The Waverly Park Cenotaph in Thunder Bay, Ontario was originally built in remembrance of local soldiers who died during World War I, and was updated for both the Second World War and the Korean War. It was erected in 1925 by the McCallum Granite Company of Kingston, Ontario, through the efforts of the Women's Canadian Club. The cenotaph is identical on either side, with an inscription that reads: ERECTED IN COMMEMORATION OF THE MEN AND WOMEN OF THIS CITY WHO DIED ON THE FIELD OF HONOUR IN WAR THAT CANADA MIGHT MAINTAIN HER HERITAGE OF FREEDOM.

WWII

Harry, the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Adams was born in 1918 at Stockton. The family farmed south of Baldur. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Artillery on January 3, 1941 and took his training at Woodstock and Petawawa, Ontario. He went overseas in June of 1941. Harry took his discharge in England at the end of the war and lived there.

ALLISON, William L. "Bill"

WWII

Bill was born on the farm north of Elkhorn, Manitoba. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1940 and served for five years. He trained at St. Thomas and Trenton, Ontario. He was then posted to the bombing and gunnery school at MacDonald, MB for the remainder of his service. He was promoted to Corporal. Following his discharge, he began farming. Bill was a Life Member of the Elkhorn Legion Branch 58.



ANDERSON, Andres "Andy"

WWII

Andres was born at Baldur, Manitoba, the son of Siggi and Sena Anderson. Andy enlisted in Winnipeg, trained at Trenton, Ontario and Dafoe, Saskatchewan. Going overseas, he was stationed in England and in France. On June 7, 1947, he married Ruth Gerolamy. They had a son, Dean.

WWII

Harry was born and raised on the family farm near the village of Manson, Manitoba. He joined the Army in the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps. After training in Canada, he left for England during World War II. He became ill in England and was invalided home in 1944. He was later discharged for health reasons. He settled in Winnipeg where he worked for the Provincial Government.

ANDERSON, Julius

wwii

Julius was born in 1903 in Grund district (Baldur) the son of Bjorn and Kristine Anderson. After teaching for four years, he entered the Manitoba Medical College graduating in 1936. He served on the Staff of the Municipal Hospitals for two years; following which he practiced medicine at Biggar, Saskatchewan for two years. In 1941, he enlisted in the R.C.A.M.C. going overseas in November of 1942. Dr. Julius and his wife, the former Margaret Bower, resided in Winnipeg upon his return to Canada.





ANDERSON, Stanley "Stan"

WWII

Stan was raised near Mansion, Manitoba where he attended school. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve in 1943 and was trained as a gunner. He served on convoy duty on the North Atlantic as a D.E.M.S. (Defensively Equipped Merchant Ship) gunner. Stanley was discharged in 1945 in Winnipeg, MB.

He enlisted at Portage and trained at Barrie Field, London and was stationed at Fort Knox, Kentucky, USA. He owned and operated A.N.C. Aluminum in Winnipeg.

ARASON, Elmer

WWII

Elmer was born in the Bru district, the son of Tryggvi and Olive Arason. He enlisted in Winnipeg in December of 1942 with the R.C.A.F. He trained at Winnipeg, Toronto and St. Thomas, Ontario. He worked as an air force mechanic. On April 10, 1943, he married Helen Patterson and they had four children, Debbie K., Kerry L., Janette O., and Tryggvi S. and farmed near Cypress River.



ARASON, Skapti

WWII

Skapti was born on the N.W. 24-6-14 in the R. M. of Argyle. His parents were Oli and Olga Arason. He married Edith Auery on May 23, 1945. He has one son, Gregory, and two daughters, Eileen and Nancy. He enlisted in Winnipeg in 1941 with the R.C.A.F. and trained at Charlottetown. Overseas, he was stationed in Scotland as a Staff Pilot. He returned to Canada in 1944 and was discharged in 1945.





ARMSTRONG, Donald "Don"

WWII

Don was born on April 20, 1924, and raised on the family farm in the Parkland district, south of Elkhorn, Manitoba. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve on May 12, 1943. He served in World War II on the High Seas on North Atlantic convoy duty until the war ended. Don was discharged on October 5, 1945. After the war, Don and his wife, Evelyn, moved to Turner Valley, Alberta where he worked for Royalite Oil Company.

BAJUS, William "Will"

wwi

Will was born and raised on the family farm north of Elkhorn, Manitoba. He joined the Army on March 21, 1917 and served overseas in England and in France with the 4th Divisional Ammunition Column during World War I. After the war, he became a successful farmer in partnership with his brother. He married Kathleen Bryant on January 15, 1942 and together they raised seven children. Will passed away in 1961.



BAKER, William

WWI

William was born on January 12, 1896 in Ontario. He was a rancher at the time of his enlistment with the 137th Battalion in Calgary on February 8, 1916. His unit sailed from Halifax aboard S.S. Olympic to England where he transferred to the 31st Battalion and William was in France by the end of November 1916. In August of 1917 he received a gunshot wound to his right leg and was returned to England and treated in hospitals in Manchester and Epsom until July of 1918. While William was hospitalized he met his future wife, Lillian (Elizabeth) Drake. William returned to Canada in April of 1919 and received his official discharge due to demobilization. In September of 1920, Lillian arrived in Canada. They first lived in Ameliasburgh, ON where they farmed but soon moved to Carman, Manitoba, then to Keewatin, ON where William worked for the Lake of the Woods Milling Company and a Flour Mill for 30 years before retiring. William was a sports leader and community worker. William and Lillian had five children: Sheilah, Desmond, Ron, Doreen and Dennis. William passed away at the age of 64 on February 1, 1959.

BALDWIN, Keith J.

WWII

Keith was born in Warren, Manitoba in 1917. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in January 1942, spending most of his enlisted time in Canada at Paulson near Dauphin, MB as Leading Aircraftman. He was discharged from the service in 1945. After some time, Keith moved to California with his family where he resided until his death in 1994.

BALDWIN, Kelvin B.

PEACETIME

Kelvin was born in Warren, Manitoba in 1933. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1951 and received his basic training in St. Jean, QC and did his trades training as clerk typist in Aylmer, ON. After training, he went to Trenton, ON for six weeks to train for and participate in the Honour Guard for Queen Elizabeth. His postings include MacDonald, Portage La Prairie, and Winnipeg, MB. He was then posted to 2 Fighter Wing in Grostenquin, France. After returning from France, he went to Base Winnipeg and then to Training Command Headquarters. He was released after twenty years of service in December 1971. Kelvin has been a member of Stonewall Legion Branch 52.



BALDWIN, Margaret M.

WWII

Margaret was born in Ontario in 1889. She graduated from the Winnipeg General Hospital School of Nursing in 1926. She joined the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps and went overseas in 1940 with the Canadian Nursing Sisters to the Canadian Red Cross Memorial Hospital near Tapelow, England. Margaret served there for the duration of World War II. After the war, she returned home to Manitoba where she continued her nursing career. She was awarded the Royal Red Cross for her service. Margaret passed away in 1968.



BALDWIN, Robert W.

WWII

Robert was born in Warren, Manitoba on January 13, 1925. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on November 11, 1943 and was sent overseas in December 1944 where he served with the 59th "Broken Wheel" Squadron in Ireland and the North Sea as an air gunner before he was transferred into the Royal Air Force. He did air patrolling into the North Sea and the English Channel searching for German U-Boats and submarines, as well as escorting convoys of ships coming with supplies such as gasoline, tanks and guns. He was discharged in February of 1946 and sailed home on board the Queen Elizabeth. 


BELL, William

He was assigned to the Royal Winnipeg Rifles but because of his many previous war wounds, he was sent home because he was no longer physically able to serve. William worked at Winnipeg Hydro until retirement. William passed away on his 96th birthday, March 12, 2013.









BENSON, Stefan


WWII




BERRY, William Robert "Bill"

WWII



WWI


William was born in Glenella, Manitoba in 1894. He served with the Army in Canada during World War I. William passed away in 1958.





WWII





CLEMENSON, Clemi





Murray was born at Dry River, Manitoba on May 2, 1920, the only son of Mr. and Mrs. George R. Craik, long time hotel operators at Baldur. Prior to enlistment, Murray taught school at Antonious, S.D. having completed his education in Baldur. He enlisted in the R.C.A.F. in May of 1941 at Winnipeg. He trained at Brandon, MB; North Battleford, Saskatchewan; Malton, Ontario and Jarvis, ON as a WO2. He graduated from Rivers, MB as an air bomber, obtaining the rank of Flight Sergeant. He was posted to Charleton, PEI on reconnaissance duty over the Atlantic Ocean. He was sent overseas in September of 1942. He was reported missing and presumed dead in September of 1943 on an overnight raid on Germany. Mr. and Mrs. Craik were later informed that Murray was buried near Munich, Germany. Murray was posthumously cited and in his respect his mother received his "Operational Wings".

CRAMER, Wilfred Playfair

WWI

Wilfred was born at Baldur, Manitoba, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert E. Cramer Sr. He enlisted in Brandon where he also received his initial training before going to England. He married Gladys Craig on April 7, 1926 and they farmed east of Baldur until his death.



CRERAR, Robert S. "Bob"

wwii

Robert was born in 1920 in Binscarth, Manitoba. Bob joined the Army in 1941 and spent time in Winnipeg, London, Halifax and St. John's during World War II. He was at Barriefield Camp, Ontario between December 1941 and June 1942, moving on to Camp Borden in July 1942 where he trained as a tank and truck mechanic. Later, there are pictures of him, his comrades and civilians in Caen (Normandy) in August 1944 and at the Canadian Leave Camp in Deauville, France in September 1944. During his time with the RCEME, he repaired vehicles during the Battle of the Scheldt and worked in the Tank Shop in Machelen, Belgium in 1945. After demobilization in 1946, he returned to farm in the Binscarth area. Robert married Jean from Edinburgh, Scottland and raised one daughter and two sons. He was a member of the Binscarth Legion Branch 74 for fifty years before he passed away in 1996.



WWII








Harry was born in Hathersage, England in 1906. He immigrated to Port Arthur in 1919 with his uncle Bill Sidall returning from the war. Harry took one year of Electrical Engineering at Finley Engineering College in Kansas City. He completed an Apprenticeship as a Mechanic. Harry married Nora McManiman in Winnipeg in 1940. They had three children. Harry served the R.C.A.F. between 1942 and 1946. He served at Fort William, Ontario from 1942 to 1944; Swift Current, Saskatchewan in 1944; St. Thomas, ON in 1944; Winnipeg, Manitoba from 1944 to 1946; Calgary, Alberta in 1946 during World War II. His ranks were Aircraftman Cl.2, August 1942; Aircraftman Cl.1, November 1944; Leading Aircraftman, July 1945. His trade was Aircraft Carpenter: Trade Group "C". Prior to the war, Harry was employed with No. 2 Empire Flying Training School, Ft. William receiving a leave of absence to serve in the war. The Military deemed that Harry had good mechanical knowledge. The career he chose after the war was "Auto Body". He was to take the course at Winnipeg. Harry had a good service record and good character report. Harry was a very gentle, very kind man.

CUTTS, John Arthur "Jack"

WWII

Jack was born in 1909 in Hathersage, England and immigrated to Canada in 1914. In 1942, Jack married Dorothy Kelleher in Winnipeg and had two children. Jack was an avid pilot. He served at Camp Borden then at Test and Development Establishment & No. 15 Flying Training School, R.C.A.F. Station, Rockliffe, Ontario. Prior to the war, he was a Bush Pilot in Ontario. During World War II, Jack was a Flight Instructor. Jack's military records state: "Jack is a good worker and very good character; very pleasant and cooperative". Jack took a Parachute Course and Jump and achieved his Commercial Pilot's License. After the war, he returned to civilian duties at the CNR yards, Winnipeg; worked for Trans Canada Airlines, Bristol as an Airplane Mechanic; worked at Standard Aero Engine as an Airplane Mechanic for twenty years until his retirement in 1974. Jack passed away at Deer Lodge in 1997; a very kind human being. He belonged to the Masons as well as the Shriners.



DALRYMPLE, Murray G.

PEACETIME

Murray joined the CAF on February 14, 1975. After basic training at CFB Cornwallis, he posted to 2RCR Battle School in Gagetown, NB. With 2RCR, he completed a tour of duty in Cyprus and was a security guard at the 1976 Montreal Olympics. In 1979, Murray remustered to the Air Force as a Fire Fighter for the next 25 years. 

Helen was born in Dauphin, Manitoba in 1917. She enlisted in the Army and served with the Canadian Women's Army Corps in Canada and in England during World War II. She received the Defence Medal, CVSM and Clasp and War Medal 1939 – 1945. Helen passed away in 1994.

DONNELLY, Frank

WWI

Frank was born in Hartney in 1894. He enlisted in the Air Force during World War I and served in Trenton, Canada with the Royal Flying Corps as Instructor flying "J4" aircraft. His aviator's certificate was issued by the Royal Aero club of United Kingdom on September 19, 1919. Frank passed away in 1939.



DONNELLY, John R. "Jack"

WWII

Jack was born in Brandon, Manitoba in 1924. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve in 1943 until the end of the hostilities of World War II. After final training at HMCS Base Cornwallis and a week on a World War I four stack destroyer, he was drafted to Halifax and to an Algerine mine sweeper HMCS Persian. She still had some sweeping gear on board but had been converted for escort duty and joined on Atlantic convoy group off Newfoundland. In Greenwich, Scotland, Jack joined an advanced party to HMCS Monnow, a frigate being finished in Bristol, England. Monnow went through evolutions (shake down) at Tobermory in Scotland then joined other escorts for convoy duty. Later, he was drafted to HMCS Arnprior in Newfoundland, a castle corvette, after her refit and she proceeded on Atlantic convoy duty. At wars end, and awaiting discharge, he crewed on HMCS Beaverton, an ocean going tug towing ammunition barge out of Halifax and dumping them at sea.



DUXBURY, Bernard J.


WWI

BOER WAR


Thomas was born in Manchester, England in 1875 and immigrated to Canada with his parents in 1887. He joined the Cavalry in 1899 and went to South Africa to fight in the Boer War. After the war, he returned to Imperial, SK in 1911, he began farming north of Elkhorn, MB. Thomas passed away on November 5, 1942.

DUXBURY, Thomas

WWII

Thomas was born in Elkhorn, MB on July 2, 1916. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1940, trained in Canada and graduated from the Bombing and Gunnery school in St. Thomas, ON as a wireless air gunner with the rank of Sergeant. In early 1941, he proceeded overseas to take operational training. He joined a crew flying heavy bombers against heavily defended targets in Germany and was promoted to Flight Sergeant during this time. On his 21st mission, his aircraft was shot down while on a raid over Bremen on October 12, 1941. Thomas was reported missing in action and later presumed dead. In 1987 the Province of Manitoba named Lake Duxbury after him.





EGGLETON, Charles R.

wwii

Charles was born in Brandon, Manitoba in 1910. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and was stationed on Canada's West Coast. He served with the 3rd Repair Depot in Calgary and with the Western Air Command in Tofino during World War II. He was part of a team of men whose job it was to ensure that needed equipment and supplies got safely and quickly shipped out to isolated commands at both fighters and bomber air fields and rescue bases at the RCAF. Being responsible for huge amounts of varied and important materials was a major undertaking. They also coordinated the supplying of service materials to contracting companies that were hired by the RCAF.

EKMAN, August J. "Gus"

WWII

August was born on a farm near Lipton, Saskatchewan in 1914. He enlisted in the Army in March of 1943 and arrived in England on September 1st of that year. Gus served with the Canadian Scottish Regiment in England and in Normandy during World War II. He was killed in action on Juno Beach on D-Day, June 6, 1944 and is buried at the Beny-Sur-Mer Cemetery.

ESPEY, William Harvey

WWII

Harvey was born in Cardale, Manitoba in 1923. He joined the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry in 1942, training at Shilo and Portage. Harvey served eleven months in North Africa and Italy. In Italy, he fought in the Liri Valley and in the battle of Ortona, fighting the Hitler Youth Line. He was wounded twice, once in May of 1944 and again in September of 1944. He was then sent to England to recuperate, but due to his last injury was given a medical discharge in July of 1945. After his return, he farmed in the Oak River district, married Mabel Pratley and raised a family of two. He was a member of the Oak River Legion Branch 150 for 41 years. Harvey passed away in 1994 at the age of seventy.



FALLOON, Maurice E.

WWII

Maurice was born in 1916 to Sam and Fanny Falloon on the farm near Foxwarren, Manitoba. Maurice was accepted to air crew in the Royal Canadian Air Force in November of 1942. He graduated as a pilot officer and was chosen to serve for Canadian Transport Squadron 436 flying Dakota Air craft dropping supplies to the British 14th Army in Burma. In December of 1944, he was stationed in the Imphal Valley where he flew over fifteen thousand foot high mountains. In the spring of 1945, Maurice was moved to Akyab, a small island off the Arakan coast of Burma. In the summer of 1945, he flew out of Ramree Island. Maurice finished his tour of 700 operational flying hours the day before the bomb was dropped on Hiroshima. General Slim and the British 14th Army took Rangoon from the Japanese soon after. He was a member of the Legion Branch 152 for more than sixty years before he passed away in 2009.








FAULKES, George



He and Marjorie married in Halifax in 1942. Bill was Chief of Machine Shop and in shore establishments. After the war, Bill returned to the CNR in Winnipeg as a Machinist. In 1963, working for Bertram's & Sons, Bill moved his family to Dundas, Ontario, then to Toronto working for Sandvik Tools. He always had a story to tell and knew everyone. There was nothing he could not fix. Bill passed away in 1996 in Toronto suffering from Alzheimer's. Bill was loved very much. He was a Mason.

Douglas was born in Elkhorn, Manitoba. He joined the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve in May of 1942 and trained as a Stoker. Following training, he was posted aboard H.M.C.S. Kokanee on convoy duty running between St. John's, Newfoundland and Londonderry, Ireland. He served on the High Seas during World War II. He was discharged in November of 1945.

Roy was raised near Elkhorn, Manitoba. He joined the Army and served in France with the Fort Garry Horse in World War I.






FREEMAN, Douglas "Doug"



WWII




GARDNER, George R.



He was wounded and honorably discharged in 1918. John was a member of the Elmwood Legion Branch 9 and passed away in 1968.

WWII



He enlisted on February 4, 1942 and served in Port Arthur, ON and Valcartier, Quebec until he was discharged with the rank of Private First Class on July 17, 1942 for being under age. He enlisted again on October 12, 1943 with the U.S. Navy and served with the rank of Seamen 2nd Class in various ports before being discharged on July 3, 1944. He was transferred to the Canadian Army (Active), Reinforcement Unit Canadian Infantry Corps on July 3, 1944 and served in Canada, England, Belgium and Holland before his discharged on October 12, 1945. After WWII, he chose to go to the Pacific War and as a result was sent back to Canada before his time was up. When he was on disembarkation leave, the V.J. War ended. Therefore, upon returning to his base, he was given another option to go on leave for two years, by that time he would be eligible for discharge on a point system. He took the two years leave and consequently received an underage discharge after all these years of service.

WWII

Frank was born in Herbert, Saskatchewan in 1920. He enlisted in the Army and served with the L Con Corps Sigs of the RCCS in Canada, France and the United Kingdom during World War II. He served from June 5, 1942 to February 5, 1946. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp, France and Germany Star, 1939 – 1945 Star and the Defence Medal. He married Lena Sawatsky. Frank passed away in 1994.

GOODA, Frank P.

WWII

Frank was born in Binscarth, Manitoba in 1915. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on November 5, 1940. Frank worked in aero engine mechanics in Winnipeg, Brandon, Toronto and St. Thomas. Frank served with the 423 Squadron at the Castle Archdale and Enniskillen, Ireland during World War II. He became a Cpl Aero Mechanic on November 17, 1942 in the United Kingdom. He was a member of the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders overseas in World War II. Bruce was wounded in Belgium (a machine gun shot to the left thigh) and spent several months recuperating in hospitals in France and England. He was discharged "to return to civil life due to demobilization" on July 21, 1945. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and returned home to Eriksdale, MB on VE Day in 1945. Bruce was a member of the Eriksdale Legion Branch 140 for fifty plus years. He held the office of secretary-treasurer for several of those years. He married and raised a family in Eriksdale. He worked as a butter maker for the local Creamery and Palm Dairies in Winnipeg. Later he took a job with the Department of Highways until his retirement in 1983. Bruce was an avid sports fan, playing baseball in the summer, curling in the winter as well as playing and coaching hockey. His absolute favorite pastime was playing the horses at Assiniboia Downs in Winnipeg with his many friends. He was a member of the Eriksdale Commemoration Legion Branch 140 for more than fifty years. Bruce passed away in March of 2004 at the age of eighty.



GREENAWAY, Gordon H.

WWI

Gordon was born in Hollan Center, Ontario in 1895. He enlisted in the Army in Winnipeg on February 29, 1916. Gordon embarked in Halifax on September 18, 1916 and arrived in England on SS Olympic on September 25, 1916. The 107th Pioneer Canadian Engineers disembarked in Boulogne, France on February 25, 1917 and fought at Vimy. He was awarded the Good Conduct Badge in the field on February 29, 1918. The unit disbanded on May 28, 1918 and absorbed into the 2nd Canadian Engineers Battalion. Gordon was part of the battalion to enter Germany. On April 29, 1919, he embarked on SS Baltic Liverpool for Canada. Gordon took discharge in Hamilton on May 9, 1919. He visited with family in the Toronto/Owen Sound area before heading west to farm with his father near Newdale, Manitoba. In 1925, Gordon headed north, settling in the Yellowknife NWT, trapping, fishing and guiding along the Mackenzie River for the rest of his life. He was a Life Member of the Vincent Massey Legion Branch 164 where a plaque hangs in his honour. Gordon is buried in the Veterans plot in Yellowknife.

GREENAWAY, Hampton W.

WWI

Hampton was born in Holland Center, Ontario in 1892. He enlisted in the Army on January 6, 1916 in Winnipeg, MB and embarked from Halifax on September 18, 1916 on SS Olympia. He arrived in Liverpool on September 15, 1916 and disembarked in Boulogne, France on February 24, 1917. He earned his Medal for Bravery in the Field on August 15, 1917 at the Battle for Hill 70 near Lens with the 107th Pioneer Canadian Engineers when he showed great dexterity and skill in tending to wounded. Under intense hostile fire of shrapnel, H.E. and gas, his devotion to duty under very trying circumstances was undoubtedly the means of saving a great many lives and the number of men he personally saved were too numerous to count. Hampton was appointed L/Cpl in field on October 20, 1917 and was awarded the good conduct badge on January 6, 1918. He was then appointed Acting Corporal with pay on February 1, 1918 and promoted to Corporal on September 2, 1918. He was struck off strength on January 11, 1919 and he returned to Canada on March 10, 1919 arriving in Halifax on March 18. He returned to farm at Newdale, Manitoba. He was a Life Member of the Newdale Legion Branch before he passed away in 1965.






GREENWOOD (POPLE), Lillian

WWII

Lillian was born on September 13, 1925 in Cartwright, Manitoba. She was the daughter of Ben and Zara Pople (Du Bédat). She enlisted in the Department of National Defence Army on November 11, 1943 during World War II. Her regimental number was W.100560 and her rank was Private. Lillian was discharged on October 24, 1945. She was a member of The Royal Canadian Legion – Strathcona Branch 150. Lillian passed away on January 18, 2010 in Sherwood Park, Alberta. There was a Legion Honour guard at her memorial service.














GUTHRIE, Robert M.

WWII

Robert was born in Brandon, Manitoba. He joined the Navy and served on the High Seas during World War II. Leading Seaman Guthrie served on the frigate, HMCS Valleyfield. She was part of an escort group that was protecting forty or fifty show merchant ships crossing the Atlantic Ocean from the United States and Canada. These ships carried vital war supplies and food to England and Europe, which the German submarines wanted to sink. During action with Sub U 548 Valleyfield was struck by a homing torpedo and in the explosion it broke in half and sank, 133 men lost their lives and Robert was one of them. He was killed in action in 1944 in the North Atlantic.

HABINSKI, Julian L.

WWII

Julian was born in Cooks Creek, Manitoba in 1921. He enlisted in the Army and served with the Canadian Anti-Tank Corp in England, North Africa, Italy, France, Belgium, Holland and Germany. He joined the 7th Anti-tank Regiment of armoured tanks in 1942. He took his basic training in Portage la Prairie and then advanced training at Brandon's Camp Shilo where he was trained on Bren machine guns and other anti-tank weaponry. Julian went to Halifax after training and then boarded the Queen Elizabeth bound for England. He completed two months of training in England before his unit headed for Philipville, North Africa. While serving as a driver-operator with the 7th anti-tank division his main job was to make sure no German tanks got to the troops. After his service in Africa, he returned to his old job on the same Starbuck farm for another two years, worked at the mine in Atikokan for thirteen years, and was a truck and bulldozer operator. Julian married Emma in 1951 and they moved into their brand new home where he continues to live. He received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, 1939-1945 Star Medal, 1939-1945 War Medal, Italy Star Meda, and France and Germany Medal.



HANNAH, James A.

WWII

James was born in 1913 in Rathwell, Manitoba. He served in England, India and Burma during World War II. He enlisted in the Air Force in Winnipeg on March 12, 1941 as a Motor Transport Mechanic. Training started in 1942 at #2 Wireless School in Calgary, MMMT C and B in Trenton and #4 Wireless School in Guelph. Jim completed the MMMT A training while in India and was promoted to the rank of Corporal on August 1, 1944. He embarked from Halifax on May 15, 1943, arriving on May 24 at PRC Topcliffe, England. On March 17, 1944, he went overseas from there to District Headquarters New Delhi India with 4 Wing (435/436 Squadrons) then moved to 221/222 RAF Squadrons working in public relations. Jim saw many atrocities and suffered with shell shock and after effects of malaria. He received the following medals: 1939 – 1945 Star, Burma Star, Defence Medal, General Service Medal and CVSM with Clasp. Jim was released on January 15, 1946 and re-enlisted in 1956 as F/O with the RCAC working with 320 Squadron in Rivers, MB while continuing farming near Oak River. He was a member of the Oak River Legion Branch 150 for 58 years before he passed away in 2004.

HANNAH, James M. "Jim"


PEACETIME



They took heavy machine gun fire on the beach and only 27 out of 186 men in B Company could continue at the end of the day. After they moved in under a machine gun in a concrete bunker, Frank was boosted up to toss grenades into the bunker and stop the machine gun. The survivors at the beach advanced with another company but were surrounded and captured on the third day. Frank was a prisoner in Stalag 12A at Linberg before being moved to Stalag 357 at Bad Fallingbostel, north of Hanover. That camp was liberated by a British outfit in the spring of 1945. After the war, he farmed near Strathclair, MB until he suffered the first of a series of heart attacks in 1958. Later, he was a Commissionaire at Rivers, MB and at Calgary, AB. He was a member of the Strathclair Legion Branch for about twenty years. Frank passed away at the Regina General Hospital in 1997.





HOWARD, Frederick J.

WWI

Frederick was born in 1894 in Newdale, Manitoba. He joined the Army and served in France during World War I. He enlisted in Winnipeg on January 6, 1916 with the rest of the boys from Newdale in the 107th Overseas Battalion CEF. He embarked from Halifax on September 18, 1916 on SS Olympia and arrived in Liverpool on September 25. He proceeded overseas to Witley Camp on February 24, 1917 in Boulogne, France. Fred was part of the Canadian Section, 3rd Echelon 107th Pioneers when he was killed in action whilst returning from a working party near Neuville St.-Vaast on the night of June 24/25, 1917. A shell exploded on the top of the communication trench immediately above him. He was instantly killed by a portion of the shell which struck him on the head. A memorial plaque and scroll (Ser #801148) went to his father, John Howard and Memorial Cross to his mother, Grace Howard in Newdale. Fred is buried at Aux Rietz Military Cemetery southwest of the village of Neuville-St-Vaast, 3 ¾ miles north of Arras, France.

HUDSON, Herbert T. "Bert"

WWII

Bert was born in East Bay, Manitoba in 1921. He enlisted in the Army in June of 1942 and trained at Fort Osborne barracks with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles. He later trained in Nova Scotia. He went to the United Kingdom in January of 1943 where he was transferred to the 48th Highland Regiment. He served with that regiment in Italy and later Western Europe until the end of the war. While serving in Italy, he contracted malaria which plagued him for the rest of his life. Bert married Phyllis Jackson. They farmed in the East Bay district and raised their family of six girls and two boys. Bert was a long-time member of the Ste. Rose Legion Branch 232. He passed away in Ste. Rose in 1998.



IRELAND, Edward C. "Ed"

WWII

Ed was born in 1922 in Binscarth, Manitoba. He served in the Army from 1942 to 1946. He served with the Saskatoon Light Infantry in Canada, England, Italy and Germany during World War II. He was posted to England then sent to Africa. They landed in the invasion of Italy and on to Germany to the end of the war. 
JOHNSON, Bruce





He enlisted in 1914 with the Fort Garry Horse and served in England, Canada and France during World War I. He trained at Camp Hughes, which is now Camp Shilo. He proceeded overseas and was severely wounded in the Cambrian offensive in France in 1917. He returned to Canada and was discharged. He farmed in the Elkhorn district until his death in August of 1950.

JOHNSON, Robert D. "Bob"

WWII

Bob was born and raised on the family farm in the Burnbank district, north of Elkhorn, Manitoba. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in April of 1941 and trained as an aero-engine mechanic. He served in Canada during World War II. He was discharged as a Corporal in 1945 and began farming. Bob moved to Harding, MB in 1949 to continue farming. He married Joyce Hamilton in 1952 and they raised a family of four. They were active in community affairs and farm related organizations.



JOHNSTONE, Alice Lillian

WWII

Alice was born in 1923 in Dominion City, Manitoba. In January of 1945, at 22 years of age, she enlisted with the Canadian Women's Army Corps – CWAC – at Fort Osborne Barracks in Winnipeg, MB and took her basic training for six weeks. 






















JONASSON, Herman David

JOSEPH, Joe

WWII

Joe was born on September 14, 1923 in Markinch, Saskatchewan and was raised in Stockholm, SK where his father ran a grocery store. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1942. He served mainly in the Yukon until his release in 1945. After his discharge, he began farming in Reeder, Manitoba as well as operating a small store and post office in the village. He married Violet Flannery in June of 1956 and they raised a family of five. They moved to Elkhorn, MB in the 1980's and Joe became a hard working member of the Elkhorn Legion Branch 58 where he was a Life Member.









JOSEPHSON, Frederick

WWI

Frederick was born in Iceland on October 24, 1895, the son of Jon Josephson and Gudrun Swanson, who after being widowed became the wife of Sigvaldi (Walter) Gunnlaugson who farmed in the Thor district. Fred came to Canada in 1902. On January 8, 1916, he joined the 222nd. Going overseas in November to Aldershat with the 46th and to France in January 1917. He was wounded at Vimy Ridge in April and hospitalized in England. He returned to battle at Amiens in August and on September 3, 1918 he was reported missing in the Battle of Arras. His name appears on the Vimy Ridge Memorial in France.

KELLEHER, James S. "Jim"

WWII

Jim was born in Brandon, Manitoba in 1925. When Jim joined the Canadian Navy during World War II and after training he was drafted to H.M.C.S. (Her Majesty's Canadian Ship) Kirkland Lake. She was a frigate larger than a corvette and better armed, but less so, than a destroyer. She acted with other escorts in convoy protection across the Atlantic and did runs to Gibraltar as well. Jim was an Able Seaman who stood sea watches as did his buddies but was chosen helmsman, steering the ship often for which he obviously had a special skill. Jim was a member of the RCNVR, a volunteer reserve until the end of hostilities.




KERR, Don C.

WWII

Don was born in Fort Frances, Ontario in 1923. He joined the Army in Winnipeg on October 14, 1941 at the #10 District Depot. He had basic training in Fort Gary and was involved in more training until the spring of 1943. He served with the Princess Patricia's Regiment as a Gunner during World War II. Don was sent to the 77th Field Battery of the 3rd Regiment of the 1st Division. This regiment consisted of the Seaforth Highlanders of Canada, the Royal Regiment and the Princess Patricia's Light Infantry. Don was in the first convoy that landed in Sicily, although in the Artillery Don landed as an Infantry as the guns and trucks had not arrived yet. He fought through Italy and was at Anzio. He was transferred to France and Holland so all Canadian troops were together. He was there until the end of the war. He was discharged in Winnipeg on November 14, 1945. Don was a member of the Fort Frances Legion Branch 29 for 60 years until he passed away in 2005.

He later transferred to regular forces, artillery and trained at Fort Benning in Georgia, USA with #8 Company, 1st S.T.R.T.I.S. He volunteered for service in the Pacific but the war ended before his overseas service began. His picture was taken in World War II battle dress with his Father Earl. Clifford passed away in 2003.

WWI & WWII





Thomas was appointed postmaster in Carberry, MB in July of 1921, a position he held until his death in 1947. Thomas was a founding member of the Carberry and District Legion 153. He was the Legion's first treasurer.

LEGARIE, Roy E.

WWII

Roy was born in Virginia, Minnesota, USA in 1926. He enlisted in the Army and served with the PPCLI in Canada during World War II. Roy has been a member of the Fort France Legion Branch 29 for seventy years.



LEMIEUX, Gerard J.

WWII

Gerard was born in St. Hippolyte, Saskatchewan on July 22, 1925 and lived in Paradis Hill, SK for a few years. In 1938, he moved to McCreary, Manitoba where he finished his schooling. He was a member of the Dauphin Legion Branch 20 for thirty years. In 1966, he purchased Dauphin Taxi and was owner/operator until his sudden death in 1982 at the age of 56 in Dauphin.


























LESLIE, Alec WWII

WWII




























LESLIE, Sam



MacDONALD, Donald

WWI

Donald was born in Isle of Lewis, Scotland on January 18, 1895. In 1913, Donald came to Ninette, Manitoba where his relatives had started farming. Donald enlisted in Winnipeg in 1915 with the 43rd Battalion and proceeded overseas in England, France and Belgium during World War I. He was gassed in Belgium and developed tuberculosis. After stays in numerous hospitals in England, he was returned to Canada and the Ninette Sanatorium where he received treatment for close to two years. He was discharged as permanently unfit for service in 1918. Over the next twenty years, he experienced numerous procedures for his tuberculosis empyema including two thoracoplasty operations. Donald worked tirelessly for veterans and other TB patients and was honoured in 1935 by King George V with the Jubilee Medal and again in 1953 with the Queen Elizabeth Coronation Medal. He was heavily involved with the Ninette Legion serving in various executive positions. He was the local representative for the Department of Veteran's Affairs and Ninette's postmaster for 36 years until his death in 1959.

MacGARVA, Robert Alexander

WWII

Robert was born in Scotland on July 4, 1913. At a very early age, Robert immigrated to Canada along with his parents and siblings. They took up farming in Balmoral, MB and, in 1939, Robert joined the Fort Garry Horse Reserve. In 1940, he married and joined the Royal Canadian Air Force a year later. His wish was to become a pilot but his vision did not meet the criteria required so Robert then chose to join the Air Force Military Police where he remained until 1945 at which time he returned to Canada, bought a farm in Balmoral where he raised a family. He remained on the farm until his health failed in the late 1980s. Robert passed away on August 27, 1998.



MacGARVA, Ronald O.

WWII

Ronald was born on April 14, 1922 on a farm near Whithorn in Scotland. He was the second son of Robert and Jean MacGarva who arrived in Balmoral, MB on May 28, 1928. When he was eighteen, he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force; he wanted to fly and to shoot. He learned that this was possible with fighter planes which also dropped bombs. He proceeded through the ranks from Aircraftman to Flight Lieutenant while in Canada and then England and India. He returned to the farm after 1945 and took an Agricultural Diploma Course, and then by invitation, returned to the Air Force to become a Squadron Leader. His medals include the 1939-45 Star, the Aircrew Europe Star, the Burma Star, the Defense Medal, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp, the War Medal 1939-45, the Canadian Forces Decoration and Clasp, the Operational Wings and Bar, Pilots flying Badge and Dieppe Clasp. He married Marion Brennan in 1952. Ronald passed away in January 2009 at the age of 87 in the Blairmore Hospital, AB.




WWII



He was released in 1945 and worked in Sudbury for two years before returning to Elkhorn to manage the family tin shop business. Cliff passed away in July of 1975.

MANN, John Plater

wwii

John was born at Verdun, Quebec in 1920. He served on the high seas during World War II. He entered R.C.N.V.R. September 1940 to 1945; with R.C.N.R. January 1950 – 1955. John qualified Gunnery Rating February 1941; passed professionally for Leading Seaman, July 1941 and passed professionally for Petty Officer, 1944. John was on the H.M.C.S. Otter; H.M.C.S. Pictou; H.M.C.S. Morden; H.M.C.S. Amherst and the H.M.C.S. Port Colborne. In August of 1946, John married Mabel Siddall of Port Arthur. They had three children and resided in Winnipeg until John's death. When John was aboard the Otter, fire broke out; flames and smoke broke through the wooden upper deck. The crew was unable to control the fire and captain ordered "abandon ship". One officer and eighteen ratings were lost; two officers and twenty ratings survived. John has his right index amputated due to a depth charge being dropped on his finger. He was granted a "Hurt Certificate". John had "very good" conduct.



MASON, Henry G.

WWI & WWII

Henry was born in London in 1888. He enlisted in the Army and served with the Royal Field Artillery in England. He served in both World War I and World War II. His medals include the Military Cross, MM Medal, Military Medal, British War Medal, Victory Medal, George Medal (George VI). Henry was a member of the Grandview Legion Branch 14 for many years until he passed away in 1976.

Stephen was born in Gonor, Manitoba in 1918. He enlisted in the Army and served with the Patricia Pats in England, Italy and France during World War II. He was a member of the Selkirk Legion Branch 42 for more than forty years. Stephen passed away in 2004.

MAVINS, John Earle

WWII, KOREA, SPECIAL DUTY, PEACETIME

John was born in Toronto, Ontario in 1913. He served in the Non-Permanent Militia from 1930 to 1939 (Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders of Canada). He joined the active service in the beginning of World War II and served from 1939 to 1945 in England and in Northwest Europe. In 1950, he was appointed to the Canadian Army Special Force with the rank of Captain, serving under the UN in Korea, Japan and Vietnam. Upon returning to Canada, he served as Adjutant – 1 AUU AHQ and subsequently as Camp Commandant HQ in the Saskatchewan Area. Retiring from the Camerons in 1961, he transferred to the Canadian Guards in Ottawa where he attained his Majority and continued to serve until retiring in 1968. He was a member of various Legion Branches for many years before he passed away in 1989.



MAWBY, James Turnell "Jim"

WWII

James was born to Turnell and Eva (Hayes) Mawby at Cypress River, Manitoba on December 17, 1916. Jim enlisted with the Royal Canadian Air Force when World War II broke out. He served overseas from 1941 to 1945 and was stationed at Linton-on-the-Ouse with the Thunderbirds Squadron as an armourer in 1942. He received three medals: Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp and the War Medal 1939 – 1945. Jim was also mentioned in The Dispatches by the King's Order for distinguished service and received the Oak Leaf. He returned to Paradise, Nova Scotia where he was training for the war in the Pacific when VE Day was declared. Jim passed away on December 24, 1962.




















MAY, Herbert

WWI

Herbert was born on August 7, 1892 in Camberwell, Surrey, England. He was born to Charles and Helen May, who were originally from Dulwich, England. They moved to Rainy River, Ontario where Herbert took a job as a stationary engineer. He enlisted at Port Arthur, Ontario on January 10, 1918. He started in the 1st Depot Battalion of Manitoba in which he served as a Private. He trained for approximately four months before being sent overseas. With this battalion, he made his way to England across the Atlantic Ocean on the S.S. Tunisian. He arrived in England on April 19, 1918. Soon after he arrived, he was taken on strength to the 18th Regiment Battalion, but due to the lack of need for assistance he was struck off strength to join the 44th Battalion of the Canadian Infantry (New Brunswick Regiment). He was shipped to France for the Battle of Canal-du-Nord and Cambrai with this battalion where he fought his last battle. This battalion belonged to the 10th Brigade of the 4th Division. Herbert suffered serious wounds from heavy enemy fire and was killed in action on September 27, 1918. He is buried in the Bacquoy Road Cemetery in Ficheux, France.

McBEAN, Donald

WWII

Donald was raised on a farm near the village of Manson, MB. He joined the Army in 1941 and served as a cook in the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps. He was with the Canadian contingent that served in the Aleutian Islands in 1943. The remainder of his service was in various army camps in British Columbia. Following his discharge in 1945, he attended Normal School to train as a teacher. He spent the remainder of his working years teaching in rural Manitoba.



McCALL, George A.

wwii

George was born in East Braintree, Manitoba in 1924. He joined the Canadian Army when he was eighteen years old and served with the 42nd Anti-Aircraft out of Simcoe, Ontario. He served in England during World War II. George and his eight brothers all served during the war and they all came home. He was also a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Elmwood Branch 9 for over 45 years and sat on the Executive as Membership Chair. He also held the position of Zone Secretary. George passed away on August 14, 1991.



Two of his sisters died young and are buried in Zion Cemetery west of Foxwarren. The family relocated to Winnipeg and eventually to Alberta. Edgar joined the Air Force during World War I. Information about his service career is unavailable. He was married and had three children, one of whom was in the Royal Canadian Air Force during World War II. Edgar died in Calgary in 1963.

McCOLL, Bert WWII

Bert was born on the family farm north of Elkhorn, MB in 1925. He joined the Army and was assigned to the infantry. After training in Winnipeg and Camp Shilo, he was on his way overseas when the war ended. After discharge from the Army, Bert made his home in Carberry, MB.



McCOLL, Jack

KOREA

Jack was born near Elkhorn, MB. He enlisted in the Special Force that Canada raised to take part in the Korean War. Jack was in Korea for several months as a member of the Royal Canadian Artillery. On return from Korea, he was released from the Army, married and made his home in Rocky Mountain House, AB where he and his wife Beverly raised a family of two.

WWII

Allan was born on September 15, 1921 in Gladstone, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Canadian Air Force in the fall of 1942. He had basic training in Brandon, MB for six weeks and then Portage la Prairie for eighteen months in navigation school. There were people from all over the world, including Australia and England. He took flight training in Portage la Prairie, Brandon and Dauphin was followed by Calgary "OTU" for three months, then LaChine, Quebec for posting. He boarded the "Empress of Scotland" to Liverpool and trained in Yorkshire. Allan became one of the RCAF 425 "Alouette" Squadron of bomber command. He flew Halifaxes and Lancasters in six operations over Germany. He then took over the family farm in Helston, MB. In 1999, he retired from farming and moved into Gladstone Legion Lodge. He was past president and past Sergeant-at-Arms of the Gladstone Branch 110 of The Royal Canadian Legion.

McDONALD, Hamilton "Hammy"

WWII

Hammy was raised on a farm near Fleming, Saskatchewan. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1940 and trained as a pilot. Following graduation from basic pilot training, he proceeded to England where he took further training as a fighter pilot and was sent to a Spitfire Squadron. He served in England and in Normandy during World War II. He was shot down over the British Channel, but was picked up by Air-Sea rescue. At the end of the war, he left the Air Force as a Squadron Leader and went back to the farm. He spent some time in the Saskatchewan Legislature and as a Senator in Ottawa.



McGOGY, Allard LeRoy

WWII

Allard was born in Ashley, McIntosh County, North Dakota on November 25, 1909. His service number was H76148. He served with the 18th Field Battery and 2nd Medium Regiment of the Royal Canadian Artillery in England, France, Germany, Italy and North Africa. The 18th and 25th Field Battery Units were recognized on January 26, 1942 to Canadian Armoured Corps: 2nd Medium Regiment which is also part of First Canadian Army Troops. Allard was awarded the 1939 – 1945 Star, Italy Star, France and Germany Star and Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. Allard passed away on October 17, 1960.

He served as a Gunner during World War II in England, Central Mediterranean, Continental Europe, France, Germany and Holland. He was discharged on November 13, 1945. He was awarded the 1939 – 1945 Star, Italy Star, France and Germany Star and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. The Legion said that he most likely also received the War Medal and the Defence Medal. Bernard passed away on December 10, 1948.

McGOGY, Donald Charles

WWII

Donald was born in Medicine Hat, Alberta on November 11, 1912. He enlisted in the Army on January 9, 1943 with the Number 10DD RCA Anti Tank. His service number was H1210. He served during World War II in England, Central Mediterranean, Continental Europe, Italy, Germany and North Africa. He landed in France on March 17, 1945, in Belgium on March 22, 1947 and in Holland on April 2, 1945. He was promoted to Sergeant on August 4, 1945 and was discharged on March 19, 1946. He received the 1939 – 1945 Star, Italy Star, France and Germany Star and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. The Legion said that he most likely also received the Africa Star Medal. Donald passed away on August 9, 1991.



McGOGY, Ellis Kirkland

WWII

Ellis was born in Medicine Hat, Alberta on March 19, 1917. He enlisted in the Army and served with the 12th Manitoba Dragoons – 18th Armoured Car C. Regiment as a Trooper. His regiment number was H77868. He served in England, France, Germany, Holland and North Africa during World War II. The 18th Canadian Armoured Car Regiment: left the 4 CDN repatriation Depot between Thursley Village and Witley Village in Surrey, England to return to America aboard S.S. Queen Elizabeth that departed on December 20, 1945. He arrived in New York City, New York, USA on January 14, 1946. He was awarded the 1939 – 1945 Star, France and Germany Star and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. The Legion said that he most likely also received the Africa Star Medal. Ellis passed away on September 3, 1993.

He served in England, France, Germany, Italy and Greece during World War II. He was awarded the 1939 – 1945 Star, Italy Star, France and Germany Star and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp. Leslie was a member of the Houston, BC Legion Branch before he passed away on August 2, 1993.

McGOGY, Murray Benone

WWII

Murray was born in Medicine Hat, Alberta on September 26, 1914. He enlisted in the Army and served with the 49th Field Battery, 24th Field Regiment RCA. He was deployed as MP01106 from Vancouver, BC. He served with the rank of Gunner in England, France, Germany, Italy and Holland during World War II. His regiment number was H69953. He was awarded the 1939 – 1945 Star, Italy Star, France and Germany Star and Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. He passed away on February 23, 1983.



McGREGOR, Frank J. N.

WWII

Frank was born in Winnipeg on August 8, 1920. He joined the Lord Strathcona Horse (RC) in Winnipeg in August of 1940. Frank took his basic training in Ontario before leaving for England. He served in Canada, Britain, Italy, France, Holland and Germany during World War II. His regiment was later shipped to Italy where he was wounded in the Battle of the Melfa River. After hospitalization, he left to rejoin his squadron as an acting-sergeant and tank commander. At the end of December 1944, while on leave in Rome, he became ill with hepatitis. Frank was hospitalized and shipped back to England. His greatest regret was his inability to rejoin his squadron before the end of the war. He left England aboard the Queen Mary, a peacetime luxury liner, but in wartime an overcrowded troop ship. He was discharged in Winnipeg in August of 1945. Frank died in March of 1995 and is buried in the Veteran's section of Brookside Cemetery in Winnipeg.

He is buried in Durnbach War Cemetery in Bayern, Germany. His brother, Murray McKay, also served in the RCAF and he too was killed.






McKAY, Murray R.

Robert was born in 1933 and enlisted in the Canadian Army on February 6, 1951 at the age of seventeen with his mother's consent. He served in Canada, Korea and Japan as a gunner, radio operator and paratrooper with 1 Light Battery. In 1952, while practicing in Saskatchewan, his parachute failed to open and he was injured. He recovered in time to serve active duty in Korea. He was honourably released on April 26, 1954. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal, the Korean Medal in, the Peacekeeping Medal and the United Nations Korea Medal. Upon release, Jack joined Canada Post where he served for 34 years retiring in 1988 as Post Master in Melita, MB. He was a member of Legions Gladstone #55, Gillan #245 and Melita #127. Melita Legion presented him with the Merit Service Medal, a 50 year pin and a Life Membership. He was also a member of the Korea Veterans Association, Saskatchewan Unit 46. Jack died in 2007 at the age of 74.

McLEAN, W. J. "Jim"

WWI

Jim was born on June 20, 1897 at Pilot Mound, the son of Aaron and Susan McLean. He enlisted with the 46th C.E.F. in World War I. He saw active service in France from 1915 to 1918. He was wounded twice. In World War II, he served with the Veteran's Guard from 1942 to 1945. On June 10, 1925, he married Winnifred Neighbours at La Riviere, Manitoba. They had two sons and three daughters. Jim passed away on October 13, 1958.



McLEOD, Alick Russell

KOREA

Alick was born to World War I veteran Robert Murray McLeod and Mary (Carrigal) McLeod on December 6, 1926 in Dugald, Springfield, Manitoba. He lived all his life in Dugald. Alick joined Manitoba Telephone System as a linesman in 1947. In 1950, he joined the Canadian Forces attached to R.C.C. of Signals as Private Special Forces 3rd Battalion PPCLI. He was deployed to Korea. Alick contracted malaria and was medically discharged from the Canadian Armed Forces in December of 1950. His service number was H800286 and he was awarded the Korean Medal, U.N. Service Medal and Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp. When he had recovered, he resumed his employment with MTS. He worked at Winnipeg, Churchill, Lac du Bonnet, Morris and Marden where he and Nancy Clover Fraser of Carman retired in 1983. They had five children: Janice, Tracy, Kathy, Scott and Leslie. When he retired in 1983 he held the position of District Services Management Eastern Region. After military service, Alick was active in the Legion from 1953 and president at the Morden Legion Branch 11 in 1990 and 1991. Alick was a loving father, grandfather and greatgrandfather with twelve grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren. He passed away on September 30, 1994.

McLEOD, Robert Fraser

wwii

Robert was born to World War I veteran Robert Murray McLeod and Mary (Corrigal) McLeod on June 9, 1923 in Dugald, Springfield, Manitoba. He joined the #5 Division Ordinance Workshop R.C.O.C. (Canadian Army) on July 13, 1942. On completion, November 25, 1942, he enlisted in the #10 District Depot Canadian Infantry Corps R.C.O.C. (active) until January 5, 1943. He served during World War II in the United Kingdom, England and Canada and was discharged on April 6, 1946. His service number was H445398 and he was awarded the Defence Medal and the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp. Fraser lived in Manitoba, except for his military service overseas. He married Norma Jean Brown (Dugald) on June 23, 1949. They had three children: Roderick, Murray and Barbra. All, and their children, are residents of Manitoba involved in and contributing to the life of the province. Fraser held various positions, until employment with Manitoba Hydro that lasted until his untimely accidental death on March 23, 1981 at age 57. He was pleased and proud to have been the foreman of a hydro pole setting crew that brought electrical power to rural Manitoba.

McLEOD, Robert Murray

wwi

Robert was born in Dugald, Springfield, Manitoba to Kenneth McLeod (recipient of second Springfield Municipality land grants) and Mary Margaret Black, daughter of Robert Black (recording secretary of first Springfield Municipal council meeting). He lived all his life in Dugald except time spent in England and France during World War I. He enlisted in the Canadian Expeditionary Force 90 Canadian Infantry 3rd Battalion Winnipeg Rifles on November 12, 1915. He served in France. Robert was stricken with "trench fever" and PTSD (modern designation), his health was severely compromised. Robert was orphaned at age eighteen. He and Donald Alexander (younger brother) farmed. Robert was granted compassionate leave to return to Dugald because Donald Alexander died. He was discharged on July 18, 1918. His service number was 187212 and he received the Service Medal. Robert married Mary Corrigal (Selkirk) on June 26, 1919. His farm was taken from him in 1925. He supported a family of eight children working on C.N.R. Three sons: Roderick (KIA), Fraser in World War II and Alick (Korea) served in the Canadian Military. Robert passed away on May 5, 1965.



McLEOD, Roderick Murray

WWII

Roderick was born on August 21, 1921 in Dugald, Manitoba. He was the eldest son of World War I veteran Robert Murray McLeod and Mary (Corrigal) McLeod, Springfield Pioneers. He enlisted in the Air Force and served in England, Canada and France with Squadron 419 during World War II. Roderick went missing in action on March 30, 1943. Monthly telegrams stating "still missing in action" came. At one year, "missing in action and presumed dead". It was difficult on the family. On May 8, 1945, the family was notified of a marker with his name and number found at St. Nazaire, France in Escoublac-la-Baule War Cemetery, Loire-Atlantique. Roderick was raiding a German submarine pens – his Halifax Bomber was shot down over Trignac (a suburb of Nazaire). The crew of seven perished. On May 8, 2000, 45 years after wars end, the Trignac people erected a cairn with the names of Roderick's crew and one other crew that perished that night to honour their sacrifice. Members of his family attended. Roderick McLeod Lake (63N/8) south of Brentwood Lake was named to commemorate Roderick's death. His youngest brother Glen and his son Keith erected a headstone at this site.



McNEILL, Bernard J.

WWII

Bernard was born in Brandon, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Navy and served in the High Seas during World War II. Able Seaman Berny McNeill served on the frigate HMCS Valleyfield. She was part of an escort group that was protecting 40 or 50 slow merchant ships, each loaded with vital war supplies and food sailing from the United States and Canada to England and Europe, across the Atlantic Ocean. German submarines wanted to sink them. During an action with sub U548, Valleyfield was struck by a homing torpedo and broke in half in the explosion and sank; 133 men lost their lives and Berney McNeill was one of them.

McTAGGART, Orville E.

WWII

Orville was born in Crystal City, Manitoba in 1920. He joined the Royal Winnipeg Rifles in 1941 and served in Canada, Jamaica and in the United Kingdom during World War II. He was then transferred to the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders and saw action in Continental Europe. He remained with the occupation army in Germany for a year after the war and was discharged in April of 1946. Orville was awarded the France and Germany Star, the Defence Medal, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the 1939 – 1945 War Medal. Orville was a member of the Crystal Lake Legion Branch 35 for eight years before he passed away in 1992.



METCALF, Richard D. "Dick"

wwii

Richard was born in Carroll, Manitoba in 1923. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1942 and served in Europe with the #428 Squadron, 6 Group Bomber Command T.A.F. during World War II. After training in Canada, he was drafted overseas as an airplane mechanic. He worked on Lancaster bombers, patching and repairing the bodies and wings when they returned from bombing raids on enemy lands. Often the planes were torn and holed by shells from enemy fighters and anti-aircraft ground fire and sometimes crashes. It was terribly important that these planes were rebuilt and repaired and returned to our aircrews in a safe and airworthy condition as quickly as possible. They carried our fight to the enemy lands. He was a member of the Legion Branch 90 for 63 years before he passed away in 2005.

WWII



Karachi, Rawalpindi, Imphal and Ramru to name a few. He Served in Canada, England, India and Burma during World War II. He returned to Canada in October of 1945. After his discharge from the Royal Canadian Air Force, Ken joined the West Mount Air Cadet Squadron, obtained the rank of Pilot Officer then Flying Officer. Ken resides in Point Claire, Quebec where he is a member of the St. Anne's Military Hospital Liaison Center. He is also active in the Masons and Shriners.

He served overseas with the 222nd Regiment of the Canadian Expeditionary Force where he saw action in France and Belgium and was killed in action on April 28, 1917.

MONYCH, Metro

Metro was born on February 19, 1919 in Meadowlands, Manitoba just outside of Winnipegosis, MB. He enlisted in the Army on March 4, 1942 with the Royal Winnipeg Rifles with the reg forces. He served in France, Germany, and England during World War II. Before his discharge on January 15, 1946 he was with the Queens Own Cameron Highlanders. After his service, he returned home to his wife and family. He worked as a labourer, fisherman and truck driver until he started with the Department of Public Works as a dredge hand. He worked dredging on Lake Winnipeg and Lake Winnipegosis until his retirement. He raised a large family and was a Life Member of the Winnipegosis Legion Branch 91 until it closed and then transferred to the Dauphin Branch 20. He was diagnosed with cancer in 1986 and passed away on September 13, 1987.





MOORE, Wesley J.

wwii

Wesley was born in Saskatchewan in 1922. He enlisted in the Army and joined the Manitoba Dragoons in 1941 driving the armoured Staghounds. He served in France and in Eastern Europe during World War II. Also, he served in the Infantry and was a member in the quartermasters' stores at one time. He is a member of the Legion in Fairlight, SK.

WWII

Bill was born in Niagara Falls in 1920. His family later moved to Winnipeg, Manitoba. As a youth, he was very active in sports, especially hockey. He joined the Camerons reserves before the war had started and when it did he transferred to the active service. He served in the Army in Canada, England and France (Dieppe) during World War II. While in Britain, he played on the Camerons hockey team. In 1942, the team went on to win the 2nd division championships. On August 19, 1942, he landed in Dieppe, France. While withdrawing, his unit was cut off from the boats on the beach. Bill told the others to get the wounded off while he would keep the Germans occupied by jumping all over shooting and making it look like there was more than just him. He had taken out a German Pill Box before he ran out of ammo at which time he surrendered. For this action, the French government awarded him the Croix de Guerre with Bronze Star for bravery above and beyond the call of duty. Bill was taken Prisoner of War at Dieppe in 1942. Bill passed away in 1970.

MUDGE, Albert Edward

WWII

Albert was born in 1924 in Thornhill, Manitoba. He served as a pilot in the Royal Canadian Air Force in Canada (Virden, Manitoba) during World War II. Albert passed away in 2000.



MULLIGAN (JESSAMAN), Vi

WWII

Vi was born in England. She served in the British Army during World War II with a Heavy Anti-Aircraft Regiment. She served in the London and Dover areas during the VI missile attacks in 1944. Vi married Cliff Mulligan, a Canadian soldier, on August 11, 1945. Cliff returned to Elkhorn, Manitoba, his hometown, and Vi joined him in July of 1946 when they began farming. Vi was a very active member of the Elkhorn Legion Branch 58.

MULLIGAN, Clifford "Cliff"

WWII

Cliff was born at Siemens, Saskatchewan and was raised on a farm near Elkhorn, Manitoba. In 1942, he joined the Army in the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps, serving in England and northwestern Europe. While in England, he met and married Vi Jessaman who was serving in the British Army. Following the war, they returned to Elkhorn to begin farming. They were both active members of the Elkhorn Legion Branch 58.

MURRAY, Bruce

WWII

Bruce was an Observer/Navigator posted to 10 BR Squadron in late 1941 and flew in Douglas Digby Aircraft. In the spring of 1943 he converted to 4 Engine VLR Liberators to close the Atlantic gap. On September 16, 1943, Bruce left Goose Bay to sweep ahead of quadrant group HMS Renown, which was carrying Winston Churchill back to Britain after the Quebec Conference with President Roosevelt. On September 19th their aircraft took off with another 10BR squadron aircraft to sweep the track of a westbound convoy. While they were enroute to the sweep area a Uboat was spotted but it was impossible for them to lose the necessary height for an attack. The submarine was firing at them from the moment of sighting. As they were turning to get in position for another run up, the U-boat sank. A few weeks later the crew was given leave but Bruce decided not to go on leave at that time. Bruce was very fortunate for that decision as their plane bound for Montreal failed to reach Dorval and the crash was not found on Black Mountain, Quebec until three years later.



NAGLE, Francis J. "Frank"

wwi

Frank was born on December 6, 1891 at Elmsley, Ontario near Perth. A veteran of World War I, he joined the Fourth Canadian Mounted Rifles in Toronto at a young age. He was in active service for four years in France, Belgium, Vimy, Sommes and Ypres. He came back to Canada, later moving to Manitoba where he farmed until his death in October of 1942. He is buried in Riverside Cemetery in Neepawa, Manitoba. His wife passed away in 1989. He is survived by two sons and one daughter in Neepawa.



George was born in Canada in 1896. He enlisted in the Army and served in Germany during World War I. He was also at Vimy Ridge. George was a member of the Legion in Glenboro, Manitoba before he passed away in 1949.

NORRIS, Jack T.

WWII

Jack was born and raised in Elkhorn, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force and trained as a pilot. He served with the 422 Squadron in the United Kingdom during World War II. After arriving in England, he took operational training to become an aircraft Captain on Sunderland aircraft in Coastal Command taking part in the antisubmarine campaign. He completed a tour of operations. After being discharged as a Flight Lieutenant, Jack attended the University of Manitoba, taking a degree in pharmacy. He returned to Elkhorn and operated Mooney's drug store for a number of years before moving to Courtney, BC.



NYLIN, Tilden

WWII

Tilden was born in Rapid City, MB on October 14, 1920. He moved with his parents to Elkhorn, MB in 1930. In 1941, Tilden joined the Army. He served with the 83rd Transport Convoy, attached to the Calgary Tank Regiment in the 1st Canadian Division. His regiment was part of the assault force which invaded Sicily in 1943. Following the Sicilian campaign, they landed in Italy for the long and bitter struggle in that country. The First Division was sent to France to take part in the war in Holland, Belgium and Germany. Tilden was in Germany when the war ended and then he volunteered for the Pacific. However, that war also ended before his services were required and he was discharged in 1945. On release, he began farming at Elkhorn. Tilden was a member of Elkhorn Legion Branch 58.

WWII

Dori was born in St. Peters (East Selkirk), Manitoba on December 7, 1919. He was the son of Patrick and Christine O'Neill. He enlisted on September 26, 1939 in Winnipeg at the age of 19 and served during World War II. He was a member of the Winnipeg Grenadiers, RCIC and serviced in Bermuda, Jamaica and Hong Kong ("C" Force). Dori was killed in action on December 19, 1941 in Hong Kong and is buried in the Hong Kong Memorial. He was awarded the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp, 1939 – 1945 Star and the Pacific Medal.

ORCHARD, Clarence N.

WWII

Clarence was born in Brandon, Manitoba in 1924. He joined the 25th Field Regiment RCA in 1943. He took his army training at A4 Barracks in Brandon, at Shilo, Manitoba and at the West Coast. After a year, he transferred to the Canadian Navy in the then volunteer reserve, RCNVR. Completing advanced naval training at HMCS Cornwallis Base at Deep Brook, Nova Scotia he served on HMCS Hapstick, a British vessel, and then HMCS The Pas in patrolling and protecting Canadian waters. A well, The Pas, a Corvette often joined other escorts on the Triangle Run guarding loaded ships from New York and Boston convoy. They arrived in Halifax's Bedford Basin and along with many other ships were formed into larger convoys and escorted by the same protectors met and handed over their charges to the Atlantic escort groups out of St. John's, Newfoundland which took them to England, Ireland and Europe.



ORR, James H. "Jim"

WWII

Jim was born at Beulah, Manitoba in 1912. He enlisted on September 13, 1939, joining the 12th Field Company of the Royal Canadian Engineers and later transferring to the Canadian Armoured Corps when he received his commission. Jim saw active duty in Canada, Britain and northwest Europe, receiving the following medals: France and Germany Star, Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp and the War Medal 1939 – 1945. He was honourably discharged with the rank of Lieutenant in September of 1945. Jim married Doris Alexander of Bookham, Surrey, England and she followed him to Canada as a war bride in March of 1946. Together they raised seven children on a farm near Binscarth, Manitoba. Jim was a member of the Binscarth Legion Branch 74 for 45 years until his death in 1990.



Norman was born on the farm in Erickson, Manitoba in 1925. Following Grade 12, at Foxwarren Collegiate Institute, he spent a year on his father's farm at Erickson and then joined the Army in 1944. He was a Two-Stripe Corporal in the Infantry and Service Corps, stationed at Fort Osborne, Camp Debert, Halifax, Barriefield, Dundurn, Fort Gary, Camp Borden, Chadibucto and the Rivers Joint Air-School. Following the war, he enrolled at the University of Manitoba, attaining the Science in Agriculture Degree. While there, he was a member of the Canadian Officers Training Corps where he was offered a King's Commission which he declined. He formed his own company — Peterson Manufacturing, patented several small tools, specializing in Liners for Chimney of Gas Furnaces as well as Continuous Eavestroughs. He inherited his father's farm in 1979, rents it out and resided in Onanole, MB. He is a member of the Erickson Legion Branch 143 and has been for over 50 years.

PHILLIPS, Ross M.

He was a member of the Carman Legion Branch 18 for 62 years and was a Life Member. He passed away on March 3, 2008 at the age of ninety.



PIZZEY, Fredrick

Fredrick was born in the Binscarth District in 1891. He was a trench mortar gunman in France and Germany during World War I. He was in the trenches when mustard gas was used. He was a member of the Foxwarren Rifle Club. When he returned home from the war, he started a business with his brother. From there, he went into farming and trucking. 

WWII





WWII







On August 29, 1918 he was promoted to Second Lieutenant. However, he was declared unfit for flight duty and spent the remainder of his service in observation duties and ground detail. He returned home in April of 1919. Following his return to Canada, he spent some time in Victoria, British Columbia. He passed away on March 3, 1928 and is buried in Elmwood Cemetery, Winnipeg, MB.



ROBERTSON, George F.

WWII

Geordie was born in McAuley, Manitoba. He joined the Army in 1942 and after basic training in Canada, he proceeded to England where he was assigned to the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry regiment. He was with his regiment in the assault on Sicily in 1943. He was wounded in the Campaign in Italy. After convalescing, he joined the Royal Winnipeg Rifles in Holland. He was discharged as a Corporal in 1945. He began farming and married Lillian Martin, they raised a family of two girls. Geordie was an active member of the Elkhorn Legion Branch 58.

He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in March of 1940 during World War II and trained as a pilot at Claresholm, Alberta. He received his wings from the Duke of Windsor on October 5, 1941. Flight Sergeant Ross was shot down eight miles south west of Sedan at Flize, France during a night raid against Saarbrucken, Germany. He was buried in Parish Cemetery at Flize, France and was exhumed and reinterred in War Cemetery at Choloy, Meutrthe-et-Moselle, France.

ROSSET, Andre

WWII

Andre was born in Haywood, Manitoba on July 27, 1927. At the age of eighteen, he enlisted in the army. He served with the Canadian Infantry in Canada. When World War II ended, he volunteered for service in the Far East. When Japan surrendered, he returned to St. Claude, MB and married Louise Bonnefey and they were proud parents of fourteen children. He was employed by Modern Dairies, first as a truck driver, then many years as a power engineer. He retired in 1998. His retirement years were spent gardening, hunting, fishing and wood carving. He was a member of the St. Claude Legion and passed away in 2007.



ROSSET, Claude

WWI

Claude was born on May 24, 1895 on the S.E. ¼ 20-8-7 St. Claude, Manitoba. Claude enlisted in the Canadian Overseas Expeditionary Force in March of 1916. 

He received the following medals: (5) Gold Star – GRJ VI, 1939 – 1945 Star; Gold Star - GRJ VI, the France and Germany Star; Silver-Georgivs VI D G Briomn Rex F D IMD Imp; 1939 – 1945 Defence Medal; Canada 1939 – 1945 Voluntary Service Volontaire; Georgivs VID AG BR Omn Resetindiare IMT 1939 – 1945. His unit returned to Canada in September of 1945 where he was discharged. James was active with the 8th RECCE reunions held all over Canada until his death in 1987. He was also a member of the Pro Pats Legion Branch in Victoria for forty years.

SCOTT, Charles Pringle BOER WAR, WWI & WWII

Charles joined the Army and served with the Black Watch. He served in China and fought in the Boer War and in both World War I and World War II.

SIDDALL, William "Bill"


wwi

Bill was born in 1894 in Curbar, England. He immigrated to Canada in 1912, settling in Port Arthur, Ontario. He served in the 96th Lake Superior Regiment then enlisted in the C.E.F., posted to The Little Black Devils. He served in England, France and Germany during World War II. Bill was at the Battle of Ypres gas attack. Despite the effects of the gas, Bill's 8th Bth left their trenches and engaged the Germans hand to hand combat. Many were killed. Bill was injured and taken as a prisoner of war at Kriegsgefangenelager Camp from May of 1915 to December of 1918. While a prisoner of war, Bill cared for the horses. He would hide horse hair from the horses' tails and made a necklace over the three years. There is a pattern to it with likely a meaning. Bill met Elizabeth Pinchbeck, Sheffield and married in March of 1919. He gave Elizabeth the necklace as a gift which she wore for years. Bill was a very kind, gentle man who loved gardening. He passed away in 1972 in Winnipeg.

SIMMS, Arthur

wwi

Arthur was born in 1892 in Russell, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Army and went to training in Osborne Barracks, Winnipeg. He went overseas with the 78th Battalion, arriving in Liverpool, England in May of 1916. By August, he was in Ypres, France. He served in Canada, England and France during World War I. While on night patrol, he was taken prisoner and forced to work behind enemy lines in France without any necessities of life. After a year, he was sent to Germany where Red Cross parcels and clothes awaited him. He was repatriated through Copenhagen, Denmark on December 17, 1918 while a band on the dock played "The Maple Leaf Forever", thence to Scotland Christmas Day, finally arriving in Canada in April of 1919. Arthur married Edna Kelly of Crawford Park, MB where Arthur took up farming and their six children attended Clear Creek School. In 1947, the farm was sold and the family moved to Foxwarren, MB. Arthur died in 1982 at the age of 89 and Edna passed away in 1992. They are buried in Foxwarren Cemetery.



SINCLAIR, Lloyd G.

WWII

Lloyd was born in Elkhorn, Manitoba and was raised on the family farm nearby. After finishing high school, he taught school. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force early in the war and trained as a pilot. Following graduation from the pilot training course, he was sent to England for further training. He served in England during World War II. He became the Captain of a Lancaster bomber taking part in the air offensive against Germany. His aircraft was shot down over Germany and the entire crew was killed. Sinclair Rapids on the Mistey River in Northern Manitoba were named in memory of Sergeant Lloyd Sinclair.

After the war Flight Lieutenant Sisson married Margaret "Peggie" Wood from Scotland and moved back to Manitoba where they had ten kids, farmed, owned an agricultural dealership, spread square-dancing throughout the province, coached hockey, and with their family started a golf course in Elm Creek.

SKARDAL, Kristjan A.

WWI

Kristjan was born in Iceland on May 16, 1899, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Magnus Skardal. Chris enlisted at Winnipeg on July 10, 1917, receiving his training at St. Charles before going overseas to serve in France with the 16th Battalion. He participated in battle at Amiens, Arras and Cambrai. Upon returning to Canada, Chris commenced farming. In 1923, he married Una Bergson (deceased 1934). They had two sons Albert at Somerset and Norman on the home farm in Baldur.



SLATER, Hubert John

WWII

Hubert was born in Stoughton, Saskatchewan in 1916. He joined the Navy and served on the High Seas aboard HMCS Mahone, Sankaty and Halifax during World War II. When he was discharged from the Navy, he bought a farm. He sold it in 1962 and moved to Shoal Lake and went into road construction. Later, he and his son Ross moved to Yorkton, Saskatchewan. Ross is still there. He was a member of the Yorkton Legion Branch for ten years. Hubert passed away in 1984.







WWII

Francis was born in Brandon, Manitoba in 1921. He joined the Army on January 3, 1942. He served with the 13th Field Regiment RCA 3rd Division during World War II. He landed at Normandy, France on D-Day, June 6, 1944. His barge was hit by shell fire. Francis was wounded on the Somme River, France in the upper right arm by a German 88. He rejoined his unit to fight at the Scheldt Estuary and Nijmegen, Holland. He was awarded the 1939 – 1945 Star, France and Germany Star, Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal with Clasp, War Medal 1939 – 1945 and the Long Service Medal. Francis was a member of the East End Legion Branch 3 in Brandon, Manitoba for 22 years until he passed away in 1982.

TAYLOR, James A. "Jim"

WWII


Jim was born in Brandon, Manitoba in 1925. He enlisted in the Navy and served on the High Seas during World War II. Jim served as a seaman aboard HMCS Rosthern and HMCS Snowberry, both corvettes. These ships were members of the North Atlantic Escort Squadrons that protected heavy laden merchant ships, travelling in convoys of 40 to 70 vessels to England and Europe. There are many records of the heroic actions of these escorts in fighting off German submarines, some successful, some resulting in their own sinking and loss of good men. Jim was a member of the Royal Canadian Navy Volunteer Reserve, serving until the end of the hostilities. Jim passed away in 1999.



THIESSEN, Paul E.

SPECIAL DUTY AREA

Paul was born in Crystal Lake, Manitoba in 1955. He enrolled in the Royal Canadian Navy on July 17, 1973. He did basic training at CFB Cornwallis. In December of 1973, he transferred to CFB Borden to train as a mechanic and then transferred to CFB Halifax in May of 1974 to train as a Boatswain. From July 1974 to January 1975, he was stationed on the HMCS Huron and then on the HMCS Gatineau from January 1975 to December 1978. On March 2, 1977, he helped in the rescue of two sailors from the Royal New Zealand Navy and received a commendation. He was honourably released on December 27, 1978. He has been a member of the Castlegar Legion Branch for one year.



THOMSON, James L.

James was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1932. He enlisted in the Air Force and served in Canada, Egypt and Holland. James was a member of the St. James Legion Branch before he passed away on February 5, 1961.

TITUS, Gerald R.

WWII

Gerald was born in Wellwood, Manitoba in 1913. He worked in Powell River, BC and for newspapers in Minnedosa and Carberry before enlisting. In July of 1940, he enlisted in the Army with the Second Manitoba Dragoons as a trooper. In January of 1941, he was discharged so he could join the Royal Canadian Air Force. After training in Canada for approximately ten months, he sailed for England in November of 1941 as a member of the #405 City of Vancouver Squadron. He made his first flight over enemy territory on May 30, 1942. He was missing in action on July 27, 1942. It was later learned that on that day, his bomber was hit by flack, exploded and crashed into the Elbe River, seven miles west of Hamburg. As he has no known grave, his name is inscribed on the Runnymede War Memorial, Englefield Green, Surrey, England. He was posthumously awarded the Operational Wings of the Royal Canadian Air Force.





TITUS, John S. "Jack"

wwii

John was born in Wellwood, Manitoba in 1918. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force on August 29, 1941 in Brandon, MB. He trained as a wireless air gunner in Canada for many months before leaving for England in March of 1943. He completed 34 sorties against the enemy and was awarded the D.F.C. in November of 1944. On his return to Manitoba, he worked with his father, taking over the Wellwood Post Office and general store when his father retired in 1945. Jack passed away in 1995.

TODD, Thomas Baron "Tom"

WWI

Thomas was born at Lachute, PQ on May 12, 1888, the son of Thomas and Marjorie Todd. Tom enlisted in Brandon on January 14, 1915 and served in Britain and France. He was a member of the 45th Battalion – Canadian Expeditionary Force and served in France with the 52nd. He was discharged in Winnipeg on May 17, 1919. While in England he married Florence Davies. They had two children, Beryl Bjornson (Winnipeg) and Stanley (Baldur). Thomas is deceased.

TOWLER, Edgar

WWII

Edgar was raised on a farm north of the village of Manson, Manitoba. He joined the Army early in the war and served initially with the 101st Battery Royal Canadian Artillery. He transferred to the South Saskatchewan Regiment and proceeded overseas. He served in Canada and in France during World War II. Edgar was severely wounded in 1944 while serving in France. He was a member of the Elkhorn Legion Branch 58.



TRICK, Charles Richard "Dick"

WWII

Dick was born near Stonewall, Manitoba in 1916. He joined the Winnipeg Grenadiers in 1939, deploying to Jamaica to carry out garrison duties in 1940, and returning to Winnipeg in August of 1941. He had just enough time to marry Helen (Sheldon) before deploying to Hong Kong in late October. What followed has been well documented, the battle of Hong Kong, the surrender, and then almost four years of beatings and starvation in Hong Kong and Japan for the survivors. Dick was a POW in Hong Kong until January of 1943 when he and many others were shipped off to Japan to act as slave labour in various camps. He survived, returning home in October of 1945 and taking over the family farm from his father. In 1946, he joined the Legion and began a life-long campaign for veterans' rights. He received the Meritorious Service Medal in 1972 and in 1981, Life Membership. Dick passed away in 1996 and he is buried in Stonewall Cemetery with his comrades.

TWIGG, Sam WWI

Sam was born at Bradfield, Yorkshire, England on October 16, 1888. He came to Canada in 1913 and settled near Elkhorn, Manitoba. He enlisted in the Army on January 25, 1916 and was assigned to the 226th Overseas Battery. He served in England and in France during World War I. He was badly wounded in the arm and was hospitalized for some time. He was awarded the Military Medal for gallantry in action. When discharged from the Army, Sam and his wife, a British war bride, farmed near Elkhorn until retirement in 1941. Sam passed away on August 5, 1956 and is buried in the Elkhorn Cemetery.

VIAU, Armand E.

WWII

Armand was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba on May 7, 1907 to Clara and Damase Viau and husband to Anna Viau. Armand joined the Merchant Navy at the beginning of World War II and assumed the rank of Private with the Royal Canadian Army Medical Corps, unit # 5, General Hospital. He served in Canada and in England. He was awarded the Defence Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and the War Medal. Private Armand died while rescuing people from a burning building in London on January 29, 1942. He is buried with his brother, Sergeant Joseph R. Viau, in Surry, England at Brookwood Military Cemetery.



VIAU, Joseph R.

WWII

Joseph was born on May 19, 1914 in Winnipeg, Manitoba to Clara and Damase Viau. His training started in Brandon, MB on December 20, 1940 in a Tiger Moth. Joseph reached the rank of Sergeant in the Royal Canadian Air Force with over 220 hours of flight time. He served in Canada and in England during World War II. While returning to England, Joseph and three other crew members crashed their Hampden Bomber in Chipping Warden, England on their way back from a bombing mission and passed away on February 14, 1942. He received the War Medal, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp and the Defence Medal. Sergeant Joseph is buried with his Brother, Private Armand Viau, at the Brookwood Military Cemetery in Surry, England.



He was honourably discharged on December 15, 1945 and received the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal and Clasp and the 1939-1945 War Medal. Earl married Lorene A. Nastrom in 1948. He was a Life Member of Roblin Legion Branch 24, at times holding the positions of president, secretary and in the Colour Party. He was a member of the Agricultural Society, and the Roblin 50 & Over Club, the Trans Canada Trail Committee, Senior Citizens Council for Parkland and Historical Society and worked three years on the local History Book Committee. He coached ball for boys and girls in Roblin and worked at the Legion Athletic Camp at the Peace Gardens for many summers. He received various medals and awards. Earl and Lorene farmed in Roblin for over 60 years. They had three children, seven grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. He passed away on August 26, 2008. Earl's name is engraved on a kiosk at the Juno Beach Centre in France.

WAWRYK, Nickolas "Nick"

WWII

Nick was born on December 4, 1912 in Netley, Manitoba. He joined the Army and enlisted with the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders in October of 1939 and served overseas in Africa, Italy and Germany during World War II. While in Italy, he was a gun fitter artificer with the 5th Armored Division before going to Germany. Nick lived and farmed in Netley, Manitoba for many years with his wife and six children. Besides farming, he also worked at the Manitoba Rolling Mills in Selkirk for fifteen years. Nick passed away on April 7, 2004.

WAWRYK, Paul

WWII

Paul was born in Netley, Manitoba on October 25, 1918. He first joined the Royal Canadian Artillery but was assigned to RCEME. He was sent to the Postal Corps in Bournemouth, England then to London for driver training and spent two years delivering mail. Driving through the streets that were not bombed near Eddison station, a buzz bomb suddenly shattered an apartment block. Paul stopped and noticed a young boy on the 7th floor. He was able to help and saved him from further harm. In 1949, Paul graduated in Radio Engineering and rejoined the Army and worked in radio communication during the flood of 1950. They were posted to Churchill; Kingston; Halifax; Baden (4th Wing) in Germany; Edgar, Ontario; Beausejour; Gypsumville, MB. He retired from Commox, BC in 1968 and eventually returned (fifteen years) as a radar tech with ITT on the DEW line. He worked on every DEW line pod from the Alaska side to the Greenland side. Paul passed away on January 8, 2009.



WAWRYK, Steve

WWII

Steve was born in Netley, Manitoba on July 20, 1921. He was posted for the battle of Ortona. There were thirteen regiments on a three mile front. He was assigned to the 19th Battery, 3rd Field Regiment. There was a premature shell burst; the shell burst leaving the muzzle, the muzzle break was blown to pieces. He somehow survived the blast but he still has ringing in his ears to this day. The muzzle break was scattered over the countryside, the liner in the barrel was distorted and the beach block was frozen shut. Towards the end of January 1945, his two brothers, Nick and Paul were on leave in London. They all met in Aldershot. They arrived by train at the Waterloo station and stopped overnight at the Victoria League Canadian Forces Club. By April, they boarded the "Le De France", a French vessel, eight days to New York Harbor and two days by train to Winnipeg.





In 1919, he married Laureta Reaux. His second wife Lillian Black, he married in 1936. Their children are Lois and Russell Jr.

WHETTER, R.J. Clinton "Clint"

WWII

Clint was born in Dand, Manitoba in 1919. After completing a degree in Agriculture at the University of Manitoba, he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1942 and trained in Canada, England and Scotland. Flight Lieutenant Whetter and his crew were posted to the 425 Alouette Squadron, Tholthorpe Yorkshire and then selected to Pathfinder Force, Gransden Lodge England, flying a total of sixty OPS over Western Europe during World War II. Clint was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for his skill, courage and determination. Discharged in May of 1945, he returned home and married Dorothy Keeler and began farming at Dand. Together they raised a family of four and were stalwart members of the community. Clint practiced and promoted soil conservation throughout his farming career for which he was inducted into the Canadian Conservation Hall of Fame and the Manitoba Agriculture Hall of Fame. At 93, Clint continues to be a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Branch 26, Hartney.





WHITE (SKEOCH), Gladys E.

WWII

Gladys was born on January 12, 1926 in Russell, Manitoba. Private Skeoch was a member of the No. 110 Depot Company, Canadian Women's Army Corps during World War II from August 24, 1944 to October 3, 1945 when she returned to civil life on demobilization. 



WHITE, Bernard V.

WWII

Bernard was born on June 30, 1923 in Binscarth, Manitoba. Private White was a member of the Royal Canadian Regiment of Canada Second Division and also served in the Canadian Intelligence Corps. He served in Canada, England, France, Belgium, Germany and Holland including the Battle of Normandy during World War II. He received the GRI VI 1939 – 1945 Star, the GRI VI France and Germany Star, the Defence Medal, the Canadian Volunteer Service Medal (with silver bar) and the War Medal (1939 – 1945). Bernard married Gladys Skeoch on June 14, 1947 and together they raised three children on their farm east of Binscarth. Bernard has been a member of The Royal Canadian Legion Binscarth Branch 074 for many years and currently resides in the Boyne Lodge at Carman, MB.

WHITE, George A.

WWII

George, son of George and Agnes White was born in Binscarth, Manitoba on September 21, 1920. He joined the Royal Canadian Air Force in Winnipeg in September of 1940 and proceeded to Manning Depot in Brandon, MB and thence to No. 2 Wireless School in Calgary for a six week course (he had learned telegraphy prior to enlistment). In mid-November, he was in England posted to 220 Squadron as a ground wireless operator. His desire was to be air crew and he was afforded the necessary training and promoted to the rank of Sergeant Wireless Air Gunner. When the Canadian Government decided to Canadianize the force, he was transferred to the all Canadian 407 Squadron (Demon Squadron) attached to Coastal Command which in part was its mandate to attack enemy shipping at mast height. He passed through the ranks and retired after thirty years of service with the rank of Colonel. Arthur passed away on February 22, 2011 and is buried in the military cemetery in Ottawa.



WICKENS, Edward Donald

wwii

Edward was born in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan in 1921. He enlisted in the Air Force in Regina on April 10, 1942. He trained at No. 7 ITS (graduated November 6, 1942) and at No. 7 AOS (graduated March 19, 1943). He went overseas in England where he served with 434 Bluenose Squadron during World War II. He also served in postwar Royal Canadian Air Force. He was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross which was effective on January 6, 1945 as per the London Gazette dated January 19, 1945 and AFRO 508/45 dated March 23, 1945. The citation on which this award was made reads as follows: "Flying Officer Wickens has completed a tour of operations several of which were against heavily defended targets in Germany. In March, 1944, during an attack on a French target, his aircraft was attacked by night fighters with the result that the flight engineer was wounded, two engines were severely damaged and the petrol tanks holed. This necessitated an emergency landing as soon as this country was reached. This officer displayed courage, determination and high navigational skill under hazardous circumstances. He has proved himself to be a cool and highly efficient navigator throughout. His devotion to duty in the face of enemy opposition and adverse weather is meritorious."



Wes was born in 1885 on the homestead near Binscarth, Manitoba. He grew up on the farm and was educated at the rural schools of Bayfield and Balmerino. He became a linesman for the telegraph company and worked on the Canadian Pacific Railway telegraph line between Edmonton, through Provost, Alberta as well as at Fernie and some other spots in BC. He enlisted on January 18, 1916 and went overseas with the 151st Observation Battalion of the Canadian Expeditionary Force Division as #624575 Sapper C. Wesley Widdicombe of the Signal Corps and landed in Crowsborough, Sussex, England on March 24, 1917. Upon his return from active service in France, he went farming in Czar, Alberta. In 1926, he went to live with a sister in Wainwright, AB. He passed away in 1967, a confirmed bachelor, and is buried in the Veteran's Section of the Wainwright Cemetery.

WILLIAMS, James A.

WWII

James was born in Deloraine, Manitoba in 1912. He enlisted in the Army on June 21, 1941. He served in Canada, the United Kingdom, Central Mediterranean area and Continental Europe during World War II. He was discharged on September 27, 1945, returning to the Deloraine area to farm. He was a member of the Legion Branch 83 for 34 years. James passed away in 1975.





WILLIAMS, Leonard R.

Leonard was born at Foxwarren, Manitoba on October 7, 1922. Following his graduation from Foxwarren Collegiate, he enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force. He trained at Dauphin, MB and went overseas in 1941 as a Flying Officer attached to Squadron #272. He was posted to Shaluffa, Station, Egypt and North Africa during World War II. While training a student on November 22, 1944, his Beaufighter went down in the Mediterranean Sea, ten miles off Suez, Egypt. The student was rescued but Leonard's body was never found. He had just turned 22.

For a time, following school, he drove a gravel truck for Widdicombe & Low Bros. Construction when they were building the Trans-Canada Highway in Northern Ontario. 

He became postmaster in Binscarth, Manitoba in 1920 staying on the job until 1949 when he retired to his garden. He was a member of the Binscarth Legion Branch 74. Joe passed away in 1970.

WORTHINGTON, Frederick W.

WWII

Frederick was born in Toronto, Ontario in 1908. He enlisted in the Army and served with the Queen's Own Rifles of Canada in England and in France during World War II. Frederick was killed in action in Normandy in 1944.

He was divorced from Nora and remarried Travonna Twiss and they moved to Portage la Prairie in 1996 and lived there until their deaths. They are both buried in Boyne Creek Cemetery at Treherne, Manitoba. He was a member of the St James Legion Branch.

Tony was born to Mr. and Mrs. Peter Bambenek. He enlisted in Winnipeg and trained at Rivers, Calgary, Mossbank and Sheppard. He also served overseas in England. He lived in Winnipeg.

CLINE, Earle H. WWI

Earle was born at Baldur, Manitoba, the son of Alex and Lettie Cline. He enlisted in Winnipeg in 1915 and while training there, he contacted measles and died as a result thereof in March of 1916.

Jesse grew up at Stockton, Manitoba and entered the ministry and preached at Glenora and Killarney prior to enlisting. He was killed in action.

McLAREN, Clarence WWI

Clarence was born on August 4, 1897 in the Wigton district, Manitoba. He joined the First Battalion on January 9, 1918 at Brandon, MB, going overseas in March. He went to France where he joined the 27th Battalion in July until the end of the war, and then served in Germany until March 1919. Clarence is deceased.

McMANUS, John Earl WWI

John was born at Stayner, Ontario, the son of Thomas and Elizabeth McManus. He enlisted at Brandon and trained there and at Winnipeg. He served overseas at Aldershot and Seaforth, England. He is deceased.

PIERSON, Francis S. WWI

Francis, late of Glenora, was born near Virden, Manitoba, the son of Jacob and Lydia Pierson. He saw service in Canada at Camp Hughes and Winnipeg. Overseas, he was stationed at Brighton and was later killed in action on October 15, 1914.

ROWLEY, Wesley Bruce "Wes" WWII

Wesley was born at Portage, the son of William John and Bertha Rowley. On October 27, 1940, he married Leona Kriewaldt and lived in Calgary. They had four children. Wes enlisted in Winnipeg.

SHAW, William "Billy" WWI

William was a lad brought out to this district from England. He was a labourer in the district immediately southwest of Baldur. Billy enlisted while very young and served as a bugler.

SIGTRYGGSON, Konrad WWI

Konrad was born in Iceland on August 17, 1888, the son of Sigtryggur and Kristin. He enlisted in October of 1915 with the 78th Battalion, going overseas on May 20, 1916. He was wounded twice in battle before being killed in action at Vimy Ridge on March 31, 1917.

STEVENS, Alfred H. "Alf" WWI

Alfred was born at Baldur, Manitoba on March 28, 1885, the son of Frederick and Elizabeth Stevens. On April 7, 1915, he married Hannah Cuthbert. Alf died in October of 1958.

SUITOR, William BOER WAR

William lived in the Glenora district. He enlisted for service in the Boer War and was killed in action.

THOMASSON, Thomas WWII

Thomas was born the son of Thorbjorn and Augusta Thomasson. He enlisted in Winnipeg in December of 1939 and trained at Fort Osborne in Winnipeg. He was stationed in Jamaica and then in Hong Kong where he died on October 14, 1942.

Wilfred was born in 1897 in Kamloops, British Columbia, the son of Mr. and Mrs. George Welsh. He enlisted at Plunkett, Saskatchewan and received his training in Winnipeg. He died in service in 1916.

Orville was born at Mount Forest, Ontario. He came to the R. M. of Argyle and joined the service at Baldur, Manitoba in 1916. He was sent overseas and was killed in action in 1918.

WOOD, Robert R. WWII

Robert was born in Utica, Minnesota on September 21, 1926. He enlisted in the Army and served from October 27, 1944 to April 9, 1946 in Canada and was discharged by reason of demobilization. He was a member of the Legion Branch 29 before he passed away on April 2, 1993.

WOODS, Samuel WWI

Samuel was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Woods. They lived in the Glenora district during World War I. He was killed in action.


WRIGHT, Horace F. WWII
