed him instantly. He was 29 years old.

His brother, Fred, had been a mid-upper gunner on a Lancaster bomber. Fred's plane was shot down over Munchengladback, Germany on August 31,1943. He was 23. There were no survivors. It was their second last mission before they were to return home.

We located the grave of Glen Robert Campbell, Mary and Pete's brother. It was in Section XIII, Row A, Grave 5. He had died on September 15, 1944. It was by a beautiful yellow rose bush. I picked a rose and placed it on the grave.



I was overcome with emotion in this cemetery. I walked the rows and read the names and realized that most of these young men were in their 20's. Many of the Canadian graves had small Canadian flags on them and I wished I had one to put on Mr. Campbell's grave. Then I remembered I had my Olympic mitts with me. So I placed one mitt on his grave. I filled the other mitt with soil from his grave and placed the note that Mary had written for him under the soil on the grave. I brought the second mitt home

for Mary.

I also picked up about 20 maple leaves that had fallen near the grave and brought them home for the Campbell family. This day was the highlight of my trip. I am so honored to have visited this

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cemetery and I am so proud of all the young men who gave their lives so that we would have a better life.

This year, Remembrance Day will mean so much more for me.



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BULLOCK, Lyle K.

WWII

Lyle was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1921 and volunteered with the Royal Canadian Artillery on October 11, 1939, enrolling with the South Saskatchewan Regiment, Canadian 2nd Division as a radio operator. He served in Canada, England, France, Holland and Germany and participated in the Dieppe Raid. He was captured and survived 3 POW camps until he was liberated. 


CLARK, Stephen David

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CROSS, Herbert



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CUNNINGHAM, Harold






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
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DE MARCO, Julius George

WWII



DE VOS, Marcel A.H.


WWII


DIXON, Robert Edmond

DNISTRANSKY, Seth


WWII

WWII



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
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DODGE, Wellington William

John served in France and Belgium until the end of the war and received a medal from the Ville de Mons. He demobilized in Kingston on March 29, 1919 and passed away in Winnipeg on January 15, 1962.

DONALD (nee STEWART), Mary Elizabeth

Mary Elizabeth was born in Dand, Manitoba on November 23, 1922. She enlisted in Winnipeg in the Canadian Women's Army Corps, took her basic training in Edmonton, Alberta and spent most of her time in recruiting. After the war ended, she was a clerk in Winnipeg and was discharged in June of 1946. Mary Elizabeth now lives in Innisfil, Ontario.


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
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DOUGLAS, Elwood W.

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
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
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DUFFY, Irene M.

WWII



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


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FORBES, Lawrence W.

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




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GALKA, Charles I.

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
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



















GARNHAM, William Earl

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
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GLOVER, William J.

WWII



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


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
GOOD, William Herbert (Bert)

Norman was born on March 6, 1921 at Roseisle, Manitoba and joined the Active Canadian Army on September 4, 1939 in Kingston, Ontario. He served in Canada, Britain, in the Central Mediterranean area and in Northwest Europe. Norman held the rank of Corporal when he was discharged in Kingston, Ontario on August 7, 1945. 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The Rural Municipality of Montcalm was incorporated in 1882. A special celebration was held on June 13, 2007 to mark the municipality's 125th anniversary.

The R.M. of Montcalm is located approximately 60 kms south of Winnipeg in the heart of the Red River Valley and has three population centres: Saint-Joseph, Letellier and Saint-Jean-Baptiste.

WWII

Bernard was born on March 2, 1912 in Raymore, Saskatchewan. He joined the Royal Air Force, 51 Squadron RAF, in 1936 and trained as a navigator and pilot of various types of airplanes. On April 4, 1940, Bernard was shot down over Denmark and was a POW at Stalag Luft III where he twice tried to escape. In January 1945, German authorities evacuated POW camps and the Long March began. Bernard was liberated in April 1945 and repatriated to Canada. He received the 1939-1945 Star, the Air Crew Europe Star, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Overseas Bar, the War Medal 1939-45, the Oak Leaf (Mentioned in Dispatches twice) and Her Majesty's Armed Services Veterans Badge. Bernard died November 3, 2007 in Dugald, Manitoba.

HAYWARD, Victor W.

WWII

Victor was born in Gladstone, Manitoba on June 2, 1924 and joined the Winnipeg Rifles, serving in England and Italy. Wounded with wounds shot through both elbows, he was invalided out of the Rifles and then trained in Old MB Institute of Mechanics. He worked as a mechanic and salesman and retired in 1981. Victor was a resident of Gladstone when he passed away on December 17, 1997.





HAZLEHURST, Alfred J.

WWII

Alfred was born in the United Kingdom in 1921. In Winnipeg, he enlisted with the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps in February, 1941. He was discharged there in 1946 after having served in Canada, the United Kingdom and Continental Europe. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, the 1939-45 Star and the France and Germany Star. Alfred passed away in 1963.

HEAPE, William B.

WWII

William was born in Hartney, Manitoba in 1922 and joined the D-Company, 48th Highlanders of Canada, serving in Italy and the Mediterranean. He passed away in 2007 and was a Life Member of the Hartney Branch #26 of The Royal Canadian Legion for sixty years.

Raymond was born in Asessippi, Manitoba in 1922. He enlisted in Winnipeg in June 1914 with the 8th Light Anti-Aircraft, 70th Battery and was discharged there in October 1945 after having served in Continental Europe. He passed away in 1981.

Wilbert was born in Morden, Manitoba in 1917 and enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg on December 7, 1942. From the Manning Depot in Toronto, he was sent to St. Thomas and St. Hubert where he trained to be an electrician. Shipped overseas on December 8, 1943, he served on various RCAF and RAF bases in England, working on Spitfires, Typhoons and in a communications unit. He arrived in England on September 14, 1943 and was transferred to the 17th Field Regiment, 5th Armoured Division, then shipped to Salerno, Italy in November. Russell also saw action in France, Belgium and Holland before returning to Grandview on January 18, 1946. He passed away on July 16, 1991 at seventy-two and is buried at Grandview Memorial Gardens. Russell had been a member of RCL Grandview Branch #14 for forty-five years.

WWII



wwii



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
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
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IMPETT, Stephen

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




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JAGO, William (Bill) H.

He and his brothers, Francis and William and brother-in-law Thomas McIlveen, enlisted with the Canadian Expeditionary Overseas Force. On November 8, 1915, he enrolled with the Canadian Expeditionary Force, 90th Canadian Overseas Battalion, Winnipeg Rifles then transferred to the 61st (Winnipeg) Battalion CEF. On the ship to France, they discovered he was only 16 so Willie was returned to England where he stayed until his return to Canada after the war. He was awarded the British War Medal. Willie tried to enlist again for WWII, but at age 39, he was deemed too old. He received the Canadian Volunteer pin. William passed away in May 1970 at the age of seventy.







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
WWII

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
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JOHNSTON, Neil A.

George was born in Sydenham, Ontario in 1895 and enlisted in December 1915 with the 146th Battalion. He served in Canada, England, France and Belgium with the 52nd Battalion of the Signal Corps where one of his tasks was repairing telephone lines on the Front Line. In Sperling, MB, he worked for Consolidated Elevators then was a self-employed carpenter in Mather, MB until he died in 1983. Transferred to an army hospital in St John, NB, he trained as an orderly and received his Corporal stripes. From June 23, 1942, he served overseas in the UK and Continental Europe. Albert was discharged on March 12, 1946 and received the Battle of Britain Star Medal, the France and Germany Star, the Defence Medal, the War Medal and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. He's been a member of RCL Dominion City Branch #160 for the past sixty-four years and became an honorary member in 2005.





KELLY, John


WWII

On completion of basic training and advanced training, Art's unit was dispatched to Montreal to await embarkation to Europe. However, all the training and waiting was for naught as the war ended and victory declared. After his discharge, he returned to the Pine Falls area where he worked for the Abitibi Price Paper Mill and later farmed in the Stead area. He married and had one daughter, two grandchildren and three great grandchildren. Art received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal.

KEMPTHORNE, Frederick N.

WWII & PEACETIME

Frederick was born in the Boissevain area of Manitoba on March 6, 1925. He enlisted with the Royal Canadian Air Force at eighteen, graduated as a navigator in 1945 then became a Pilot Officer, receiving his Wings at Portage la Prairie, MB. Fred married Lily Hardy of Minto on August 31, 1946 then re-enlisted in the RCAF as a peacekeeper. He was posted to Rivers, MB and to Fontainebleau, France with the Occupation Forces in 1952. Back in Portage by 1956, Fred served mostly at Ontario bases and received his CGA designation while in the military before retiring in 1975 as a Captain. He also worked in Ottawa for the Federal Government seventeen years. Frederick passed away in Toronto in 2007.





KIEPER, Wilbur A.

wwii

Wilbur was born in Manitoba in 1924. He enlisted in Winnipeg in May 1943 with the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve, serving in Canada and the Atlantic. He was discharged in October 1945, and received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. Wilbur is a member of Russell Branch #159 of The Royal Canadian Legion and lives in British Columbia.

KILBOURNE, William B.

WWII

William was born in Swan River, Manitoba in 1922 and trained in Newfoundland where partway through his training, a German torpedo struck the small boat they were using. He was shipped to Scotland for further training and in 1943, was sent to Naples, Italy where he served for a year and a half. He went through the Hitler Goring and Gustav Lines, fought in Ortona then in Germany, France, Belgium and Holland. While in Italy, he was promoted to Corporal and then Sergeant. William had been a member of the Portage la Prairie Branch #65 of The Royal Canadian Legion for forty-eight years when he passed away in 2003.





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KILWORTH, Leonard W.

WWII

Leonard was born in Mayfeld, Manitoba in 1914. He enlisted in the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders and trained at Shilo, MB before going to England. He was taken prisoner at Dieppe and was a POW until the end of the war. He was a recipient of the 1939-45 Star. After his discharge, he farmed for a while and worked part time for the Canadian Pacific Railway and then for "Good Roads". He was a long time member of the Langruth Branch #162 of The Royal Canadian Legion for thirty-three years. He passed away on February 1, 1976 at his home in Westbourne.

KLAYH, Arnold B.

WWII

Arnold was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1923. He served as chief radio artificer on the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve Frigate Magog and was patrolling the St Lawrence Seaway when a German U-Boat torpedoed them, killing 3 men and wounding 17 others. Another frigate, the Shawinigan, towed them into Quebec City where the heavily damaged frigate was stripped of guns, ammo, shells and fuel. He soon boarded the Waskesiu to patrol the English Channel, the London area, Ireland, Scotland, the Mediterranean, the Panama Canal, then moved on to San Diego and Esquimalt, BC. When Arnold was discharged, he remained in Winnipeg and has been a member of Branch #215 Henderson and Branch #257 Lantzville for close to forty years.



KOHLENBERG, Paul

wwii

Paul was born in Melville, SK on November 17, 1922. He enlisted in the Army Infantry in 1942, transferred to the Royal Winnipeg Rifles, took First Aid and Medic training in England in June 1944 and was a stretcher bearer medic after landing in Normandy. Fluent in German, Paul frequently translated for captured or surrendering Germans. He served at Caen, Fort Neuilly, Falaise Gap, the Battle of the Scheldt, Leopold Canal and Nijmegen. Paul married in September 1945 and a year later, his English bride and infant daughter joined him in Canada. Paul was with the Gladstone Legion from 1973 and died on November 2. Paul received the Order of Canada, the French Normandy Medal, the Netherlands "Thank You" medal and the Volunteer Star.

KOSWAN (nee TATTRIE), Ida J.

WWII

Ida was born in the Woodyatt Township in Ontario in 1926 and joined the Canadian Women's Army Corps, serving in Canada. She has been a member of the Dorchester Branch of The Royal Canadian Legion for two years. No additional information is available.





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KRUGER, Fred C.

WWII

Fred was born in Ruth, Manitoba in 1920 and enlisted in 1940 with the 97 Squadron RAF, 420 Squadron RCAF, training as a pilot. Overseas, he served as a bomber pilot from 1941-44, completed 52 bombing missions and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal and the Distinguished Flying Cross. After the war, he served with the RCAF as an instructor pilot from 1948-49, was an Officer Commander with Training Command and Air Defense Command from 1949-1953 and RCAF Liaison Officer at Strategic Air Command of 434 Fighter Squadron from 1957-1960. He also worked for NORAD from 1960-63 and was Chief Administrative Officer in Moose Jaw from 1963-67. He retired but worked for the Federal Government until 1985. Fred passed away in 2007.

LAIRD, Wilson J.

WWII

Wilson enlisted with the Winnipeg Grenadiers and served sixteen months in Jamaica. He returned to Canada and went on to train in Quebec, then in England in 1942. Back in Canada, he joined the South Saskatchewan Regiment and was shipped back to England. He was killed in action on October 23, 1944 and is commemorated at Bergen-op-Zoom War Cemetery in Holland. Laird Lake, west of God's Lake in Manitoba. is named after him.



LAMBERT, Milford Alexander

wwii

Milford was born in 1919 near McAuley, Manitoba. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1940 and qualified as an AFM, training in Brandon, Dauphin and St. Thomas, ON. He went overseas on July 31, 1941 and then qualified as a Flight Engineer on a Lancaster. Milford and his 115 Squadron crew failed to return from a raid on Frankfurt, Germany on April 10, 1943. The crew members are buried in the Le Thour Communal Cemetery, Ardennes, France. Milford received the 1939-45 Star, the Air Crew Europe Star, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp and the War Service Medal 1939-45. He was also awarded the Flight Engineer's Badge and the RCAF Operational Wings.

LANE, John Leonard

WWII

John was born in Thorney Cambridgeshire, England in 1913 and joined the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps, serving in Canada, England and Holland. John passed away in 1988 and had been a member of the Birtle Branch #55 of The Royal Canadian Legion for forty years.







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
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LANE (nee DEWAR), Minerva

He passed away in 1995 and had been a member of the Brandon Branch #3 and Pro Patria Branch #31 Victoria of The Royal Canadian Legion for over ten years.



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LANG, Francis H. (Sonny)

WWII

Francis was born on July 24, 1916 at Lyleton, Manitoba, the son of Frank and Ethel Lang of Coulter, MB. He enlisted with the Royal Canadian Air Force in July 1940 in Winnipeg, training at Regina, Fort William, Mossbank, Toronto and Jarvis. He went overseas in April 1941 and completed his required number of operational flights as an air gunner. Sonny received his Flying Officer Commission in May 1943, returned to Canada in February 1944 for a month's leave and married Josephine Cracknell of Fort William. He then returned to England for his second tour of operations. He was killed in action on June 13, 1944 at age 27. Sonny is buried in the Calais Canadian War Cemetery in France.

WWII

Murray was born on April 6, 1918 at Lyleton, Manitoba, the son of Frank and Ethel Lang of Coulter, MB. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1941 and trained at Trenton, Brandon, Winnipeg and Mossbank. He was married on July 7, 1942 to Evelyn Webb of Browning, Saskatchewan and went overseas a few weeks later, on July 20th. He was killed in action on June 12, 1943 over Dusseldorf, Germany flying in a Halifax aircraft. He was twenty-five. Murray is buried in Rheinberg War Cemetery in Germany.

WWII



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
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LAUGHLAND, Arthur

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LAW, John A.H. (Haig)

WWII

John was born in Darlingford, Manitoba in 1918 and enlisted in the # 40 Canadian Provost Company in September of 1942, serving in Canada. He was discharged for medical reasons on December 21, 1942. When John passed away in 1995, he had been a member of the Morden Branch #11 of The Royal Canadian Legion for six years.

LAWRENCE, Kenneth S.

WWII

Kenneth was born in Ingelow, Manitoba in 1922 and joined the Royal Winnipeg Rifles. He was killed in action on June 8, 1944 at 21 and is commemorated at Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery in Calvados, France. Kenneth was the youngest son of Bertram and Mary Lawrence and was survived by his wife of 27 days, Ruth Russell of Isle of Wright, England. Kenneth, along with other members of the 3rd Canadian Division which included their Commanding Officer, Major Frederick Hodge, was captured by Hitler's Elite SS Battalion and taken to their headquarters at the Chateau d'Audrieu where they were questioned and executed. Lawrence Island in Island Lake was named after him in 1982.



LEACH, Edgar Mervin

WWII

Edgar was born in Semans, Saskatchewan on May 21, 1925. He enlisted in Winnipeg in 1943 and trained in Winnipeg and Shilo before landing in England on July 2, 1944. He was attached to the Essex Scottish Regiment and served in the Northwest Europe Campaign in Holland, Belgium, France and Germany. He was discharged in March 1946 but re-enlisted in the Airborne Division and later transferred to the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery, stationed at Rivers, Winnipeg and Shilo, retiring in 1970 after twenty-five years of service. He served as Hartney's Town Constable and worked for Pioneer Electric in Regina and retired there. Edgar passed away on October 11, 2008 and is buried in the Windsor Cemetery in Teulon, Manitoba.

LEAD, Albert Edward

WWI

Albert joined the 43rd Cameron Highlanders, 16th Canadian Scottish Regiment and Canadian Army Service Corps Seaford, serving in England and France. He received the Mons Star. No additional information is available.





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LEGARY, Harvey Albert

WWII

Harvey was born in Pilot Mound, Manitoba in 1921 and joined the 427 Squadron, Royal Canadian Air Force, serving in England and Germany. He was killed in action at age 22 on July 29, 1944 and is commemorated at Hamburg Cemetery in Germany. He was the son of Edgar D. and Bethel H. Legary of Pilot Mound. Legary Lake, southeast of Tadoule Lake, was named after him in 1957.

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
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LEVERINGTON, William O. (Bill) SPECIAL AREA DUTY

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
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LEWIS, Owen B.

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
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MacMURCHY, Edward D.


WWII

On July 10, 1940 at the age of twenty-two, he enlisted with the 17th Field Regiment, 37th Field Battery of the Royal Canadian Artillery in Fort Frances then was stationed at Camp Borden, ON. On June 26, 1941, while waiting with his regiment to go overseas via Nova Scotia, he was seriously injured when the army vehicle he was in went over an embankment in Mira Gut, Cape Breton. 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
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
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




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MINIELY, Lawrence E. (Buzzie)

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
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MULLIN, B. Elvis

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
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NIELD, Harvey R. E. (Andy)

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
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
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OAKDEN, Arthur E.

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



ROBERTS, Harry Elgin Sr.

WWI

Harry was born on May 19, 1894 in Drayton, Ontario. He enlisted with the Canadian Expeditionary Force on January 17, 1915 and served in Canada, Britain and France. ROE, William Abraham



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
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


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
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SEMCHUK, James

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




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SIMPSON, William L.

STEWART, Andrew M.


WWII

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
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
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STEWART, Keith M.

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
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STOWE, Norma K.

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
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TENNANT, William Gladstone

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
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THORLACIUS, Lawrence T.

William passed away in 1990 and was a member of the Boissevain Branch #10 of The Royal Canadian Legion for twenty-five years.

TUFTS, Laverne Glenn

WWII

Laverne was born in Fairfax, Manitoba in 1922 and joined the Canadian Army in 1941 and trained at Camp Borden. After joining the Lord Strathcona Horse Regiment in England in 1943, he was sent to Algiers and to Philipville on the North Africa coast and then to Naples and Ortona, Italy. Laverne was wounded in the back and shoulders from shrapnel and still had some sixty-four years later. From there, they worked up to Ravenna and then moved to Leghorn for loading on Tank Landing Craft and sent to Marseille, France and to Belgium and Holland by April. Laverne was a driver in the scout troop attached to the tank squadron. He returned to Canada for his discharge in 1946.


URIE, Harry R.

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
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VEILLEUX, Arthur Gustav

Joseph married Irene Bercier of Roblin, obtained a farm through the *Veterans' Land Act* and later sold it and moved to Winnipeg. They had 5 children, 11 grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren. 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
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


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WATSON, Hector G.

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
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WELHAM, Reginald H.

Stephen was born on Cape Breton Island in 1911 and joined the Royal Canadian Navy, serving in Canada, Britain and the High Seas. He passed away in 2002 and had been a member of the Ukrainian Canadian Veterans' Branch #141 of The Royal Canadian Legion for fifty-five years.



ZROBACK, Nicholas

wwii

Nicholas was born in Kenora, Ontario in 1914 and joined the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry on January 11, 1940. He served in England and Sicily in 1943 and on October 22, 1944, "D" Company, of which he was Platoon Commander, launched an attack at the Savio River in Northern Italy, reaching their objective on the far side of the river. The enemy counter attack was relentless and the platoon had no choice but to surrender to the enemy. He was imprisoned at Stalag 7B in Moosburg, Germany until the end of the war. Nicholas was mentioned in "Dispatches", published in the London Gazette in 1943. He died in 1995 and was a member of RCL Kenora Branch #12 for forty-five years.

ZROBOK, Nestor (Casey)

WWII

Nestor was born in Kenora, Ontario in 1920 and joined the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve in Port Arthur, Ontario. He was serving on HMCS Charlottetown when it was torpedoed and sunk near Cap Chat, QC on September 11, 1942 by the German U-boat, U-517. The Captain and eight crew members went down with the ship but Nestor was one of the fortunate survivors. He then served on HMCS Provider, patrolling the waters off Hamilton, Bermuda until the end of hostilities. Casey passed away in 2001 and had been a member of the Kenora Branch #12 of The Royal Canadian Legion for forty-five years.

COWARD, William Henry WWI


William was born in 1894 and joined the 10th Princess Patricia's Field Ambulance. He served in Canada, England, France and Belgium and was killed in action in 1917.



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

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
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
