

WWII

Stanley was born in Selkirk, Manitoba in 1908. He enlisted in Winnipeg during WWII and served in Europe with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles.

ADAMS, William Charles

WWII

William was born in Selkirk, Manitoba in 1924. He enlisted at the age of 17 with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles and took part in the Normandy Invasion on June 6, 1944. He was taken prisoner and was executed by the S.S. two days later on June 8. William was awarded the 1939-45 Star, the France and Germany Star, the Defence Medal, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, and the War Medal 1939-45. William's mother received the Silver Cross. William is buried in the Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery in France.



ADAMS, William Graham

WWI

William was born in Netley, Manitoba in 1891. He enlisted in 1915 at Brandon, Manitoba and joined the 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles (Saskatchewan Regiment). He was killed in action on September 28, 1916 near Somme, France. William was awarded the 1914-15 Star, the British War Medal, and the Victory Medal 1914-19. His family received the Memorial Plaque and Scroll. He is remembered with honour on the Vimy Memorial at Pas-de-Calais in France.

AGERBAK, Borge "Buster"

WWII

Buster was born in Odense, Denmark in 1914 and immigrated to Canada with his family in 1927. He enlisted with his two brothers, Tage (Tiger) and Knud (Ken) in September 1939 with the Winnipeg Grenadiers. In May 1940, after serving in Bermuda and Jamaica, the Grenadiers and Royal Rifles were sent to Hong Kong, which surrendered to the Japanese on Christmas Day. Badly wounded, Buster and his brother Ken were shipped to Japan, where he survived slave labour until freed by the Americans in 1945. He returned home in October to his wife and family but suffered for years from the after effects of war illnesses. Buster worked for 27 years for the civil service and was a member of Charleswood Legion Branch 100 for more than thirty years, as well as the Hong Kong Veterans Association, the Masons and Shriners. He received the 1939-45 Star, Pacific Star, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Hong Kong Bar, War Medal 1939-45, Victory Medal, Defence Medal, Canadian Efficiency Medal, and the Canadian Centennial Medal. Buster died in 2001.

AHARA, Matthew

WWI

Matthew was born in Ireland. He joined the Army and served with the 200th Battalion, 11th Reserve. He transferred to 104 Glenn Camp and Bell's Scouts and also served with the 2nd Canadian Engineers. Corporal Ahara was part of the Guard of Honour to King Albert on February 2, 1919 in Liège, France.

ALDRED, William

WWI

William joined the Army and served with 222nd Battalion and transferred to the 16th Machine Gun Company of the 44th Battalion and then to the 4th Machine Gun Battalion. Sergeant Aldred fought in France at Vimy, Hill 70, Arras, Passchendaele, Cambrai, Amiens, Mons and in Brussels.



ANDERSON, Arnold Wellington "Andy"

WWII

Andy was born on February 16, 1918 in Carman, Manitoba. Before joining the Air Force in Winnipeg on September 16, 1941, he worked as a "B" operator in radar. He was posted to Edmonton for basic training and then moved to Saskatoon for two years as a member of the ground crew. Later, Andy was re-deployed to Virden to train on the iconic Tiger Moth aircraft as a pilot. However, illness intervened. He was transferred to Trenton, Nova Scotia and qualified as a radar operator. All following postings were in the east, including Louisbourg and Newfoundland, where Sergeant Anderson found the most isolated post in the world to be Cape Bauld, where he served for 14 months. The last posting of the war was Dartmouth, Nova Scotia before being discharged in Winnipeg on August 29, 1945. Andy was a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 for more than fifty-four years.

ANDERSON, Edmund

WWII

Edmund was born in Rainy River, Ontario on December 29, 1916 and passed away on July 30, 1983. He served as a Trooper in the Army with the 7th Canadian Reconnaissance Regiment, known as the 17th Duke of York's Royal Canadian Hussars, in Canada, England and Northwest Europe. Edmund trained in Fort William and Borden, ON before leaving for England in October 1943. He disembarked in France on July 15, 1944 and was at Falaise Gap, Schelde, Nijmegen, Germany, and Holland, where he met his future wife in 1945. He left the UK in December 1945 and was discharged on February 9, 1946. Edmund was a member of Kenora Legion Branch 12.

ANDERSON, Harold G. "Hal"

WWII

Hal was born in 1921. The family moved to Pine Falls, MB in 1927, where he attended school and later worked for the Manitoba Paper Company. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served as a Warrant Officer in Canada with #14 Squadron but died on April 1, 1943 at the age of 22. Hal is commemorated at Fort Richardson Post Cemetery in Alaska and Harold Anderson Lake, south of Swampy Lake, was named after him in 1995.



ANDERSON, John W.

wwi

John was born in Silverton, Manitoba and he died in 1949. He enlisted in the Army in February 1916 and was discharged in April 1919. Private Anderson served with the 226th and 16th in France where he was wounded in both legs. He was a member of Russel Legion Branch 159.

ANDERSON, William C.

wwi

William was born in 1895 in Silverton, Manitoba and died in 1958. On March 6, 1916, he enlisted with the 107th Battalion, 1st C.M.R., serving in France. Private Anderson was discharged in February 1919. He was a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.

M. R. Arbuthnott served in the Canadian Navy from July 1943 to December 1945, serving in Canada and the United Kingdom on HMCS Chippewa. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp. He has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.



ARMSWORTHY, Covert W.

WWII

Covert was born in 1926 in Belmont, Nova Scotia. He joined the Army in April 1942 at the age of 16 but was discharged in December that same year because of his age. He joined again in June 1943 and served in Canada until January 1945. After the war, Covert left Nova Scotia and headed west to seek employment. He ended up in Regina, where he met and married his wife, Doreen Wanamaker. They moved to Flin Flon in 1948, where he worked as a miner with Hudson Bay Mining and Smelting. In 1958, they moved to Snow Lake, still working with Hudson Bay Mining, and raised four children. He resided there until his death in 1984. Covert was a member of Snow Lake Legion Branch 241 for seventeen years, was Branch President from 1966-67, and also served on the Executive for five years. He was awarded one of only 29,500 Centennial Medals issued in 1967 by the Queen of Canada to commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Confederation.

ASELTINE, John W. "Jack"


WWI

Jack was born in Beachburg, Ontario on June 2, 1895. He joined the Army in 1914 and served with Lord Strathcona Horse in Canada, England, and France. He was injured in the shoulder in 1918, while leading horses back from the front line. During his hospitalization, peace was declared in Europe so Jack was repatriated to Canada. He played pro-hockey with the Regina Pats and later was moved to Winnipeg. He met Ethel Cuthbert there, got married in 1922, and they raised two children. By 1927, hockey pay was insufficient, so he began work in the Grinder Room at the Abitibi Mill in Pine Falls, Manitoba, a position he held for 30 years. "Old 44", as he was called on the golf course, enjoyed playing with his family and friends through his retirement years. Jack was awarded the George V Medal for bravery in battle and the Lord Strathcona Horse Medal for service 1914-1918. Jack died in 1966.

ASHCROFT (nee HINCE), Eunice M.

WWII

Eunice was born in Shucknall-Hill, Yarkhill in Herefordshire, England in 1923. She enlisted in the Merchant Navy and served in the Women's Army Corps and the Auxiliary Territorial Service in Seaford, England during World War II. Eunice was a member of Manitoba's Birtle Legion Branch 55 for nineteen years. She died in 2007.

ASKEW, George William

WWII

George was born in Cartwright, Manitoba on March 25, 1921 and grew up on the family farm. He worked as a service man in his uncle's garage prior to enlisting with the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg on October 4, 1941. While serving in England, George was with No. 419 Squadron and took part in seven raids over a period of six weeks before being shot down over Essen, Germany on July 26, 1943. He is buried in Germany's Reichswald Forest War Cemetery at Grave 2&3, Plot 6, Row D. George and his brother John were killed six months apart. While on leave touring England, George and John wished they remembered more of their British history. The Askew Scholarship for British History was established in 1948 for Cartwright School students in memory of George Askew and his brother John. Askew Lake, NE of North Knife Lake, was named after him in 1974.



ASKEW, John Ruskin

wwii

John was born to Ruskin and Josephine Askew in Cartwright, Manitoba on May 22, 1919. He worked on the family farm with his father and joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg on October 10, 1941. He trained in Brandon, Saskatoon, Paulson and Trenton, and graduated from Mountain View School as Flight Sergeant Gunner. From August 18, 1942, John served overseas as a Flight Sergeant in the Conversion Unit of the Royal Canadian Air Force and was killed in a plane crash over England on January 29, 1943. John is buried in Yorkshire in Ripon Cemetery, Section H, Grave 406. While on leave touring England, John and his brother George wished they'd remembered more of their British history. In 1948, a scholarship for British History was established, named in memory of John and George. It was later changed in 1983 to History and Canadian Studies, as British History was no longer being taught. Askew Island in Webbe Lake was also named after John in 1995.

ATKINS, Gordon M.

WWII

Gordon was born in 1921. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served in Yorkshire, England as a navigator with Squadron 432 from 1942-45. He was a member of Portage la Prairie Legion Branch 65, as well as Glenboro Legion Branch 71. Gordon passed away in 2000.

He was a Life Member of Hartley Legion Branch 26 before he died in 1969.

BEDFORD, Gordon W.

WWII

Gordon was born in 1922 in Dauphin, Manitoba. In 1940, he enlisted in the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, then transferred to the Air Force in 1941 and served with 426 Squadron. Flight Lieutenant Bedford engaged in many missions, survived three separate Lancaster crashes, and endured the last eleven months of WWII as a POW in Germany before returning to Canada. He joined Dauphin Legion Branch 20 in 1946, the executive in 1958, and held many positions, including President for two separate stints. A Life Membership was awarded to him in 1978 and two years later, he began a six-year term as District Commander on the Provincial Council. He was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal in 1991 and the Commemorative Medal in 1993. He has been a Legion member for more than sixty-four years and is still active today.

Everett was born in 1919 in Petersfield, Manitoba. He joined the Canadian Army and served with the 17th Field Regiment in Italy, France, Belgium, Holland, Germany, and possibly North Africa. Everett was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion before he died in 1960.

He returned to Montreal on August 18, 1945. In 1945, his pay rate was \$7.00/day. His final pay for 46 days served in 1945 was \$322. Leonard was a member of Gladstone Legion 110 for forty-five years before he passed away in 2000.

Andrew was born in Pilot Mound, Manitoba in 1887. He enlisted in the Army in Winnipeg in December 1916 and served in England and France with the 1st Canadian Engineers. He was wounded in France and discharged in January 1919. Andrew was a construction contractor, a farmer and town policeman most of his life. He was a member of Arborfield Legion Branch 203 in Saskatchewan. He died in Arborfield in 1952 and is buried in Moose Range Cemetery in Saskatchewan.

BLACKBURN, Hugh McIntyre

WWI

Hugh was born and raised at Gilbert Plains, Manitoba, as well as in Pilot Mound, MB. He enlisted in the Fall of 1915 and was transferred to the 144th Battalion in 1916 and went overseas. He served in France for ten months with the 16th Brigade. Hugh was taken prisoner on August 22, 1917, where he remained for 16 months. He weighed 92 lbs. when he came home. He moved to Prince George, British Columbia in 1920, where he farmed with his family. Hugh was a member of Prince George Legion Branch 43. He died there in 1967.



BLACKBURN, Matthew James "Jim"

wwi

Jim was born in Pilot Mound, Manitoba in 1891. He enlisted with the 1st Canadian Engineers in Winnipeg in 1916 and served as a Corporal in England, France, Belgium, and Germany. Discharged in 1919, Jim was awarded the Military Medal for Bravery. Jim was a carpenter, a contractor and farmer most of his life and was a member of Arborfield Legion Branch 203 and its Past President from 1954-55. He was also a member of Pilot Mound Legion Branch 62. Matthew passed away in 1979 in Pilot Mound and was buried in Moose Range Cemetery in Saskatchewan.

BLACKBURN, William George

WWI

George was born in Pilot Mound, Manitoba in 1883. He enlisted with the 1st Canadian Engineers on June 8, 1916 and served as a Corporal during WWI in England, France, Belgium, and Germany until his discharge in 1919. George farmed for a short time, was a carpenter and contractor for most of his life, and was a member of Pilot Mound Legion Branch 62 for more than twenty-five years. He died on August 18, 1952 and is buried at Pilot Mound.

BOWSER (nee WHITE), Evelyn J.


PEACETIME

Almer was discharged on March 13, 1946 and returned to Selkirk, Manitoba, where he lived for the remainder of his life. He was a Life Member of Selkirk Legion Branch 42 for fifty years and he died in 2002.

BOYD, John Marshall

WWII

John was born in Fairfax, Manitoba on July 24, 1916. He worked on the farm with his father and brother until he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force. Posted to Regina, he graduated from "A" Flight #1 Training Squadron on July 19, 1940, went overseas, and on August 19, 1941, was stationed at Leeming, Yorkshire with the 77 Squadron RAF as Sergeant Wireless Op. Air-Gunner. On a raid over Germany on October 31, 1941, Flight Sergeant Boyd's plane was hit and they went down over Kiel, Germany. The bodies of the crew were re-interred one and a half miles east in the Kiel British Military Cemetery, Grave #9, Row J, Plot 3.











BRINKWORTH, Merle Bruce

PEACETIME

Merle was born in Baldur, Manitoba in 1932. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on July 25, 1951 at Brandon, Manitoba and did his basic training in St. Jean, Quebec, his trade training in Aylmer, Ontario and then transferred to #3 Fighter Wing in Zweibrücken, Germany, where he provided support for three Fighter Squadrons from February 1953 to February 1955. Merle was transferred several times, namely to: Hamilton, ON (Mount Hope) for five years as support for Reserve Training Squadron; Moisie, QC Radar Station for five years; Falconbridge, ON until his release in July 1966. He received the Canadian Forces Decoration in 1963. After 15 years in the service, Merle bought a grocery store and later retired. He was living at Legion House II in Morden, Manitoba and has been a member of Morden Legion Branch 11 for more than forty-four years.

BROGDEN, Robert Ross "Bob"

WWII

Bob was born on a farm near Cartwright, Manitoba on February 11, 1919 but a year later, on February 28, he lost his mother and three siblings in a tragic house fire. Until World War II, he worked on the family farm and other farms in the area. Bob enlisted in the Army in Winnipeg in January 1940 and was sent overseas after three months of training. The following three years were spent serving as a Private with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry in southern England. Bob was seriously wounded during a training exercise, as were four other soldiers. He died the following day, on April 25, 1943, and is buried in Brookwood Military Cemetery, southwest of London. In 1972, he was honoured by the naming of a lake after him in northern Manitoba. The lake is known as Brogden Lake.





BROUGH, William A.

WWII

William was born in Winnipegosis, Manitoba in 1918 and died in 1971. He joined the Army and served with the Royal Canadian Forestry Corps in France, Germany and Belgium. William was a member of Kenora Legion Branch 12.

BROWN, George A.

WWI

George was born in 1892 in Buckie, County of Banff, Scotland. He joined the Army during WWI and served with the 79th Cameron Highlanders and transferred to the 43rd Cameron in France and Belgium. George was a Life Member of Hartney Legion Branch 26 before he died in 1987.

BRYCHKA, John

WWII

John was born in Gilbert Plains, Manitoba in 1925. At the age of 17, he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Navy as a Bandsman (coronet) during the Second World War. From January 4, 1944, he served onboard HMCS Prince Henry on the high seas and was assigned during the invasion of Normandy on June 6, 1944. He participated in invasions in southern France, Italy and Greece. John was decorated with seven medals of Honour, as well as two Legion service medals, for 50 and 75 years. He was a member of Gilbert Plains Legion Branch 98 and Dauphin Legion Branch 20 for a total of sixty-five years before he died in 2010.



BRYCHKA, Mitch

WWII

Mitch was born on August 17, 1920 in Ukraina, Manitoba. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy on January 23, 1941 in Winnipeg and initially trained as an Officer Steward for Commander J. D. Prentice (who wore a monocle). Mitch's Corvette, HMCS Chambly, left in April 1942 on escort duty from Newfoundland to Ireland. Between September 9-11 while on SC42, HMCS Chambly and HMCS Moosejaw sank German submarine #501, the first to be sunk by the Royal Canadian Navy. Mitch was in charge of the depth charges. The crew of HMCS Chambly took nine German prisoners and HMCS Moosejaw took 30 prisoners. Mitch was transferred to Ordinary Seaman in January 1943 and in September, was in Lunenburg at the Norway Mine Sweeper Refit Base. He was honourably discharged on July 23, 1945. Mitch was a member of British Columbia's Surrey Legion Branch. He died in 2005.

BUDREAU, Donald H.

WWII

Donald was born in January 1916 in Rainy River, Ontario but he moved with his family to Winnipeg, Manitoba, where he finished school and studied physics and navigation at the University of Manitoba. He then worked in mining and on boats on the Mackenzie River in the Northwest Territories, hauling radium ore. Back in Winnipeg, he met his wife and they married in 1941. Donald enlisted in Winnipeg on May 11, 1942 and took his basic training in Brandon, MB and air crew training in navigation in Saskatoon, SK. After completing his training on February 15, 1943, he was posted with Bomber Command, Squadron 158 in England. He flew 37 sorties over Europe, including the Normandy invasion and Germany. In July 1945, King George VI presented him with the Distinguished Flying Cross for bravery. After discharge, he worked with Canada Customs until he retired in 1977. Donald was a member of Major Hughes Legion Branch 54 for fifty-nine years. He died in March 2006 at the age of 90.

BUNN, Hugh H. F. B.

WWII

Hugh was born in 1925 in The Pas, Manitoba. He joined the Home Guard Reserve Unit Fort Garry Horse and spent summers with the Unit at Camp Shilo, Manitoba. At age 18, he enlisted in the Army, took basic training at Fort Garry and advanced training at Shilo, specializing in small arms weapons and bayonet drills. He volunteered to help the Americans, so transferred to Camp McCauley in Victoria, BC but never shipped out as the atom bomb was dropped, ending the war with Japan. Hugh helped transport the returning POWs from the ship to the hospital. He had his platoon of men give about 100 badly crippled soldiers home from Japan an Eyes Right and Salute in honour of what they had gone through as they were leaving the hospital grounds. Corporal Bunn worked in Ottawa preparing War Service Gratuity for discharged veterans. Hugh and his wife, Beth, reside in Edmonton during the winter, returning home to Snow Lake for the summer. Hugh has been a member of Snow Lake Legion Branch 241 for a number of years.

BURNETT, Charles C.

WWII & KOREA

Charles was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in August 1921. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served in Canada. He has been a member of Elmwood Legion Branch 9 for more than forty-five years.





BURNS, Tyler J.

SPECIAL DUTY AREA



BYERS, John Alexander

WWII

John was born in Winnipeg in 1917. He joined the Army and served with Fort Garry Horse in Holland. On April 23, 1945, north of Kirchheim, Germany, a German battalion counter attacked the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders of Canada, cutting off a complete platoon of C Company. Corporal Byers, a crew commander in the 4th troop in support of C Company, quickly assessed the critical situation, and moved his tank to 80 yards from the lost platoon, bringing disastrous fire on the enemy but also exposing himself to bazooka fire and SP guns. He destroyed one A/Tk gun and crew and two bazooka teams. For his quick thinking in sizing up a difficult situation in a moment, for his coolness, and above all, for his undaunted courage in seizing a suicidal task without thought for his own safety and for saving a critical situation, Corporal Byers was awarded the Military Medal. John, who was a member of Selkirk Legion Branch 42, died in 1988.

CAMERON, Charles S.

wwi

Charles was born in Neepawa, Manitoba in 1895 and died in 1983. He joined the Canadian Engineers in Winnipeg on February 8, 1916 and was discharged there on May 5, 1919, having served as a 2nd Corporal with the 107th and 2nd Battalions in France, Belgium, and Germany. He was a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.



CAMERON, Ian Ross

WWII


Ian was born in Invercargil, New Zealand in 1922. He joined the New Zealand Armed Forces at 18 and served on Coastal Patrol. Ian came to Canada during WWII to take part in the Commonwealth Air Training Plan in Lethbridge, AB and Winnipeg, MB, before going overseas. He served in Canada, England and in New Zealand with the RNZAF Unit. Ian was a member of Kenora Legion Branch 12 and he died in 1996.

CARLBOM, Chester W.

WWII

Chester was born in Kenora, Ontario in 1922. He served with the Lord Strathcona's Horse Royal Canadians, in the Reconnaissance Troop of the Armoured Regiment and saw action in Canada, Britain, Italy and Northwest Europe. On April 15, 1945, on the Apeldoorn Highway in Holland, Chester's tank took a direct hit and burst into flames. After recovering from his burns, he returned to Sioux Lookout and went into the logging and lumbering business. He retired and traveled throughout Europe with his wife, joining Dutch celebrations of the Canadian liberation of Holland and visiting his brother's grave in Holten War Cemetery in Holland. Chester was a member of Picton Legion Branch 78. Chester lost his battle with cancer in September 1995.











CARLBOM, Earl H.

WWII

Earl was born in Whitemouth, Manitoba in 1917 and he served with the Lake Superior Regiment in Canada, Britain, France, Belgium and Holland during WWII. On February 15, 1945, his patrol ran into trouble at the Maas River and Sergeant Carlbom attempted a rescue with Sergeant Boomhower and Lieutenant Banks. They were ambushed, resulting in Earl being severely injured and dying of his wounds shortly after. Earl was eventually buried in the Canadian Military Cemetery in Holten, Holland. Lieutenant Colonel H. A. Parker wrote this about Sgt. Carlbom, "It can truly be said that he gave his life for others, and we in this Regiment are very proud to have known and fought with men like Sgt. Carlbom."

CARLSON, Roy Sylvester

WWII

Roy was born in Kenora, Ontario in 1919. He enlisted in the Canadian Army in 1940 and served with the Royal Canadian Signal Corps in Canada and Europe. He was a POW for about a year and was hospitalized in England for some time after the war. Roy was discharged in 1945 but re-enlisted in 1946, serving until 1969. After his first marriage in 1952, he served at several places across Canada. Roy was a member of Ontario's Kenora Legion Branch 12 and he passed away in 1981.



CARSWELL, Joseph

WWII


Joseph was born in Madawaska, Ontario in 1918. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served in Canada, North Africa, England, and Europe during WWII. Joseph has been a member of the Nestor Falls Legion Branch for over five years.

CHARTRAND, John


WWII

R. D. Chipping enlisted in Winnipeg in 1941 and was discharged there in 1946. He served in Canada, the United Kingdom, France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany with the 5th Field Regiment. Gunner Chipping received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, the War Medal 1939-45, the France and Germany Star, and the Defence of Britain Medal. He has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.

CHRISTIE, Earl J.

WWI & WWII

Earl was born in Glenboro, Manitoba in 1895. He joined the 90th Battalion in Winnipeg on June 15, 1916 and was sent to England with the 226th Battalion. He went into aviation training and then Sergeant Christie went to Egypt, where he spent most of his war service as an instructor at the Aerial Fighting School, turning out three full-fledged pilots a month. He was promoted to Flight Lieutenant. Following his marriage to Ena McLean in 1919, Earl farmed until WWII when he was appointed chief administrative officer of the recruiting branch of the Royal Canadian Air Force, with the rank of Squadron Leader. He was stationed at Winnipeg, Regina, Calgary, AB and Moncton, NB. Earl died in Glenboro in 1948. His two sons, Robert and Bruce, were also in the Air Force, serving in World War II. They are also deceased.

Served with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles - Died 1944/10/11 and is buried in Adegem Canadian War Cemetery, in Belgium. Michael was the son of Nick & Katherine Bidochka (nee Kozak).



Served with Winnipeg Grenadiers - Died 1941/12/22 and is buried in Hong Kong. Henry was the son of Henry & Olena Piasta (nee Fedyk).



Oswald Armstrong

Served with #49 Squadron - Died 1945/02/03 and is buried in Durnbach War Cemetery, in Germany. Oswald was the son of Walter & Mabel Armstrong (nee Fisher).

Fredrick Bidochka

Served with Royal Canadian Artillery 2 Anti-Tank - Died 1944/07/20 and is buried in Bretteville-sur-Laize Canadian War Cemetery in France. Fredrick was the son of Nick & Katherine Bidochka (nee Kozak).





CHUTE, Clifford A. "Cliff"

WWII

Cliff was born in 1923 in Dauphin, Manitoba. He joined the Army and served in the FGH Tank Corps in Europe during WWII. He recalls a time when his tank was hit, resulting in his being wounded and his friend severely injured. His friend died of his injuries a short while later. A few years ago, Cliff was in Ottawa watching the Remembrance Day Service and Mrs. Taylor, the Mother of the Year, was laying the Wreath. The friend who died in the tank attack was also called Taylor and he wondered if she might be his dead friend's mother. Cliff was able to contact her through his local Legion and confirmed that she was indeed his friend's mother. They were able to visit and Mrs. Taylor was very grateful to learn the details of her son's last day on the field. Cliff has been a member of Dauphin Legion Branch 20 for more than sixty years.

As an instructor from March 1941 to January 1943, he flew a variety of aircraft, such as the Tiger Moth, Harvard, Anson, Yale, Crane, Norseman, Beach Craft, Shark, Canso "A", Stranraer and Catalin. From May 1943, he flew with #7 (BR) Squadron off the West Coast. His last sortie was June 1944, when he was re-assigned to instructional duties. George was lauded for his extremely high degree of flying and instructional ability, setting an example deserving of high praise. George was awarded the Air Force Cross on August 11, 1945. He was a member of Pilot Mound Legion Branch 62 for twenty-seven years before he died in 1973.

COLEMAN, William J.

WWII

William was born in Waskada, Manitoba in 1920. During WWII, he joined the Army and served with Lord Strathcona Horse in Canada, England, Italy, and Northwest Europe. He is a Life Member of Melita Legion Branch 127.



CONNOLLY, Bernard A.

KOREA

Bernard was born in Montreal, Quebec in 1931. He joined the Army and did his basic training in Shilo, Manitoba and Fort Lewis, Washington, USA. Bernard served as a Gunner in the Korean Special Force from August 1950 in the 2nd Field Regiment of the Royal Canadian Horse Artillery before departing from Seattle, Washington for Korea in April 1951. Bernard returned to Vancouver, BC in May 1952. He has been a member of Selkirk Legion Branch 42 for over thirty-six years.

His job was to monitor for German submarines. I do believe that his ship located and destroyed a submarine that day.

He served until his demobilization on June 6, 1946, earning him the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp. He served in Canada, in the United Kingdom and Continental Europe. After discharge, he worked with the Abitibi Paper Company in Pine Falls, Manitoba. Dave was a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 before he passed away in Winnipeg on October 5, 2003.

CUTTS, Arthur Earl W.

WWII

Arthur was born in Beulah, Manitoba in 1916 and he joined the Army in September 1939 at the age of 23. He served in Canada, Italy, England, Holland and Germany with the Royal Canadian Engineers where he was classified as Pioneer C and Motor Mechanic B, attaining the rank of Corporal. While serving in England at his home base near Balcombe in the county of Sussex, he met and married Mary Knight. Arthur's unit was dispatched to Italy, then to Holland. After his discharge on August 11, 1945, he returned to civilian life in Winnipeg. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp. Arthur was a member of Fort Garry Legion Branch 90 for over fifty-five years before he passed away in 2002.











DALKE, William

WWII

William was born on April 15, 1918 in Morris, Manitoba. He joined the Army in Winnipeg on October 10, 1939 and served with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry during WWII. William was a member of Morris Legion Branch 111 before he died on February 3, 1998.

DANKOWSKI (nee NEISMAN), Margaret Freda "Marg" WWII

Marg was born on February 3, 1925 in Ardill, Saskatchewan. She was twenty when on June 5, 1943, she joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in Regina, Saskatchewan. Her twenty-eight months in the Air Force were served in Canada. Marg was posted in Ontario in Guelph and Ottawa (Uplands Air Force Base), in Quebec at St. Hubert, in Moncton and Pennfield, New Brunswick and Dartmouth, Nova Scotia. A brother, Gordon Neisman, also served and was sent overseas in October 1945. Marg was honourably released and transferred to the Reserve General Section Class E in October 1945. The Village of Mossbank, Saskatchewan honoured her on December 19, 1945 with a certificate of thanks for her "valiant part in keeping alight the torch of freedom". Marg was a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 before she died on September 28, 2009.



DANYLUK, Peter

WWII

Peter joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in North Bay, Ontario in February 1943 and served as a Leading Aircraftman in Canada and the United Kingdom. Discharged in Winnipeg in September 1955, Peter received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp. He has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.

DAVIDSON, B. M.

WWII

B. M. Davidson joined the Canadian Army in Winnipeg in January 1944 and was discharged there in May 1945. Lance Corporal served in the CO CHOC in France and Belgium. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. He has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.

His favourite pastime was playing the violin in "Kay & Jack's Orchestra", with his wife Kay at the piano and his brother-in-law Jack on the banjo. Jack was a member of Morris Legion Branch 111 for about twenty years. He died in 1961.

William was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1923. He joined the Canadian Navy and served on HMCS Chippawa, Malaspena and Chignecto in Canada and on the high seas during WWII. William has been a member of Souris Legion Branch 60 for more than thirteen years.

DIXON, Thomas D. "Tom"




Tom was born in 1911 in Souris, Manitoba. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in North Bay, Ontario on November 11, 1940 and trained as an air gunner in Brandon, MB and Fort MacLeod, AB. In December 1942, he went overseas where he made several flights over Germany from England as a mid-upper gunner on a Sterling plane. One night, he was shot down and had trouble getting his seatbelt undone. He finally freed himself, climbed down and put on his parachute. Unfortunately, he parachuted into a tree, was caught and was a POW for two years until war's end. Tom was discharged in Winnipeg on September 25, 1945. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, the Air Crew Europe Star, the POW badge, and the Caterpillar Pin (issued by the Irvin Company, parachute manufacturer) for successfully using a parachute to bail out of a disabled aircraft. Tom, a 60-year Legion Pin recipient, was a member of Souris Legion Branch 60 for sixty-two years before he died on September 30, 2007 in Thunder Bay, Ontario.

DOAK, Gordon R.

WWII

Gordon was born in 1919 in Gilbert Plains, Manitoba. He joined the Army in 1942 and served with the Winnipeg Light Infantry, played brass in the Winnipeg Grenadiers Band, and served with the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders in the Aleutian Islands and in Holland and Germany. He was honourably discharged in 1946. Gordon was awarded the 1939-45 Star, the France and Germany Star, the Defence Medal, the War Medal 1939-45, and the Holland Liberation Medal. He raised four children with Pearl, his wife of 60 years. Gordon was a member of Snow Lake Legion Branch 241 for more than fifty years before he passed away on July 9, 2003.

DONALDSON, Winston "Gale"

WWII

Gale was born in Saskatchewan in 1922. He entered basic training in Port Arthur in 1942 and served in New Brunswick and British Columbia with the Lanark and Scottish Renfrew Winnipeg Light Infantry. Whenever Gale talked to the family about his military service, he seemed to stress the negative aspects and to downplay his part. He finished his service, discharged because of health problems, after seeing much of Canada. Gale greatly admired those who served overseas but seemed to feel that his was not a very important part of the war effort. Years later, when involved with DVA, he received his military records. Not long before Gale died in 2009, those records were checked and it was quite amazing to see the content and the excellent remarks about his work. When he heard what had been written and the comment "Good Soldier", it seemed to change his way of thinking about the way that he had done his duty.

DOOLEY, Joe WWI

Joe was born in 1895 in Hartney, Manitoba. He joined the Army and served with the 222nd Battalion, posted to the 19th Reserve in France, 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles, 3rd Canadian Division. He fought at Hill 70, Passchendaele, Amiens, Arras, Monchy-le-Preux, and Bourlon Wood. He was wounded at Cambrai in 1918 and hospitalized at Boulogne. Joe was a Life Member of Hartney Legion Branch 26 before he died in 1985.



DRYDEN, Andrew Clayton "Andy"

WWII


Andrew was born in Domain, Manitoba on October 6, 1915 and raised on the family farm. On November 24, 1937, he married Dora Magarrell and they lived in Huntsville, ON, where he worked in forestry and as a service station attendant. Andrew completed the Dominion Provincial War Emergency Training Program, specializing in machine shop, then worked at the Westinghouse Ammunition Factory in Hamilton until he joined the Royal Canadian Navy in August 1943 as a stoker. He trained and served on many corvettes, including the Star, Cornwallis, Rimouski, Stadacona, Shelburne, Proctor, Acadia, and Lanark on the Atlantic Ocean and on Russian seas, with port stops in England, Scotland and Bermuda. Discharged in 1945, the family moved back to Domain, where Andrew farmed and became a highly-skilled carpentry craftsman. He was very involved in the community and was a member of Domain Legion Branch 208 for twenty years. Andrew died on January 8, 1967.

ELLERINGTON, Thomas C.

KOREA

Thomas was born in Miniota, Manitoba in 1936. He enlisted in the Army and served in Canada with the 12th Manitoba Dragoons. He has been a member of Miniota Legion Branch 66 for over thirty-four years.

ENNS, Abraham Abram "Abe"

WWII

Abe was born in Tiegenhagen, Ukraine on June 10, 1919 and he immigrated with his family to a farm in LaSalle, MB when he was five years old. In January 1940, he joined the Canadian Army and then transferred to the Royal Canadian Air Force, where he trained as an Aero engine mechanic and air framer at Brandon and Rivers, MB and in St. Thomas, ON. As part of Squadrons 426 and 432, he served in England and France for two and a half years on the "wimpy" Halifax and Lancaster bombers. Abe was promoted from AC1 to LAC to Shadow CPL A Group, and discharged in October 1945. He married Emma Magarrell on June 5, 1946, farmed in Domain, Manitoba, and raised five children. He supplemented their farm income by custom combining in Canada and the U.S. and installing and repairing furnaces. He was also highly regarded as a mentor and hockey coach. Abe was a member of Domain Legion Branch 208 for fifty-one years before he died on April 28, 1998.



ERICKSON, Gilbert

Gilbert was born on December 11, 1919. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1941 and served in Brandon and Winnipeg, Manitoba and was a member of the RCAF Band until 1945. Gilbert died on February 16, 1985.

Raymond was born in Kenora, Ontario in 1923. He joined the Canadian Army and served in Italy during WWII. Raymond passed away in 1989.

W. R. Fenton joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg in April 1941 and was discharged there in October 1945. Corporal Fenton served in England, France, Holland, Belgium, and Germany and received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the France and Germany Star. FERGUSON, Gordon A.

WWII

Gordon was born in Angusville, Manitoba in 1915. He enlisted in the Canadian Army in Winnipeg in October 1940 and served as a Gunner with the 1st LAA and Provost in England, Sicily, Italy, France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany. He fought on the front lines at the Battles of Sangro River, Ortona, Pontecorvo, Melfa River, Liri Valley, Cassino, Rimini, Ravenna, Forli, and Faenza. He also raided on the Mediterranean near Algiers, spent 21 days in hospital at Ravenna, and met Eleanor Staples whom he knew from Angusville, who was nursing there. Gordon also survived the Blitz of London and the Blitz of Glasgow. He was discharged in Winnipeg in November 1945. Gordon was awarded the 1939-45 Star, the Defence of England Medal, the Italy Star, and the France and Germany Star. He was a member of Russell Legion Branch 159 before he died in 1984.



FIELDS, Lance E. R.

WWII

Lance was born in Alexander, Manitoba in 1917. He joined the Army in 1940 and became a member of the Royal Winnipeg Rifles (Little Black Devils). He trained at Shilo, MB, Dubuque, ON and England. He went into action on D-Day at Normandy and fought in France, Holland, and Germany. Some of the battles he took part in were at Caen, Carpiquet, Bourguebus Ridge, Falaise, and Moyland Woods. He received many service medals, including the Carpiquet Memorial. Lance was severely burnt on April 18, 1945 and spent many months in hospitals in England and Canada, suffering through numerous reconstructive surgeries. Lance was a member of Souris Legion Branch 60 for fifty years before he passed away on May 29, 2009. He is buried in the Alexander Cemetery in Souris.

FINLAY, Milton Roy

WWII

Milton was born on April 2, 1919, twelve miles south of Deloraine, Manitoba. During WWII, he failed two medicals before being accepted in the Army in 1942. He trained at Portage la Prairie and Brandon, Manitoba, Terrace and Prince Rupert, British Columbia, as well as in Ontario. Milton went to Canterbury, England with the 2nd Division Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders early in 1943. He landed in France in July 1944 and went through Caen, Falaise, Antwerp and Nijmegen. Wounded between Nijmegen and Arnhem in 1945, he was in hospital on VE Day. After Sergeant Finlay's discharge in February 1946, he first farmed at Goodlands, Manitoba until 1968 then at Souris, Manitoba from 1969-2008. He married in November 1946 and was father to five children. Widowed in 2008, Milton now resides in Boissevain, Manitoba. Milton has been a member of Waskada, Goodlands and Souris Legion Branches for over sixty-three years.



FORBES, Kathleen L.

SPECIAL DUTY AREA

Kathleen was born in Ochre River, Manitoba in 1932. She joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on June 1, 1951 in Brandon, then completed her basic training at Manning Depot in Quebec. She continued training at various schools, including the 1 Radio & Communications School in Clinton, Ontario to become a teletype operator. FORD, Stanley H.





FOSTER, James L.


WWI

Trench life was severe and he was sent to the United Kingdom to convalesce for health reasons. Entertainment groups had formed and they visited service camps, especially hospitals and rest camps. He was attracted to one of the entertainers and decided to take Gladys Mary Bartottback back with him to Portage la Prairie. At the onset of WWII, their two sons, David and Fawcett, enlisted, as well as his wife, Gladys. Vernon became a Sergeant on the Veterans Guard and served in Canada. He was a member of Portage la Prairie Legion Branch 65 for sixty years before he died in 1977.



GARRIOCH (nee BARTOTTBACK), Gladys Mary W.


WWII

She served on HMCS Stadacona. Gladys was a Charter Member of the Women's Auxiliary but this later changed to Portage la Prairie Legion Branch 65. She died in 1987.


HAMELIN, Phillip J.



HODGKINS, Charles



KOWALCHUK, Eugene





Jeanne was born in 1920 in Cartwright, Manitoba. She joined the Canadian Women's Auxiliary Air Force in January 1942, took her basic training in Toronto, then went to the #4 Wireless School in Guelph before being posted to Ontario's Rockcliff Air Force Base with #4 Squadron, B Flight. In December 1942, her group went overseas, landing in Liverpool then to Bournemouth and finally, was posted to Linton-on-Ouse. Many months later, she was posted to London, which was being bombed by the Germans at that time. She served there until she returned to Canada on December 18, 1945. In 1946, she married Dougald MacDonald, a fighter pilot in the Royal Canadian Air Force. Widowed in 1958, Jeanne was left to raise their four young children. Now in her 90s, she is living in the personal care home at The Pas. Jeanne has been a member of The Pas Legion Branch 19 for more than twenty-eight years.

WWI

Edward was born in 1899 in Shellmouth, Manitoba. He enlisted in the 251st 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles in Winnipeg in June 1917 and was discharged there in 1919. Private Langford served in England and France and received a Service Medal. A member of Russell Legion Branch 159, Edward died in 1956.

LANGTON, Elmer Lyle Wentworth "Wenty"

WWII

Wenty was born on July 26, 1910 in Morris, Manitoba. Life was hard during his early years and he searched for any work he could get, sometimes skipping school in order to work. On September 1, 1934, he married Jessie Gordon and they had two children. He worked at many jobs, including that of a labourer in a coal yard. Wenty volunteered four times before being accepted by the Winnipeg Light Infantry on May 27, 1942. He was posted to the 1st Division Support Battalion, Saskatoon Light Infantry and served in England, Sicily, then in Italy up to the Moro River, where he was badly wounded in Ortona, Italy on December 9, 1943. He succumbed to his wounds on December 13 and is buried in the Moro River Canadian War Cemetery, Plot 10, Row F, Grave 6. At the age of 33, he is one of the oldest soldiers buried in the cemetery. Each year on November 11, his son Wayne honours his father by sending a wreath through the Commonwealth Graves Commission.



LAPORTE, Christian Louis "Chris"

wwii

Chris was born on April 14, 1923 in Summerset, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force on January 26, 1943 and was posted to Brandon, Manitoba until March. Later, as a ground crew member for the #2 Construction and Maintenance Unit, he assisted with various construction developments, such as hangars and airfields throughout Canada. He was involved in the building of the "Flying on the Beam" program, which guided American planes from California to Alaska. Chris was assigned to serve in various Manitoba projects such as the #5 AOS in Winnipeg. In Manitoba, he was posted to Brandon, Dauphin, Carberry, Souris, and Virden. In Alberta, he served in Calgary, Airdrie, High River, Grande Prairie, and Vulcan and also served in the Yukon at Whitehorse and Watson Lake. Honourably discharged on October 22, 1945, Leading Aircraftman Laporte was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the War Medal 1939-45. He has been a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 for forty-eight years.

LAROCQUE, Alexander

Alexander enlisted in the Royal Winnipeg Rifles in September 1942 in Winnipeg and served as a Corporal in France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany during WWII. He was discharged in March 1946 in Winnipeg and was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, 1939-45 Star, War Medal 1939-45, France and Germany Star, and the Defence Medal. 




















LELOND, Wilfrid Fleming










WWII

Harold was born in Souris, Manitoba in 1922. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg in 1940 and was sent to #2 Manning Depot in Brandon, Manitoba for basic training. From there, he was stationed at the Brandon Training School, then was sent to Vancouver and Calgary for wireless training. After a bad case of sinusitis, he was grounded from flying. He worked as a clerk stenographer in Toronto, then shipped to Souris' Air Force Base. His next transfer was to Suffield, Alberta, where he was under strict orders to never divulge information about his job. Experiments on biological and chemical defence run by scientists from all allied countries were carried out at this base. Harold spent eight months at Suffield and was discharged in 1945. Articles were later written about Suffield and the experiments carried out there, as well as stories about the men who suffered from medical problems in later years. Harold married Aileen Lovatt of Souris and has been a member of Souris Legion Branch 60 for more than fifty-seven years.

LOVELOCK, Dennis W. "Denny"

WWII

Denny was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1923. He joined the Army in August 1940 and served with the Lord Strathcona Horse (Royal Canadians) in Canada, England, Italy, and Northwest Europe during WWII. Denny was Mentioned in Dispatches. He died in 1982.


LYNCH, Wilbur Howard

His trades were in motor mechanics and radio but he also served as a Battalion Orderly Room Runner. From January 1943, he served in England, Africa, and on Italy's front lines. On October 19, 1944, while running and carrying heavy radio equipment at the Savio River near Rimini, Dave was shot in both thighs. He underwent surgery and was hospitalized in southern Italy, where he recovered over the next few months. Discharged early in 1945, he returned to Souris. McDOWALL, Herbert Maxwell "Herb" WWII & PEACETIME



Glen was born in 1920 in Sinclair, Manitoba. On May 26, 1941, he enlisted in the 70th Field Battery, 16th Field Regiment and trained in Shilo, MB, Debert, NS, Long Branch, ON, and Sussex, NB. He also did guard duty in Arvida, QC. Due to his previous training as a non-permanent soldier, he became an N. C. O. Glen sailed for England on August 8, 1942 and went directly to Colchester. He then moved around the south of England doing guard duty and providing air support at various HQs and in London. After three months in Wales on a War Gunnery course, he demonstrated gun drills for the British Army at Clacton-on-Sea, where he was seconded to the British Army for 10 months as an instructor. 








Colin was born north of Cartwright, Manitoba in 1910. He enlisted on October 21, 1941 in Winnipeg, where he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force. He was the second person chosen to be a pilot but after his medical, discovered he was colour blind. Corporal Mowbray was stationed in St. Thomas, Ontario, where he was part of the Technical Training Services Unit and taught air force mechanics. Following his discharge in May 1945, Colin worked as a mechanic and farmed north of Cartwright. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the War Medal 1939-45. He was a member of the Cartwright-Mather Legion Branch 86 for forty-seven years and was a Past President. He died in Cartwright in November 1991.

MOWBRAY, Robert

WWII

Robert was born in 1911 in the North Derby district north of Cartwright, Manitoba. He attended school at North Derby and continued his high school at Cartwright. Robert joined the Royal Canadian Army in 1942 and was posted at Davidson, Saskatchewan and Lethbridge, Alberta during World War II. After the war, he returned to the family farm north of Cartwright with his wife Mary and their two children and he continued to farm there until his death in 1983. Robert was a member of Cartwright-Mather Legion Branch 86 for thirty-seven years.



MUIR, William Leslie

William was born on December 20, 1904. He joined the 37th Field Battery of the 17th Field Regiment, Royal Canadian Army, 5th Canadian Armoured Division on August 2, 1940. 


Elmer Earl

WWI





NELSON, Benjamin R. "Ben"


WWII

Herbert served in Canada, England, France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany with the 1st Canadian Army, 66th Field Battery, 14th Field Regiment (SP), 3rd Division and was discharged in Winnipeg at the end of 1945. He then worked at odd jobs until he was hired on with C.N.R., where he had a lengthy career as an engineer until he retired in 1978. 

NEWSHAM, Richard C.

WWI & WWII

Richard was born in 1892 in Birtle, Manitoba. He enlisted on July 15, 1915 and served as a marksman with the 78th Battalion, Winnipeg Grenadiers in England, and in France at Vimy Ridge and Passchendaele. Private Newsham received the British War Medal and the Victory Medal. Discharged on June 12, 1919, he married Evelyn Robbie on November 1, 1922 and they raised three children. Richard farmed until he joined the RCAF on April 29, 1941, and served in Canada with Service Police. He was stationed at MacDonald and Rivers, MB and Penhold, AB, and helped close Stevenson Air Force Base in Winnipeg. Honourably discharged on November 29, 1946 in Lachine, QC, Corporal Newsham received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the War Medal 1939-45. He became a private detective. Richard, a member of Birtle Legion Branch 152 for twenty-nine years, died on July 2, 1968. Evelyn received the Silver Cross in "appreciation of the sacrifice she had made". After posting to Woodstock for driver training, he returned to Calgary, where he became a Group "C" operator on a Bren gun carrier. Elwood was home on leave when VE Day occurred on May 8. Back in Calgary, he volunteered for the Canadian Army Pacific Force, received the Pacific Force Patch, and was sent to Vernon, BC for formation. August 15, VJ Day, resulted in the disbandment of his unit. Trooper Nicholson returned to Regina to be honourably discharged in October 1945. He was awarded the War Medal 1939-45 and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. He has been a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 for over eighteen years.

NURSE, Cecil G. N. F

Cecil was born in Wapella, SK in 1914. He joined the Army on May 14, 1939 and served with the Royal Canadian Engineers in the UK, Continental Europe, and France. While there, he was transporting ammunition to the Front when a number

of lorries were set on fire. He stopped his truck, jumped into a truck full of explosives and drove through the fire and over a bridge to safety, saving his own lorry and undoubtedly the lives of many soldiers and civilians. In December 1945, the French General, Charles de Gaulle, presented him with France's highest award for valour, the "Croix de Guerre - Étoile de Bronze", in recognition of gallant and distinguished service in the cause of the Allies. He also received the 1939-1945 Star, the France and Germany Star and the Defence Medal. Cecil was a Life Member of Longlac Legion Branch 213 for twenty-five years and he passed away in 1984.

OLIVER, Bert WWII

Bert was born on October 29, 1918 at Clifton-upon-Teme in Worcester, England. He enlisted in Fort Frances, Ontario on July 30, 1940 and trained at Shilo, Petawawa, and at Aldershot, England and in South Wales. He was a Gunner, then a Bombardier with the 5th Armoured Division, 17th Field Regiment of the Royal Canadian Artillery. In November 1943, he was shipped to Italy and was involved in heavy battles around Cassino and Ortona, then went to France, Belgium, and Holland for the liberation of that country in 1945. In October of that year, he was back in Wales, where he married Pamela Parsons. He was discharged in Canada in April 1946 and Pamela immigrated later that year as a war bride. He received the 1939-45 Star, France and Germany Star, Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp, and the 55th Anniversary Liberation of Holland Medal on July 17, 2002. Bert was a member of Fort Frances Legion Branch 29 for sixty-five years before he died on May 25, 2010.

OTTO, Albert Alfred


WWII & PEACETIME

Albert left the service in 1973 and retired with Evelyn to Brandon and then to Gladstone. After Evelyn died in 1997, he moved to Spruce Grove, Alberta to be near his son Paul. WWII

Oscar was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1911. He joined the Army during WWII and served in the Service Corps in Normandy, France and in Northwest Europe. He was awarded the British Empire Service Medal. After the war, Oscar returned to Gladstone and farmed with his father and brothers. In 1946, he married Margaret (Madge) Townsend with whom he had a son. Oscar and Madge farmed for one and one half years with her parents in Melita and then they returned to Gladstone. In 1953, Oscar was stricken with Polio and he spent the next two years in Winnipeg receiving treatment. Once back in Gladstone, Oscar couldn't farm, so he and Madge built a house in town and he started an accounting and insurance business. Oscar was very community-minded and he served on many Boards in town. He was a Life Member and Past President of Gladstone Legion Branch 110 before he died in Gladstone, Manitoba in 1988.

He died on March 12, 1997.

PASHE, Michael WWII

Michael was born at the Old Sioux Village on December 28, 1925 in Portage la Prairie, Manitoba. He was a residential school survivor. Michael joined the Royal Winnipeg Rifles and served from July 19, 1944 to May 4, 1946 in Canada, the United Kingdom, France and Germany during WWII. Michael was awarded the France and Germany Star, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp, and the War Medal 1939-45. He married Elsie Paul and they raised nine children. Michael, Chief of Dakota Tipi in the early 1980s, was greatly respected as an Elder in his community, leaving a legacy of courage, dedication and knowledge that he dedicated to his country and his people. Michael died in 2004.

PASTUCK, Nicholson "Nick"

WWII

Nick was born in a family of ten on November 19, 1918 in Rainy River, Ontario. He worked on the family farm, went to school and spoke English and Ukrainian. In June 1941 at the age of 22, he enlisted with the Royal Winnipeg Rifleman Wing in Fort Frances, Ontario. He completed his basic training there, then was transferred to the Winnipeg Grenadiers, 1st Battalion, "C" Force Division. He sailed from Vancouver, British Columbia and arrived in Hong Kong on November 16, 1941 and on to battle. Hong Kong surrendered at Christmas. Private Pastuck became a POW and he died of Diphtheria on September 26, 1942 at age 23. He was buried in Sai Wan Military Hospital Cemetery, Grave 2, Row E, Plot 8 Hong Kong. Nick received four medals posthumously, which went to his father, Anthony. His Memorial Cross went to his mother, Dora.

PATTERSON, David V.

wwi

David was born in Burridge, Ontario in 1893. He enlisted in the Army on December 26, 1915 in Souris, Manitoba and trained at Camp Hughes. He first served as a Private with the 226th Battalion, then with the 16th Battalion Canadian Scottish in France, where he was wounded on August 18, 1917 at Hill 70. He convalesced at Bearwood, England, was invalidated to Canada on March 11, 1918 and was then discharged a few months later on June 14. He returned to Manitoba, where he got married, farmed and raised 12 children. David was a member of Gladstone Legion Branch 110 for forty-six years. He died in 1985.



PHILLIPS, Sidney Hugh "Sid"

WWII

Sid was born in October 1914 on the family farm in Findlay, Manitoba. He enlisted in Winnipeg on March 19, 1943 and served with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry in Shilo, Manitoba. Sid was one of six sons of Matthew and Bertha Phillips to serve in WWII, and all returned safely. After serving in Canada, Sid was discharged on June 5, 1944 on a hardship leave to come home and run the family farm due to the illness and subsequent death of his father in July 1944. Sid married Joan Duncan in November 1947 and raised a family of three sons on the family farm. Sid and Joan retired to Souris in November 1978 and he passed away there in December 1997. He was a member of Souris Legion Branch 60 for fifty years.

PHIN, Charles A.

WWI

Charles was born in Moosomin, Saskatchewan in 1893. He joined the Canadian Army and served in England and France during WWI. Charles was a member of Pilot Mound Legion Branch 62 before he died in 1952.

PITTET, G. C. WWII

G. C. Pittet enlisted in the Army in Geraldton, Ontario in November 1941 and served with the 2nd Corps of the Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers, 2 Tank Group Workshop. After serving in England, France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany, he was discharged in Winnipeg in December 1945. He has been a member of the Russell Legion Branch 159.

PLANT, Doris WWII

Doris was born in 1921 in Darlington, England. At 19, she volunteered "to do her part to win the war." She joined the Women's Auxiliary Air Force, trained in the south of England for six weeks, then worked in the offices of Bomber Command and at Station X. She posted to different positions but especially liked working with the Secret Service decoding German missives. She loved her 7-year military stint, the camaraderie and friendships, and the many wonderful memories she made. She recalls the moment she met this particularly handsome Canadian airman. They married when the war ended and she flew "across the pond" to begin a new chapter in her life. Doris was awarded the War Service Defence Medal and the Certificate of Merit. She has been a member of the Atikokan Legion Branch 145 for more than thirty-seven years.





POPPLESTONE, William "Maurice"

wwii

Maurice took his schooling in Floral, Pilot Mound and Minnedosa Collegiate, MB. He then enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and trained in Souris, Manitoba, completing his solo flight in May 1941. Flight Sergeant Popplestone joined #114 Blenheim Squadron and shipped out to England and Holland, where he was killed in action on March 26, 1942 at the age of 22. He is commemorated at Harlingen General Cemetery in Holland, and Popplestone Lake, southeast of Nueltin Lake, was named after him in 1975.

POW (nee POOLE), Annie L.

WWII

Annie was born in Kemnay, Manitoba in 1913. She joined the Royal Canadian Air Force Women's Division in Winnipeg in May 1943 and trained at Rockcliffe, Ontario before shipping off to Trenton, Ontario to train as a clerk-accountant. She was then posted to Brandon at the 12 Service Flying Training School and worked in the Headquarters building at the equipment accounts desk. She received her discharge in September 1945. In March 1946, Annie married Jack Pow, who had served with the 71st Field Battery, and they had two children. They lived and worked in Brandon, traveled extensively in Canada, Europe, and in the United States, Hawaii being one of their favourite places to visit. Annie appeared on WCG-TV which aired "Heroes and Heroines", featuring three female WWII veterans. She has been a member of Brandon Legion Branch 3 for twenty-six years and still talks about how she and Jack enjoyed attending lounge dances.







Dennis was born in Birtle, Manitoba in 1925. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served in Canada and England during World War II. With his friend Walley, Dennis started pilot training and put in approximately 165 hours flying time after which he trained as an air gunner and was commissioned. Dennis was a member of Birtle Legion Branch 55. He died in Ottawa, Ontario.

PRESTON, Allan

Allan was born in 1916 in Portage la Prairie, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Army in December 1943 and took his training in Winnipeg, Peterborough and Camp Borden, serving in Canada during WWII. He took his last test before going overseas but failed it due to loss of hearing because of the heavy artillery shooting. He was devastated, as he wanted to join his brothers overseas. The Army placed him at a convalescence hospital in Portage la Prairie, where he spent the remainder of the war working as a nurse. Allan has been a Life Member of Portage la Prairie Legion Branch 65 for over sixty-five years.



PRESTON, Charles "William"

wwii


William was born on July 20, 1923 in Portage la Prairie, Manitoba. He enlisted with the Royal Canadian Air Force on March 30, 1942 and trained in Virden before being posted to Division 158 Squadron. He was then sent to Yorkton, Saskatchewan, where he learned how to fly. In November 1942, he was posted to Lawford, Warwickshire, England and was promoted to Sergeant. He was taught map reading, pilot navigation, precision, timing, shooting and landing. William's first bombing was in April 1943 and his last on July 3, 1943, when the Halifax Bombers of #158 Squadron Royal Air Force were shot down over Loncin, Belgium. A local resident found his body and removed his dog tags on the advice of the vicar. Fifty-one years later, his sister and the last survivor of the crash visited the crash site.

PRESTON, Robert "Bob"


WWII

He enlisted in the Army on January 27, 1942 and served as a Private, firing machine guns and heavy artillery, with the 18th Reconnaissance (Manitoba) Regiment on the Front Lines in the United Kingdom, Central Mediterranean and Continental Europe. Discharged on November 30, 1945, he was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, the 1939-45 Star, the France and Germany Star, the Italy Star, the Defence Medal, the King George Medal 1939-45 and the Maple Leaf Bar. Douglas was a member of Winnipeg's St. James Legion Branch 4 and he died in 1991.

WWII




PRUDEN, Robert Curtis



WWII



ROBINSON, Gordon Clifford



ROBINSON, William Lloyd

WWII

Lloyd was born in 1903 in Westmeath Township, Beachburg, Ontario and he moved to Dauphin, Manitoba with his family when he was 13 years old. He was employed in Dauphin before he joined the Royal Winnipeg Rifles in 1940 and he served as a Sergeant in Shilo, MB, Debert, NS, and in England during WWII. After his discharge, he returned to Dauphin, where he was employed with the local dairy. In 1947, he moved his family to Surrey, British Columbia, where he was employed as a cabinet maker with West Coast Trailers Co. Gordon and his wife Mary (Cooke) raised two daughters and one son. Lloyd died of cancer in 1961 at the age of 79. He had been Past President and Life Member of Whalley Legion Branch 229.

ROSE, Douglas Milton "Doug"

wwii

Doug was born on October 2, 1919 in Gladstone, Manitoba, then his family moved to Stony Mountain. He held down several jobs before going to England in July 1939, where he lived in London and was part of the Harringay Ice Hockey Club. He joined the RAF on April 1, 1941 and came to Canada for fighter pilot training. Back in the UK, Doug transferred to Bomber Command, 207 Squadron, and flew 29 sorties over various German cities in his Lancaster Bomber. He was repatriated to the Royal Canadian Air Force on May 25, 1945 and returned to Canada two months later on July 23. He had offered to go to the Japanese war theatre but was discharged in Winnipeg. Doug became a commercial pilot and flew with Central Northern Airways and Transair, where he became Chief Pilot. He also worked for Pacific Western Airlines and Canadian Airlines before retiring at age 61. Doug, married with three children, passed away on March 12, 2003 in Winnipeg. He was a member of Stonewall Legion Branch 52.



ROSE, Norman Wallace

wwii

Norman was born in Stony Mountain, Manitoba on September 12, 1924. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1943 for pilot training but became an air gunner. He served in Canada in Edmonton, AB, Saskatoon, SK, MacDonald, MB, Valleyfield, QC, and Boundary Bay, BC before becoming a gunnery instructor at Paulson, MB. After his discharge in August 1945, Norman attended Dominion Business College and then worked in St. Boniface, Manitoba for Martin Paper Products Ltd., a company later acquired by MacMillan Bloedel of Vancouver. He transferred to Calgary as a Sales Representative and was a Sales Manager there, as well as in Winnipeg. He was also General Manager in Regina, Winnipeg, Edmonton, and New Westminster, BC. Norman and his wife of 59 years retired in South Surrey in 1984 after 37 years. He is a member of Gladstone Legion Branch 110. Norman and Marie have two daughters.

ROSS, Clayton

WWI & WWII

Clayton was born on August 8, 1898 in Arbroath, Manitoba. He worked on area farms until March 6, 1916, when he enlisted with the 183rd Battalion Canadian Infantry in Winnipeg. He arrived in Liverpool, England on October 13, 1916, transferred to 108th Battalion on November 1, and was in France on February 15, 1917 with the 16th Battalion, 48th Scottish Highlanders. Wounded, he returned to Canada on November 29, 1918 and was discharged on January 14, 1919. He was awarded the British War Medal, the Victory Medal, and the General Service Badge 4 Certificate. Clayton married in February 1928 and raised two children and a half-brother. During WWII, he enlisted on August 13, 1940 and served with #10 'A' Company, Veterans Guard at Camp "R" Borden and Red Rock. He was discharged on October 13, 1942 for medical reasons. Clayton farmed in northern Alberta in 1943, then retired to Calgary, where he died on February 21, 1984 from emphysema due to war service and mining. He was a Life Member of The Royal Canadian Legion.

ROSS, Clayton L.

WWII

Clayton was born in Portage la Prairie, MB in 1924. He served as a Signalman in the Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer Reserve from 1940 until 1945. He served on three ships, the Q063, the Sault-Ste-Marie, and the Kamsack. These ships were escorts for convoys in the North Atlantic during the Battle of the North Atlantic. The high seas, waves and ice cold were a real scary experience for a young 18-year-old prairie boy and the German U-boats also were a danger. Clayton once commented that "it was not true about a girl in every port. And they did not tell you about the waves, snow, ice, and rough seas in the North Atlantic Ocean." Clayton has been a member of Crescent Beach Legion Branch 240 for over thirty-seven years.

ROSS, Sherman L.

WWI

Sherman was born in Arbroath, Manitoba in 1894. He joined the Canadian Infantry and served in Canada, England, and France with the 19th Battalion, Manitoba Regiment, Seaforth Highlanders, and the 52nd Battalion. He was awarded the British War Medal, as well as three service medals. After he returned from WWI in 1919, Sherman worked for his father on the farm and other farms in the area around Treherne, Arbroath and Rosendal for a few years. He was later hired as an attendant at the Manitoba Mental Health Institution at Portage la Prairie, where he worked until he retired in 1957. A well known fiddle player and step dancer, he won contests in both events and also played at old time dances in the rural Portage area. Sherman moved to Winnipeg in 1965 and died there in 1975. He was a member of the Portage la Prairie Legion Branch 65.





RUSSELL, Charles A.

WWII

Charles enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg in November 1941 and he was discharged there in October 1945. He served in England with Squadrons 619 and 83, 1661 Canadian Unit. Flight Officer Russell received the Distinguished Flying Cross. He has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.

RUSSELL (nee FROLICH), Laura

WWII

Laura was born in Steinbach, Manitoba on July 24, 1914. She joined the Royal Canadian Naval Service in Saskatchewan in August 1943 and was sent to HMCS Galt Ontario. Wrens occupied 20 roles previously held by men in the Navy and were also expected to be glamorous. New recruits met with a beauty expert to ensure that they were as well turned out as possible. Laura saw a lot of Canada during the war, which kept her from worrying too much about her husband Lyle and her two brothers serving overseas. She was in Ottawa when the war ended and remembers that "the whole town was hooting and hollering." She received the Defence Medal, the Service Medal and the Jubilee Medal. Laura raised her three children, coached boys' and girls' hockey, and served over 60 years for The Legion's Ladies Auxiliary. She has been a Life Member of Atikokan Legion Branch 145 for over sixty-five years.

SADLER, Lyman W.

WWII

Lyman enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in May 1941 in Calgary and served as a Leading Aircraftman with 435 Squadron in the United Kingdom, India, and Burma. He was discharged in Winnipeg in November 1945. Lyman was a member of Russell Legion Branch 159 before he passed away in 2000.

SAFRUIK, William "Bill"

WWII

Bill was born in Piney, Manitoba on September 4, 1918. He "rode-the-rails" to Fort William/Port Arthur in the early days of WWII. Unable to find employment and to avoid unwanted bush-work, he joined the Forces on November 27, 1941. After basic training in Port Arthur, embarkation took Bill to northern Scotland with the Canadian Forestry Corps. Unknowingly, he had enlisted into a unit that would see him doing the same work he had joined to free himself from. Bill met and married Elizabeth Ann Moodie in Glasgow, Scotland and he preceded his bride to Canada to prepare their future. Private Safruik was discharged on September 12, 1945 prior to taking work in Pine Falls, where he then lived with his wife, and raised a son. Bill has been a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 for over sixty-four years and now lives in Pineview Lodge in Pine Falls, where he readily talks about the past. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp, the War Medal 1939-45, and the Defence Medal.



SALAVICH, Frank

wwii

Frank was born in Teulon, Manitoba in 1925. He enlisted in the Argyle and Sutherland Highlanders of Canada in October 1943 and served in Canada, England, and Continental Europe. He was wounded in Germany and spent time in hospitals in Belgium and Winnipeg. Frank was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, the 1939-45 Star, George VI Medal, France and Germany Star, and the Defence Medal. He was discharged in January 1946. Frank has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159 for over forty-seven years.

SCAIFE, Albert L.

WWI

Albert was born in 1882 in England. He came to Canada in 1911 and his family followed a year later. He joined the Winnipeg Rifles and fought at Vimy and Ypres, where he was taken prisoner, spending the remainder of the war working in a coal mine near Essen, Germany. Albert believed he and his POW pals would have starved but for the Red Cross parcels they received. He came home in late 1919. The Scaife family arrived in Mather, Manitoba from Mowbray in 1932 to work on the CPR. Later, Albert was custodian of the school and groundskeeper at the Mather Cemetery. He was a Charter Member of the newly-formed Cartwright-Mather Legion Branch 86, received his 25-year Pin and Lifetime membership card, and was a member for forty-one years. In 1936, he and his wife returned to France to see the unveiling of the Vimy Memorial. Two of his sons, Chester and George, were killed in World War II. Albert died in 1971.

SCAIFE, George A.

WWII

George was born in Yorkshire, England and immigrated to Canada in April 1912. His father had come to Canada a year earlier, settling in Gladstone. George was raised in southern Manitoba and as a young man, worked on local farms and then with the CPR. His other interests were limited as times were tough in the "dirty thirties" but he enjoyed baseball and going to local dances. His father and brother had both served with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles, but his father didn't want both of his sons to serve in the same regiment. Private Scaife was declared officially missing after the Dieppe Raid and pronounced dead on August 19, 1942 at the age of 31. His brother Chester also died in WWII. George is commemorated at Bergen General Cemetery in Holland. Scaife Island (64 N/15) in Putahow Lake was named after him in 1995.

SCAIFE, Lawrence "Chester"

WWII

Chester was born in Yorkshire, England and immigrated to Canada in April 1912. His father had come to Canada a year earlier, settling in Gladstone. Chester was raised in southern Manitoba and he enjoyed skating, baseball and attending local dances. He worked on neighbouring farms until June 1940 when he enlisted. He trained at Shilo, Manitoba and in Truro, Nova Scotia and then was sent overseas to Aldershot, England in 1941. Chester served with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles, the unit his father has served in during WWI. He took part in the invasion of Normandy and died on June 6, 1944 at the age of 27. Corporal Scaife is commemorated at Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery in Calvados, France. His brother George also died in WWII.





SCHINDEL, Clarence L. R.

SPECIAL DUTY AREA



He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, the Victory Medal and the ETO Medal. He was discharged in May 1946. Gustave was a member of Russell Legion Branch 159 and is now deceased.



He farmed in the same area before he joined the Army's Royal Winnipeg Rifles Division, #10 District Infantry Corps to serve in Canada, England and Europe during WWII. In recognition of his service, Richard received the France and Germany Star. After his discharge, he farmed in the rural Dauphin area. He and his wife Jean (Smith) raised two sons. Richard died in 1999.

SHACKLEFORD, Dennis W.

WWII

Dennis was born in Arden, Manitoba in 1925. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Navy and served in Outremont and Victoriaville, Quebec in the Western Atlantic (Triangle Run). Dennis has been a member of Selkirk Legion Branch 42 for more than nineteen years.



SHANNON, Robert J.

WWII

Robert was born in Indus, Minnesota in 1925. He joined the Canadian Army and served with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles in Canada, England, Europe, and Holland. Robert has been a Life Member of Atikokan Legion Branch 145 for over sixty-two years.

SHARPE, George E.

WWII

George was born in Carman, Manitoba in 1920. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and took his basic training at Rivers, Manitoba. He was later stationed at the terminal docks in Vancouver and afterwards, reposted to Patricia Bay on Vancouver Island. In England, he was stationed at the Canadian Base at Skipton-on-Swale with Squadron 410. During the winter months, George, a capable hockey player, entertained with the likes of Turk Broda and Sid Able at different hockey events. They competed amongst the very few teams available in England and Scotland during those hard times. He was repatriated back to Canada and volunteered for the war in Japan with his brother Bill. They were stationed in Yarmouth, Nova Scotia but the war ended before he was deployed to the Pacific conflict. George served from November 1941 until his discharge in September 1945. He was a Life Member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 for forty-three years before he died in 1988.

SHARPE, Gerald S. "Gerry"

WWII

Gerry was born on June 26, 1925 in Winnipeg, Manitoba. When he was an infant, the family moved to Pine Falls, where his father worked in the newly constructed paper mill. In May of 1943, he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Navy. After basic training, he was shipped out to serve in the North Atlantic Triangle Run on HMS Montgomery and HMCS Border Cities, protecting the shipping lanes of northern waters. After serving in Canada, England, and on the High Seas, he was discharged in October 1945. A second move to the United States in 1954 to work in a paper mill there became permanent. He has been a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 for over nine years.

SHARPE, William A. "Bill"

WWII

Bill was born in 1922 in Carman, Manitoba and enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in December 1941. After basic training, he served as a machinist on various air force bases across Canada, including the base at McDonald, MB, Estevan, SK, and in BC at Cole Harbour and Jericho Beach. In April 1944, Bill was transferred to the Canadian Bomber Group at the Royal Canadian Air Force base at Middleton-St. George, Durham, England. While on furlough, Bill served as best man at his friend Clayton Farmer's marriage to Margaret Bulmer. Clayton was from Pine Falls and had served with Bill at the McDonald air base. Bill was repatriated to Canada in June 1945 and later volunteered with his brother George for the Japanese War. They were posted to Yarmouth, Nova Scotia but the war ended before they could be deployed to the Pacific theatre. Bill has been a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 for more than sixty-four years.



SHAW, James C. "Jim"

wwii

Jim was born in 1915 in Gainsborough, Saskatchewan. He joined the Army in 1940 and served with the #1 Motor Ambulance Convoy, which was attached to the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps stationed in Winnipeg and Camp Shilo. Early in 1941, they left for England, where they were billeted for several years. After D-Day, the unit left for France. The #1 Motor Ambulance Convoy was among the first to land in the city of Catania, Sicily, but before leaving for Italy, they climbed and crawled up Mount Vesuvius. After Italy, Jim returned to England, where he joined the British Imperials at Aldershot and got his commission. He then served in France and Belgium until the end of the war. After France, his unit moved on to Nijmegen in Holland, where they remained until the end of October 1945. Jim returned home, got married, and raised a family on a dairy farm in Argyle, Manitoba. Jim belonged to Brant-Argyle Legion Branch 222 for thirty-seven years until he passed away in 1995.

SHEWFELT, Matthew Andrew "Andy"

WWII

Andy was born in Kingsley, MB in 1914. He joined the First Canadian Division, Third Medium Field Artillery during WWII and trained in Canada. He went to England by boat and served in Europe as a forward observer for the artillery. He was later recruited to serve out of uniform under General Montgomery in North Africa, and followed that by serving in uniform when they went to Italy. Andy was a member of Pilot Mound Legion Branch 62 before he passed away in 1996.



Elven was born in 1912 in Pilot Mound, Manitoba. He joined the Governor General's Foot Guard and was sent to England, where he married Janet Goodchild of Ramsgate, Kent. His wife was pregnant when he was killed in France on August 29, 1944. Their son was named Elven. Guardsman Sims is commemorated at Bretteville-sur-Laize Canadian War Cemetery in Calvados, France, and Sims Lake, southeast of Lac Brochet in Manitoba, is named after him.

SLASHINSKY, Metro

WWII

Metro was born on November 11, 1920 in Sandy Lake, Manitoba. He had a basic Grade 8 education and quit school to help his father in agriculture. Metro joined the Canadian Army in 1940 and served as a Gunner in Newfoundland. Due to an injury while in service, he was discharged in 1945. Metro married Mary Buhay that same year and they raised three children. He was very involved in his community, volunteering in several organizations, including the school board, church, fire department, curling club, and Meals on Wheels. He was a dedicated member of Sandy Lake Legion Branch 184 for fifty-five years, never missing a Remembrance Day service. His involvement gained him a Life Membership and a Certificate of Merit. Metro passed away in 2001 and is buried in the Sandy Lake Cemetery.





SMELLIE, Albert George

Albert was born in Binscarth, Manitoba in 1892. He enlisted in Russell in December 1914 and was discharged in Winnipeg in May 1919. He served as a Captain in the Royal Winnipeg Rifles, 32nd and 8th Battalions and the 18th Res. Battalion in England and France. Albert received the 1914-15 Star and the M.C. He was a member of Russell Legion Branch 159 before he passed away in 1974.

SMELLIE, Peter

WWII

Peter was born in Sifton, Manitoba in 1917. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy and served on HMCS Sherbrooke and HMCS Rivière-du-Loup on the High Seas during WWII. Peter died in 1988.

SMERECHYNSKI, Nick

WWII

Nick was born in 1924 in Medika, Manitoba. He enlisted in Winnipeg with the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry and trained at Fort William and Shilo before being sent to England and Avellino, Italy, where he finished training. He was on the front lines in France and Germany, then went to Belgium and Holland, where he stayed until the war ended. He signed up to fight in the Pacific but bombs were dropped on Japan shortly after and the war ended for good. After his discharge, Nick worked in the mining industry and was postmaster in Elma for 20 years. Nick and his wife Mary are enjoying life in Whitemouth. He has been a member of Lac du Bonnet and Beauséjour Legion Branches for 10 and 30 years, respectively. Nick was awarded the France and Germany Star, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, the Star of Italy, the War Medal 1939-45, the King Gorge VI, the Volunteer Star 1945 and the Star Clasp.





STABBACK, Charles Thomas

wwi

Charles was born in Woodville, Ontario on April 3, 1885. He was a 31-year old lumberman living in The Pas, Manitoba when he enlisted on August 3, 1916 in the Canadian Expeditionary Forces. He served for three years with the 45th Regiment Militia.

STAMM, Charles A.

WWI

Charles was born in Thorold, Ontario on November 17, 1880. He was a farmer who was already 35 years old and married with one son when he enlisted with the 107th Overseas Battalion of the Canadian Expeditionary Forces on February 1, 1916. He sailed from Halifax on SS Olympic on September 18, 1916 and arrived at Liverpool a week later. He disembarked at Boulogne, France on February 20, 1917. Private Stamm served only in France throughout the war. He received the Victory Medal and the British War Medal and was honourably discharged on May 8, 1918, returning home to his wife in Eriksdale, Manitoba. He continued farming and raised six more children and adopted two. Charles passed away in Carman on December 7, 1957 and is interred in Carman.

STAMM, George A.

WWII

George was born in Eriksdale, Manitoba in 1921. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served with Fort Garry Horse in England, France, Normandy, and Holland during World War II. He was a member of Selkirk Legion Branch 42. George passed away in 1993.

STAMM, Roy D. WWII

Roy was born in Eriksdale, Manitoba in 1925. He farmed with his parents, Charles (a WWI veteran) and Agnes, until he enlisted with the Canadian Infantry Corps on October 14, 1943 in Winnipeg, Manitoba. He left for overseas on October 5, 1944, disembarked in the United Kingdom on the 12th and was in northwest Europe on November 11. Roy was killed in action on February 16, 1945 while serving with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles in Europe during the Victory Campaign. His remains were interred in Germany and later re-interred at Groesbeek Canadian War Cemetery in Holland. Roy was awarded the 1939-45 Star, the France and Germany Star, the War Medal 1939-45, and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp. Stamm Lake (52L/11), east of Cole Lake, was named after him in 1982.



STEELE, A. B.

wwii

A. B. Steele enlisted in Winnipeg in December 1940 and was discharged there in October 1945. He served as a Bandsman in Canada at A3 Canadian Artillery Training Centre during WWII. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal. He has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.

STEPHENSON, Marshall F. "Mart"

WWII

Mart was born in Souris, Manitoba in 1918. He enlisted on February 10, 1942 and did his basic training in Portage la Prairie and Red Deer, Alberta. After going overseas to England on January 4, 1944, Lance Corporal Stephenson was sent to Italy on March 3, and to the second front on June 6, serving in France, Holland, and Germany. He spent two years overseas teaching driving to the recruits and serving in the Governor General's Foot Guard before his discharge on February 21, 1946. Mart was a member of Souris Legion Branch 60 for fifty-three years before he passed away in Souris on June 28, 2008 at the age of 90.



Eric was a member of Snow Lake Legion Branch 241 before he passed away on March 19, 1985. He is buried in the Brookside Cemetery in Winnipeg.



George was born in 1925 in Miniota, Manitoba. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served in England as a tail gunner on a Lancaster with Squadron 645. George was recognized in the 2005 History Channel film "Bomber Boys", with his squadron. He died in 1989.

STRACHAN, Leonard E. "Len"

WWII

Len was born in Devlin, Ontario in 1918. He joined the Royal Canadian Artillery and served as a Gunner in the United Kingdom and Continental Europe during WWII. He was awarded the France and Germany Star, the 1939-45 Star, and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp. Len was a member of Emo Legion Branch 99 from 1962-65 and member of a Manitoba branch from 1965-85, for a total of 23 years. He was also certified as having served from 1939-45 by the people of the Municipality of La Vallée, Ontario. Len passed away in 1985.



STRATH, George Fraser "Geordie"

He served in the 5th Brigade and workshop of the Royal Canadian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers in England, France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany. After his discharge in January 1946, he worked at a variety of jobs until he joined the repair department of the C.P.R. in Carman Section, a department that closed a few years later. Geordie moved to Winnipeg, then used his V.L.A. credits to buy a half section of 18-8-20. In 1947, he married Doreen Moore, a nurse, and they had two girls. He sold the farm after several years of farming, started a carpentry business, but had to retire early due to poor health. He spent much of his time helping raise money for charity with Legion and B.P.O. Elks. Geordie was a member of Souris Legion Branch 60 for forty years before he died in Souris Hospital on October 3, 1988. He is buried in Souris in the Glenwood Cemetery.

STRATH, James "Jim"

WWII

Jim was born in 1921 in Souris, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Army in February 1943 and was stationed in Shilo, Manitoba. During a training exercise, he sustained a severe head injury from which he had severe seizures. Unable to meet military physical standards, he was discharged in July 1944 and spent many months between Deer Lodge Hospital and his home on the farm in Hayfield, Manitoba. Jim died in March 1950 at the age of 29. He is buried in Souris in the Glenwood Cemetery.

Joe was born in Aberdeenshire, Scotland in 1895. He enlisted in the 10th Canadian Mounted Rifles (cavalry regiment) in November 1915 and trained in Portage la Prairie and on Vancouver Island before being posted overseas to England. He took more cavalry training there, then was sent to France in October 1916. Early in 1917, his older brother George "claimed" him to his unit, the 7th Battalion Canadian Infantry (1st British Columbia Regiment). This allowed the brothers to serve together. In some of the heaviest fighting at Vimy Ridge, George and Joe were both wounded but George died of his wounds. Joe returned to the 7th Battalion after convalescence and was with them through 1917-18 and during the occupation of Germany in 1919. He joined Souris Legion Branch 60 in 1929 and was a member for forty-five years before he passed away in 1974.

STRATH, William J. "Bill"

WWII & PEACETIME

Bill was born in Souris, Manitoba in 1928. He joined the 12th Manitoba Dragoons (18th Armoured Car Regiment) in November 1944 and served as a Trooper in 'B' Squadron. He served with the Regiment until it was removed from the Order of Battle in 1959. At that time, he had achieved the rank of Captain and had been awarded the Canadian Forces Decoration in 1956. After the Regiment was disbanded, he was placed on supplementary reserve, serving a six-month posting to the Armoured Corps School at Camp Borden in Ontario from 1948-49. Arthur was a member of Souris Legion Branch 60 for forty-eight years before he passed away on August 14, 1993.

WWII







Jim was born in Russell, Manitoba in 1917. He joined the Army and served in England, France, Belgium, Holland, and Germany with A squadron, 10th Armoured Regiment, Fort Garry Horse. He recounts how, on June 5, 1944 at 4:15 a.m. – D Day, the armies crossed the English Channel while storms raged. Landing was a misery of sea sickness and Jim only cared about getting off the water, even if the whole German army was on the shore. He was the Rear Gunner on his tank but didn't talk much about the war except for some anecdotes and how the Dutch people were very good to them, inviting them into their homes and sharing what little food they had. Jim was a member of Russell Legion Branch 159 for forty-four years before he died in 1990.

THICKETT, William J.

William was born in Russell, Manitoba in 1915. He enlisted in the 5th Canadian Armoured Division in April 1942 and served as a Bombardier in Canada, United Kingdom, and Continental Europe until his discharge in March 1945. William has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159 for over forty-eight years.



THOMAS, Richard

WWII

Richard was born in 1921 in Balsam Bay, Manitoba. He enlisted with the Canadian Army in Winnipeg on May 29, 1943. Advanced training at Camp Borden, Ontario followed his first two months of basic training at Fort Garry Barracks, Winnipeg. He was posted to England in November 1943 and later to France in 1944. He served as a tank driver in the Royal Canadian Armoured Corps with a special regiment dubbed "The Kangaroos", whose responsibility was to transport infantry in tanks. Unfortunately, Richard was severely wounded at Dieppe on September 17, 1944. He was wounded in his right hip by an anti-tank shell fragment weighing three pounds. On January 13, 1945, Richard was repatriated to Winnipeg. Deer Lodge Veterans Hospital was home to him for 23 months, where he underwent extensive treatment. On December 17, 1946, he was discharged from hospital. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, the Defence Medal, the 1939-45 Star, the France and Germany Star, and the War Medal 1939-45. He had been a member of Pine Falls Legion Branch 64 for ten years before he died in 1985.

THOMPSON, William J. "Bill"

WWII

Bill was born in Hamiota, Manitoba in 1914 and served with the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders. A stretcher-bearer in the Dieppe Raid, Bill recounts, "The bullets were whistling around us and don't ever let anyone tell you it doesn't scare you to hear them. I was running to the shore with two other fellows and a burst of machine gun fire hit us. Both my buddies never knew what hit them. I got one bullet below the knee; another took a piece out of my other leg. I made it to the wall and lay still but mortar shells were coming over and exploding around. Finally, a couple of chaps from the Saskatchewan S.I. swam out to the boat with me in between them. These big boats were out in the Channel and kept laying smoke screens every time the German bullets would get close to them. We spent that night in the Channel dodging bombs. Some came pretty close as the ship was rocked a few times." Bill was a member of Decker Legion Branch 239 for forty-four years before he died in 2009.























William enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg in October 1942. He served in Canada as a Warrant Officer II and was discharged in Toronto in April 1945. William has been a member of Russell Legion Branch 159.

WWII







WIDDICOMBE, Clifford Jack

wwii

Jack was born in 1921 in Birtle, Manitoba. He received a COTC 2nd Lieutenant Commission at the University of Manitoba then enlisted in the RCAF and trained in Edmonton, Saskatoon, and Prince Albert. In July 1943, Pilot Officer Widdicombe went overseas and landed at Clyde River Harbour in Scotland before being stationed in Bournemouth, England. On Christmas Day in 1943, he received his Flying Officer rank, then was stationed at Little Rissington, Cheriton Carew, Ossington, Dishforth, and Middleton St. George. Flight Lieutenant Widdicombe flew Oxfords, Ansons, Wellingtons, Halifaxes, and Lancasters. Attached to Moose Squadron 419, he flew Lancasters on raids over Germany and shot down an enemy fighter on the Chemnitz Raid. In June 1945, he flew a Lancaster and crew to Gander, Newfoundland. Jack volunteered for the Pacific Campaign and was stationed in Halifax. He and his wife Florence Peterson raised three children and they farmed in Foxwarren for 50 years before retiring in Russell, Manitoba in 1996. He has been a member of Foxwarren Legion Branch 152 for more than fifty-one years.

WIDDICOMBE, Robert Roland

WWII

Roland was born in 1914 in Birtle, Manitoba. Prior to the war, he was a member of Widdicombe Bros., who were famous Short-horn breeders. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg and became ill at Manning Depot in Toronto. He was sent home to Foxwarren and was honourably discharged due to rheumatic fever. Roland worked at Stevenson Air Field in Winnipeg during the war. In 1948, he married Gene Weir and they farmed in Foxwarren for three years before moving to the United States, where he worked as a herdsman, first in Britton, South Dakota for four years and then in Glendora, California. He purchased a franchise for the first McDonalds restaurant #52 in southern California, opening in March 1957. Roland died accidently in 1966.





WIDMEYER, Stuart Robertson

Stuart was born in Dauphin, Manitoba in 1895. He joined the Royal Canadian Army and served in Europe in the Canadian Infantry, 16th Battalion, Manitoba Regiment. He was awarded the Military Medal for Bravery. Lieutenant Widmeyer was killed in action in 1918. His Grave/Memorial Reference is D-5. His body is interred in the Éterpigny British Cemetery in Nord-Pas-de-Calais in France.

WILLIAMS, Fred WWI

Fred was born in Wiltshire, England in 1893 and immigrated to Canada in 1908. After joining the Canadian Expeditionary Forces in Toronto on March 22, 1916, he served with the Toronto Beavers 204th Battalion and spent some time in England, then was sent to France and Belgium. Severely wounded in the chest, Fred lost part of his left hand and carried shrapnel one inch from his heart and in his elbow until he died at the age of 85. He had met his wife Daisy, from East London, while in hospital in England, as she was one of the many young women who visited the wounded. They married there and returned to Canada after the war to farm, which Dolly found very hard, being a city girl. They raised three daughters and a son who served in the RCAF during World War II, but died with his crew when his Lancaster bomber was shot down over Holland in 1944. Fred was a Life Member of Souris Legion Branch 60 until his death in 1978.



WILSON, Melville Earl


WWII

And we both shivered from the cold night's chill.


I didn't want to leave on that cold, dark night,


